



Not Its Replacement

Why the industry must stop fearing disruption and start shaping the future of storytelling. Sound, color, CGI — and now AI. Every leap once feared has become the foundation of cinema's next golden age.

When *Tilly Norwood*, Hollywood's first AI-generated actress, appeared on screen, the backlash was immediate. Critics called her "soulless." Unions issued warnings. Celebrities declared the idea "gross" and "dangerous." The arrival of an artificial performer was cast not as a bold experiment, but as an existential threat to human artistry.

This is not the first time Hollywood has panicked. In the 1930s, sound was accused of "ruining" cinema. In the 1960s, color was viewed as a gimmick. In the 1990s, CGI was dismissed as cold and lifeless. Every one of these technologies is now not only accepted but celebrated as essential to storytelling.



The Historical Pattern of Fear and Adoption

Just as sound, color, and CGI once redefined cinema, AI represents the next great evolution in storytelling technology. The parallels are striking.

When "talkies" arrived in the late 1920s, critics feared they would destroy the art of film. Silent film stars worried their voices wouldn't measure up. Some predicted audiences would reject dialogue as unnatural or distracting. Yet sound gave rise to entirely new genres — musicals, screwball comedies, film noir — and elevated cinema into the dominant art form of the 20th century.

In the 1930s and 40s, the introduction of Technicolor was seen by purists as a garish gimmick. Black-and-white was considered “true cinema,” and some directors resisted the shift. Today, films like *The Wizard of Oz* or *Gone With the Wind* are celebrated as milestones precisely because they embraced color. What was once feared became the visual standard.



Decades later, CGI faced the same skepticism. Early digital effects were dismissed as lifeless, cheap, and incapable of replacing practical effects. Critics warned they would kill the craft of filmmaking. Yet from *Jurassic Park* to *Avatar*, CGI has not replaced artistry — it has expanded it, allowing directors to show audiences worlds that could never exist otherwise.

Each of these technological leaps was resisted at first.

Each was eventually absorbed, refined, and then celebrated. AI will follow the same trajectory. What feels uncanny or controversial today will, in a decade, feel as natural as watching an actor in color or hearing them speak on screen.
