


Wood Options for Your Staircase or Railing

Walnut (Premium Investment)

- Deep chocolate brown, elegant grain
 - Strong and stable, ages beautifully





White Oak (Premium Investment)

- Light to medium beige, subtle grain
- Extremely strong & stable (ideal for treads/railings)
- Best for timeless, modern, or Scandinavian designs




Red Oak (Mid-Range)

- Warm reddish tones, pronounced grain
- Strong, reliable, classic hardwood
- Best for traditional or dark dramatic finishes




Maple (Mid-Range)

- Light, creamy, smooth grain
- Dense and hard, clean finish
- Best for sleek, modern stairs with natural tones



Poplar (Budget-Friendly)

- Pale with green/gray undertones
- Softer, best for non-traffic elements
- Perfect for painted staircases, posts, and trim

Your choice of balusters and posts can shape the overall feel of your staircase — from clean and modern to classic and detailed. Simpler, straight styles create a sleek, understated look, while more decorative or custom-turned designs add character and elegance.

How to Prepare

Here are a few questions to consider before the appointment:

- Budget: Do you have a general range you'd like to stay within?
- Wood Preference: Are you leaning toward premium hardwoods (like white oak or maple) for durability and high-end finish, or do you prefer a more cost-effective option?
- Design Style: Do you prefer a modern, clean look (glass or cable), or a classic/traditional style (iron, wood spindles)?
- Finish: Would you like a light, natural finish, darker stain, or painted option?
- Timeline: Do you have a preferred timeframe for project completion (e.g., tied to a remodel or move-in date)?
- Durability vs. Cost: Is long-term durability most important, or are you primarily focused on initial cost savings?
- Functionality: Will this staircase/railing be a focal point of your home (a statement piece) or more of a functional element?

Helpful Tips

- Send us any inspiration photos ahead of time (Pinterest, Google, etc.).
- Think about what you'd like the staircase or railing to say in your home bold statement vs. subtle complement.
