In project-based learning (PBL), teachers act as facilitators, guiding students through real-world problems and encouraging collaboration, critical thinking, and problem-solving, shifting away from traditional direct instruction. The teachers at Main Street School demonstrate a love of learning and a willingness to engage with new ideas and challenges, modeling the kind of lifelong learner they want their students to become.

Key Responsibilities

- Create and deliver a hands-on, emergent, project-based program that aligns with the school's mission and the developmental needs of early elementary students.
- Collaborate with Upper Elementary Teacher to implement lesson plans.
- Establish a nurturing, organized, and joyful learning environment where children feel safe and valued.
- Differentiate and facilitate instruction to meet each child's needs, abilities, and interests.
- Support children to reach educational milestones.
- Foster a sense of community, empathy, and respect within the classroom through positive guidance and modeling.
- Work closely with assistant teachers, other staff members, and families to support student success and maintain a cohesive elementary program.
