Questions for Personal Reflection and Group Discussion

1. Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17.

What words does the Apostle Paul use to describe Scripture in verse 16? How much of Scripture does his description apply to?

What does Scripture do in the lives of those who read and apply it?

What does your rhythm of being in the Word of God look like? How much time do you spend allowing God to use Scripture to help you become more like Jesus and to equip you for whatever good work He has for you to do?

2. Read 2 Corinthians 10:3-5.

Where do human reasoning, false arguments, and proud obstacles come from? Who keeps people from knowing God?

In what kinds of circumstances are you most likely to forget who the real enemy is? How do you react when someone offends you with their beliefs or behavior?

How can you war against the unseen powers and principalities that keep people in darkness?

3. Read Genesis 1:26-27.

What does it mean to be made in the image of God? In what ways are humans like Him?

Are there any humans who are not made in His image? If not, what implications does that have for how we should treat people?

4. Read Isaiah 43:7, Ephesians 1:11-14, 1 Corinthians 10:31, and Genesis 9:5-6.

For what purpose did God make humans in His image?

What parts of our lives are to serve that purpose?

Is there any part of your life that isn't in alignment with the purpose for which God created you?

What step will you take to change that?
