#### **BEFORE PRUNING THOSE OAK TREES..**

In order to prevent the devastating effects of Oak Wilt, oak trees, <u>SHOULD NOT be pruned</u> or cut down between FEBRUARY 1 - JUNE 30.

During approved pruning dates, please be sure to hire a licensed tree pruner and make sure they spray the wounds *immediately* using latex or commercial tree wound paint.

# **YARD ETIQUETTE** (from Southern Living Newsletter)

There is a responsibility that comes with living in a neighborhood that requires respect and concern for your neighbor and his/her property. It goes beyond the rules and regulations set forth by homeowner's associations and comes down to simple manners and neighborly etiquette.

**Respect Property Lines:** Prune your vines, shrubs and trees so that they don't encroach on your neighbor's space. Also, be proactive and remove any damaged or diseased tree branches.

**Clean Up After Your Mower:** Please do not allow the grass clippings to blow onto your neighbor's driveway or into the street. The same courtesy applies to using a leaf blower – blow away from your neighbor's property and dispose of the litter.

**Don't Be a Noisy Early Bird:** Be considerate when powering up your mowers and power tools on the weekends; wait until at least 9 a.m.

**Spray Weeds, Not Your Neighbors:** Instead of spraying pesticides and harmful chemicals, more and more homeowners are opting to keep a natural yard by choosing to provide food sources and living environments for birds, butterflies, bees and other valuable insects. If you must use weed killers, do it on a day when there is no wind and be mindful that the toxic substances sprayed on plants or put in the ground can travel into play yards and water sources, harming people, beneficial insects and pets.

**Control your Pets** If you want to continue to have a harmonious environment between you and your neighbors, please control their barking and walk them on a leash.

#### ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMMITTEE

Now that spring has sprung, it's time to let those lawns shine. Here are some tips for helping your yard look its best here is South Texas. Test your sprinkler system. Water according to the drought restriction schedule (currently Stage 2 as of 4/16/22) below:

> Watering day determined by last digit of address:



Watering with an irrigation system or sprinkler is allowed only once a week from 7-11 a.m. and 7-11 p.m. Keep your lawnmower blade sharp. Set the lawnmower blade to the correct height for your type of grass. Most of us have St. Augustine. The recommended height is 2" to 3". Cut it often enough so that when mowing, you are not removing more than 1/3 - 1/2 of the blades.

With warmer weather arriving home improvement projects tend to kick off. The A.C.C. is here to make sure we are all doing our part to keep our neighborhood looking as good as it possibly can. With that in mind, a newly created A.C.C. Form, that can be edited electronically, will be on the Blanco Woods website soon.

## REAL ESTATE UPDATE



The real estate market in San Antonio is still going strong and Blanco Woods continues to be a popular subdivision. Thus far in 2022 there have been 3 sales here, all at or above the listing price. Sale prices ranged from \$421,000 to \$499,000; 2 were cash sales. Currently, there is only one home here on the market.

Along with home prices, mortgage rates are rising. If you, a family member or a friend are thinking about buying a home, it's imperative that you first talk with a trusted lender.

Many residents have recently received notices from the Bexar County Appraisal District concerning 2022 appraised value on their home and estimated property taxes. To say values have increased is an understatement! If you think you would like to protest your valuation, you can do so online through the Bexar County Appraisal District website, www.bcad.org. Below are some links that may help you. Begin by going to www.bexar.org and click on the Taxpayer Resources tab. Please remember that you are protesting your home's valuation, which is what your property taxes are based on, not the taxes themselves. Also, you may want to check that you have all the exemptions that you qualify for. If you are the property owner, you should have the Homestead exemption. Being 65 and over qualifies you for an exemption. There are others as well, so check the BCAD website for other exemptions.

San Antonio homeowners are seeing shocking increases in their property appraisals. Now is the time for the City to increase the homestead exemption to the maximum allowed by state law (20%). This relief is meant to target working families who are just now recovering from the economic trauma of the pandemic. As Council begins

to discuss budget goal setting for next year, tax relief will be Courage's number one priority. His office has been laying the groundwork on property tax relief since 2019, and he is hopeful that his Council colleagues will agree that now is the time to act with significance. In partnership with the County and other taxing entities, we can begin to stack these exemptions and create significant relief to help fight the increased cost of living for San Antonio homeowners. If Texas voters approve the proposed constitutional amendments to increase the general homestead exemption for school taxes from 25k to 40k, your exemption amount will automatically increase and school districts will compute your taxes using the greater exemption amount.
