Events (Moms’ Nights Out + Field Trips + Celebrations)

Bring our community together by inviting, planning, and hosting one Moms’ Nights Out in the first semester and one parents’ night out in the second semester for connection and refreshment. Coordinate the three pre-chosen field trips (or propose new ideas) and consider planning additional pop-up field trips to keep our families exploring together throughout the year. You will handle location, time, coordinating a Canva invite with the Canva team, collecting money, and food sign up as needed. Canva Design & Yearbook

If you love design and creativity, this is your spot! Throughout the year, you will create reminders, invitations, and updates via Canva, as well as gather and organize photos using Google Photos for a simple, beautiful Bethel Family Co-op Yearbook that families can treasure. At-Home Projects & Presentations

Help lead two meaningful, student-led presentation opportunities each year:

- Semester 1: “Taste of…” each 3rd–8th grader reports on an assigned country by creating a tri-fold presentation board, and bringing a small taste to share.
- Semester 2: “My Testimony,” where students 1st- 8th share how God has worked in their lives through drawings, questions, or a written testimony.

Book Club

Foster a love for reading by leading one book club per year (second semester) for 3rd–5th and 6th–8th graders. You will help choose engaging books, create simple project guidelines, and schedule discussions (all students will meet at the Wenzels). Workshops & Service Projects

You will help organize one workshop and one service project for the year:

- Workshop: Bring in an outside teacher to teach directly before or after co-op (art, writing, bread making, sewing, etc.). This can be for 4th–8th graders or a mixed-age group.
- Service Project: Done off-site on a separate day (serving at a local ministry, park cleanup, blessing another family, etc.).

You will find teachers or project opportunities, choose dates, create Canva invites/reminders via the canva team, and handle any payments, if needed. This role helps us grow in learning and service as a community.

Lead Teachers

Explore classes are designed to help students grow in knowledge and wonder about God's world. Technology and Set up

Ensure each teacher is able to connect their computer to the classroom TV. Help set up computers in each classroom each meeting date. Also, set up the Student Center Commons each co-op meeting with 3 round tables and 4 chairs per table.
