



# BBB Tip: Facts about identity theff Communication, work, school, shopping and even

doctor's visits have undergone massive digital transformations in the past few years. Identity thieves are evolving right alongside us to better exploit victims in an increasingly digital world causing a sharp rise in fraud incidents and the amount of money lost.

- 1. Fraud and identity theft is rising significantly. Life changed as pandemic confusion collided with rapid transitions to remote work and learning. Many consumers lost jobs and loved ones. A sharp rise in imposter and online purchase scams, fraud and identity theft resulted.
- 2. Reports of thieves hijacking accounts have increased 72% since 2019. As more services shift online, consumers' private information shifted. One consequence is a rise in businesses data breaches and consumer account theft. Account takeovers are growing and have a high risk of financial loss.
- 4. Everyone is a target for identity theft. Consumers between the ages of 30 to 39 make up the largest share of identity theft victims. Children aren't safe from id theft and it often takes longer to recognize what has occurred when victims are young. It's never too early to monitor a credit report.
- 5. Social media users are 30% more likely to fall victim to identity theft. Thieves learn valuable information about potential victims from social media. Taking a Facebook quiz can increase exposure by collecting information that helps thieves who frequently make contact with victims through social media.

Avoiding identity theft takes diligence and an abundance of caution. Look for unfamiliar activity on your accounts and statements. Check your credit reports for unauthorized inquires or accounts. Do not share personally identifying information. Secure and shred personal documents as necessary. Watch for online phishing attempts or tech support solicitations. Never click on unknown links. Use strong passwords and

> be careful about sharing any information. When making online purchases use a credit card.

With enough personal information, a scammer can pretend to be you and commit a wide range of crimes. You may not notice what is happening until the scammer has already inflicted substantial damage on your assets, credit, and Start With Trust reputation.

Art Therapy also:



# Start the Kids Day off Right with These Quick & Easy Breakfast Recipes



### Overnight Oatmeal

Have a hard time getting out the door in the morning? Save some time by making breakfast the night before.

INGREDIENTS: 1/2 cup old fashioned oats 1/2 cup milk

DIRECTIONS: Using a 16-ounce mason jar, add oats and milk; layer with desired toppings. Refrigerate overnight; serve cold.

Topping ideas: Sliced strawberries, peanut butter & jelly, honey and sliced almonds, diced pineapple and coconut, greek yogurt, diced apples, and cinnamon

Quick and easy meals are what come to mind for most parents when thinking of ideas for breakfast and lunch during the school year. Breakfast is a very important meal of the day, especially for children. Lunch at school may be another challenge if your child prefers to take their lunch. What will keep the best is usually the main concern. This month we have put together a few recipes to make breakfast, lunch, and snacks a breeze. Happy Back to School!

### **Mini Omelets**

Macaroni Kid Eats Publication

Bake these mini omelets when you have some free time and then either store them in the refrigerator for a few days or in the freezer if you would like to make a bunch in advance. Just wrap them up individually and reheat in the oven or microwave as needed. Turn the mini omelets into quick egg sandwich! Change it up and experiment with your favorite ingredients.

### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 cup chopped ham
1 cup chopped broccoli florets
10 large eggs, beaten
½ cup milk
½ cup shredded cheese
As needed, cooking spray
To taste, salt & pepper

### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 F.
- 2. Whisk together eggs and milk. Season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Spray a 12-cupcake/muffin pan with the cooking spray.
- 4. Ladle a small number of eggs into each tin.
- 5. Divide the ham, broccoli, and cheese evenly.
- 6. Ladle more egg mixture over the ham, broccoli, and cheese, the tins should be 2/3 full.
- 6. Bake for 15-20 minutes.
- 7. While still warm and using a butter knife, cut around each egg muffin and scoop out with a large spoon.
- 8. Serve hot

Omelets will keep for a few days in the refrigerator. Unused omelets can be individually wrapped, frozen and reheated for another breakfast.

INGREDIENTS:
2 Bananas
Peanut butter
Honey
Rice Cereal or your favorite

### **DIRECTIONS:**

Spread peanut butter on a banana, drizzle with honey and roll in cereal. Slice and serve!


### **Lunch Box Kabobs**

10. Kabobs





Packing lunches for school means you know which nutritious foods your kids are eating. Here are some budget-friendly, creative ideas to keep kids happy and healthy at lunchtime:

### Make a Smarter Sandwich

While some kids prefer the same thing every day, others might be OK with a slight switch to their sandwich.

- Use different breads, like 100% whole-wheat tortilla wraps (choose wraps low in saturated fat and made with no hydrogenated oils) or 100% whole-wheat pita pockets.
- In addition to lettuce and tomato, try shredded carrot or zucchini and sliced apple or pear with a turkey sandwich.
- Try avocado or hummus as a swap for cheese or mayo.
- Try a leftover grilled chicken in your sandwich as a switch for lunch meat.

Love those Leftovers

Think about using the leftovers from a family favorite dinner for a next day lunch. Use a thermos to keep foods hot or cold until the lunch bell rings. Some ideas:

- Soup tomato, vegetable or bean
- Chili (vegetarian or made with lean or extra lean around chicken)
- Spaghetti (whole wheat with tomato, pesto or marinara sauce)
- Bean casserole or beans and rice

These foods sometimes have a lot of sodium, so make them homemade with little or no salt, or compare nutrition facts of similar products and choose the ones with less sodium.

### **Let Them Dunk**

Sometimes it's OK to let your kids play with their food, especially when they're getting extra nutrition. Try packing one of these fun dunks with dippers:

• Apple and pear slices to dip into low-fat plain yogurt or peanut butter.

- Carrot, celery and sweet pepper strips to dip into hummus, fresh salsa or homemade bean dip.
- Whole-grain crackers\* or slices of grilled tofu (a soybean product) to dunk into soup.
- \*Choose crackers low in sodium and saturated fat and made without hydrogenated oils.

### **Get Them Involved**

When kids help pack their lunch, they're more likely to eat that lunch! On nights you have a bit more time, like a Sunday night, have them choose which piece of fruit or what type of whole grain bread they want and let them assemble their lunch. Make this a weekly routine – it's another great way to spend family time together.
