There were a few questions during today's webinar that we wanted to make sure got fully answered:

- Ideal size for a Portfolio site logo is about 300px wide
- You can easily modify anything written by MagicFill Al
- Blog images can be uploaded directly into the blog, but the preferred method is to upload them into Organizer and then link directly to them
- If you make a SlickPic site and want to use a custom domain name you already have, you can keep it with your current domain registrar and point it to your SlickPic site, or you can transfer the domain to us
- We support ecommerce stores for digital downloads and self-fulfilled print orders
- If you start with a SlickPic-designed Bespoke Portfolio to get started, you can absolutely maintain it yourself if you like
- The SlickPic Pro plan includes everything you saw in the training sessions and much more
- Collections work like Lightroom. You can grab images from multiple Albums and use them in a Collection. A great example is using a Collection for your Home page (in which you might want to show a wide range of photos from different Albums)
- If you have a paid SlickPic account now and want to downgrade to our Free plan when it
 expires, you can easily do that. Just keep in mind that you might lose features that you
 enjoy now

As mentioned at the end of the training, we have just released our new FREE plan, perfect for Camera Club members who want to showcase their photography in a very professional way! Here's how to get it:

- Go to our website at <u>www.slickpic.com</u> and click the blue button at the top right of the site that says "Start for Free".
- Set up your SlickPic account and you'll be off to the races! We have nice tutorials and emails that come every day to you for a week or so to help you get started.
- Our new Free plan gives you full access to every feature SlickPic provides however you
 are limited to 100 images total and, if you build a website, you are limited to 100 visitors
 per month. For a lot of people, that will be enough to try out SlickPic, make a gallery and
 website, and share your images with friends, family and others have fun!
- Note, if you created a "Guest Upload" account on SlickPic for the Fotoclave competition last year, you will not have the ability to build a website (with that account). Please email "theteam@slickpic.com" for instructions and we'll get you set up!
