

After the Storm - Where to Start

The Corridor and surrounding areas are no stranger to what Mother Nature can do. We have been hit with rising flood waters, Derecho strong winds and damaging hail. The aftermath leaves many homeowners walking their property pondering where to start.

Here a few tips to assessing the damage after a storm.

- 1. Storm damage, however minor, can cause expensive, long-term issues when repairs are not taken care of timely. So the sooner you assess the damage the better. Even if you think your home got away with little to no damage, it's important to walk around your propoerty with your checklist of what to look for to make sure.
- **2.** As you walk your property start with checking the roof. Look for any debris such as tree branches. Safely, clear any debri to inspect the shingles and look for any cracked or missing shingles. Damaged or missing shingles can cause water to leak and lead to future damage in your ceiling and walls.
- **3.** While you're up there, check your chimney, flashing and gutters. Flashing around your chimney that has become dented or loose can lead to water damage as rain water runs under the flashing and into your roof beams. Gutters often become loose or blocked with debris during a storm that can lead to pooling water, so it's important to clear your gutters.
- **4.** As you work your way down and around your home, check your windows and frames surrounding them. Your window may appear not to be broken, but small cracks can be hard to see until they have been let go to expand. Take a close look. Damaged frames can also lead to water leaking in and down the walls around your windows.
- **5.** Safely check sofit, fascias and siding for any dents or cracks. Often there can be more damage underneath of these cracks. Underlying water damage can result. Once water gets into the walls it has no way to dry and can result in mold in your home. Mold will lead to a plethera of issues in your home that will lead to extensive repair.

- **6.** After you have taken a good look at the outside of your home it is time to look inside. Start with taking a look at the ceiling and walls for water stains or dampness. Look for any chipped paint or plaster. This is an indication of water leaking into your home. Make sure to check over the next several days after the storm, as some water stains do not appear right away.
- 7. You have checked your home inside and out. Now it's time to look at any out buildings you may have, fencing and trees. Check over your out buildings the same as you did your home. Checking the roof, windows, siding, and interior walls. Check fencing for any missing or damged pannels and posts. Make sure trees are stable. Hanging branches can be a hazzard to you and your property.
- **8.** When in doubt, call a professional. Your safety is top priority! If you come across any down electrical lines, call your utility company immediately. If you have large tree branches that need taken down, call a professional tree service. If your roof may be unstable, call a professional roofer. The corridor has many professionals ready to assist you in taking a look at your home and getting it back into tip-top shape.

Summer Pet Safety Tips

Flea and tick season is here. Choose a quality preventative from the start of spring such as oral tablets available from your veterinarian. Over-the-counter treatments rarely work, and waiting can make it much harder to get rid of them.

Heartworm in common in summertime. Make sure to have your pet tested at the beginning of summer and treat as needed.

Allergies affect pets just as much as humans. Signs include persistent scratching, chewing on paws or legs, and ear infections. Visit your veterinarian for treatment if you notice these signs. Toxic ingestion. Make sure to put

up and away toxins such as antifreeze and rat poison that will be deadly if ingested.

Prevent heat stroke. Avoid long walks on hot days and do not leave pets outside for long periods of time. Provide adequate shelter/shade and water when pets are outside. Look for these signs of a heat stroke. Excessive panting, wobbly walking, bright red tongue.

What to Do if Your Pet Overheats: Do: •Get them out of the elements (somewhere cool) •Try to give them some water •Spray paw pads with rubbing alcohol (safely brings body temp down) Don't: •Cool pet's temperature too quickly (with shower or hose) •Force them to drink water

If You Don't Use It, You Lose It



It is important for aging adults to stay active while still living at home to maintain health and wellness. Once they move into a senior living community it is even more crucial not to allow ones-self to decline or lose the agility one once had. Strength training and aerobic exercise can prove to be beneficial for seniors by decreasing fall risks, combating depression, decreasing the chance for agerelated muscle loss, and warding off cognitive decline. Taking part in group exercise classes also is a great tool to increase socialization and build relationships among peers. There are some very basic exercises that aging adults can use whether they are experienced in exercise or not.

