Questions for Personal Reflection and Group Discussion

1. Read Romans 12:1-2 and Isaiah 55:8-9.

What instructions do you find for believers in Romans 12:1-2?

What have the spiritual, psychological, and relational costs been in your life?

What beliefs do you need to better align with the truth of God's Word?

3. Read Philippians 4:8.

What kinds of things does your mind tend to focus on naturally?

How might you begin to "fix your thoughts" on the things that Paul identifies in this verse?

What do you think would happen if your thoughts were focused on what is true, honorable, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, and worthy of praise?

5. Read Hebrews 4:12 and Isaiah 40:9.

What do these verses tell you about the word of God (the truth)?

Why should we trust God's word more than our own understanding?

What step do you need to take to begin replacing lies you've believed with God's truth?
