SCHOOL DAYS ARE HERE AGAIN!



The children in Blanco Woods recently returned to school. Please use caution, reduce speed and watch out for children crossing streets to meet or are dropped off from school buses. The posted speed limit in Blanco Woods is 30 m.p.h., but it is recommend to go 20 - 25, especially times when children are rushing to catch buses and during loading or unloading from buses.

Texas law mandates drivers must stop when a school bus extends its stop sign or turns on its flashing red lights. When a school bus is stopped, drivers traveling on either side of the road must come to a complete stop.

REAL ESTATE UPDATE

You may have read or seen reports on the news that the real estate market is "cooling." It's true that sales have slowed a bit and prices have stabilized to a certain degree. We're not seeing the run-up in prices that were happening earlier this year. However, in San Antonio we're still in a buyer's market as demand exceeds available supply of homes, although not by as much as it has been. So far this year,

in Blanco Woods we've had 7 homes that have sold and 2 that are currently, as of this writing, under contract. The homes that have sold spent an average of only 19 days on the market. And the sale price of those homes have ranged from \$358,900 to \$465,000 with an average price of \$419,970 or an average of \$213 per sq. ft. Quite a few homes for sales are on Opendoor, including a couple here in Blanco Woods. If you're considering selling your home with Opendoor or some other company that promises no showings/no repairs/quick closing, etc., I strongly encourage you to read "the fine print" about the fees they charge sellers and to also consult with a real estate professional to get an opinion of value and where to price your home to sell. You may be surprised at the differences. The busiest season is slowing now that school has started and the holidays are coming. However, San Antonio market is still active and if you're ready to sell, you are in a great place to do so. Location, location, location is a big deal, and we have a great one here in Blanco Woods.



In early August, the District 9's Senior Center, Walker Ranch opened. It is a beautiful facility offering many classes including those in fitness, computers, photograph and art. Additionally, the

BEFORE PRUNING OR CUTTING DOWN OAK TREES...



In order to prevent the damaging effects of Oak Wilt, not only to your trees, but the devastating effects of it spreading to other trees in the area, all oak trees <u>SHOULD NOT be pruned or cut down between July 1 through</u> <u>January 31</u>. During approved pruning dates (February 1 - June 30), please be sure to hire a licensed tree pruner and make sure they spray the wounds immediately using latex or commercial tree wound paint.