- Squats- put a chair in front of you for balance.
- Push-ups- put your hands against a wall and bend at your elbows slowly.
- Toe-ups- push up on your toes while holding onto the back of a chair.
- Toe taps- alternate toes back and forth by taping your toe in front of you while holding onto a chair in front of you. Also, tap toes out to the side of your body and back in. Alternate right and left.
- Knee lifts- hold onto chair in front of you and alternate lifting knees up.
- Leg kicks- sit in a chair and alternate kicking legs up

Allow 10-15 reps of each exercise at least 4 times per week to produce the best results. These are just some basic examples of exercises you can do within your home or wherever you are. 

Chicken on a Stick

Ingredients:

2 tablespoons peanut oil (canola oil works too)

2 tablespoons lemon juice

2 tablespoons soy sauce

4 garlic cloves, minced

2 feaspoons honey

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1 tablespoon sesame seeds

1 pound skinless chicken breasts, cut into thin strips

Directions:

In bowl, combine all ingredients but the chicken and mix well. Reserve half of the marinade and set aside. Add chicken to bowl and coat. Cover and refrigerate for 2-3 hours. Preheat grill to medium hot. Thread chicken onto metal or soaked wooden skewers. Grill over while basting with remaining marinade over medium hot grill for 4 minutes on each side or until cooked through.

Deep Fried Cheese Curds

Ingredients:

1/4 cup all-purpose flour for coating

1 cups all-purpose flour for batter

1 pound of your favorite cheese curds (or cubed cheddar cheese)

1 cup beer

Favorite ranch dressing

Oil for frying

Directions:

In a skillet or deep fryer, heat oil to 375°

Add 1/4 cup flour in a large resealable plastic bag. Add cheese curds and shake to coat. In a large bowl, whisk beer and remaining flour. Dip cheese curds, a few at a time, into batter and fry for 2-3 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Drain on paper towels. Serve with ranch dressing.

Grilled Italian Brat Subs

Ingredients:

8 Brats

3 cans (12 ounces each) beer or nonalcoholic beer

2 large onion, halved and sliced

1 large red bell pepper seeded and sliced

1 large yellow bell pepper seeded and sliced

2 garlic cloves

2 tablespoons fennel seed

1 tsp red pepper flakes

3 tablespoons olive oil

8 split hoagie rolls

Directions:

Place brats in a large dutch oven and add me beer and 1 onion. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer for about 8 minutes. Drain and discard beer mixture. In sauce pan, heat olive oil and add the other onion, peppers, garlic, fennel seed, and red pepper flakes. Saute until soft and set aside. Grill brats on grill for about 8 minutes turning occasionally until browned on all sides. Serve brats in rolls and top with pepper and onion mixture.



Strawberry Lemonade

Ingredients:

4 cups water, divided

1 cup sugar

1 cup lemon juice

1 tablespoon grated lemon zest

1 cup strawberries

Directions:

In a large saucepan, bring 2 cups water and sugar to a boil. Boil for 2 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from the heat. Stir in the lemon juice, zest and remaining water and then cool. In a blender, combine 1 cup of lemon mixture and the strawberries and blend well. Pour strawberry mixture and remaining lemon mixture into a pitcher; stir well. Refrigerate until chilled. Enjoy

Fried Candy Bars

Ingredients:

Frozen Mini candy bars (we like snickers or milky way)

1 egg

1 cup milk

Pinch salt

1 1/2 cups self-rising flour

4 cups oil or shortening for frying

Directions:

Whisk together egg and milk in a large bowl. Add flour and salt and whisk until combined. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes. Heat about 4 cups of oil or shortening in a large pot to 365 degrees. Dunk the frozen candy bars into the chilled batter, and then gently drop them in small batches into the oil, being careful to drop in away from you so not to splatter. Cook until light golden brown. Remove and place them on a paper towel lined plate and let set for one minute to drain excess oil and cool slightly.


