1. Read 2 Peter 1:5-11.

2. Read James 2:14.

6. Read 1 Corinthians 9:24-27.

How does Paul say we are to run the race as followers of Jesus?

What kind of race are you running? Is there a hitch in your stride? Are you sitting on the sidelines? Struggling to clear a hurdle? What adjustments do you need to make in order to run to win?
