Questions for Personal Reflection and Group Discussion

1. Read Hebrews 13:1-3.

How willing are you to get out of your comfort zone in order to follow Jesus?

What do you think it means to love each other as brothers and sisters?

How is the hospitality mentioned in verse 2 different from what you think of as hospitality? How might you be able to practice what the writer of Hebrews is describing?

Can you think of any way that someone might feel “imprisoned” for being a follower of Jesus in our culture? How might you help them?

In what countries of the world is it risky to be a follower of Jesus? (It’s ok to use Google for help!) How might you actively love your brothers and sisters in those places?

2. Read Hebrews 13:4-6 and Matthew 5:27-28.

What does it mean to honor marriage? How do you intentionally honor marriage (your own or others’)?

Is being faithful about more than just not cheating on your spouse? If so, what does that look like? Where do you need to grow in faithfulness as a follower of Jesus?

What does it mean to be content? Is contentment something that characterizes your life? In what area do you struggle to be content?

3. Read Hebrews 13:7, 17-18.

Leaders aren’t perfect and it can be easier to criticize than encourage. What do these verses tell you to remember about the leaders God has put in your life? How are we to respond to our leaders?

4. Read Hebrews 13:8-16.

What phrases in this passage stand out to you? What promises do you find? How do these words encourage and motivate you?

5. Read Hebrews 13:20-22.

This benediction makes mention of several blessings that are yours as a follower of Jesus. Make a list of the ones you see, then spend time praying through this chapter, on your own or with a friend or discussion group.
