Becoming a homeowner is an exciting experience in life, but after the derecho in August of 2020 - it became challenging. Like many homeowners, Shelley Shea, owner of Cantebury Kitchens, had damage to the roof of her split-foyer home at 145 Skyview Ave in Fairfax. Due to the rain following the derecho, extensive water damage caused the ceiling to collapse in one of the bedrooms and track across the front of the house. Shelley explains,



"It was like a waterfall coming in above the front door."

Over the course of five years before the storm, gradual improvements to the exterior of the home were made. In the spring of 2020, Shelley and her significant other, Steve, wanted to begin updating the interior of the home. They had started the planning stages of design and decided on the area they would begin with. The derecho significantly shifted their plans. After extensive water damage to the main floor of their split-foyer, they moved into the basement and began the lengthy process of putting their house back together. They carefully considered the new layout and finishing details of their remodel. The focus of the design was to make an inviting and timeless main floor.

As you enter the split-foyer home, the open cable railing and sandy beach/grey flooring throughout creates a very spacious and welcoming entertainment space. To the right is the cozy living area with a stone fireplace going up to the vaulted ceiling. In the kitchen, the white inset cabinets on the perimeter keep the space light and airy. The luxury marble on the island is the focal point of the room. The perimeter countertop is a grey/black Quartzite with veining that adds texture to the space.

The countertops are complimented with a glossy tile backsplash. They chose an angled pattern of tile behind the cooktop to tie in their four-seasons porch flooring, that is angled also.

The kitchen design is timeless and functional. The focus was to create a beautiful design while maximizing storage. Some of the accessories include a prep sink in the island, a bar fridge, lift-up mixer, deep drawers, utensil pullouts on each side of the cooktop, roll trays, and pop-up outlets on the island. Their favorite accessory is the state-of-the-art pop-up TV in the island! Steve carefully planned the design to include a removable panel to access the TV lift unit. Built-in pantries with deep roll trays add additional storage to the kitchen. Puck lights, textured glass, and walnut floating shelves compliment the built-in bar.

When it came to the island cabinetry, Steve and Shelley knew exactly what they wanted the color to be. They chose a subtle coastal green/gray with a smokey dry brushing finish. It ties in perfectly with the flooring. They both genuinely enjoyed the design process because they often picked out the same finishes. The final details came together perfectly.

The laundry room is nicely tucked behind a pocket door in the kitchen. They adjusted the layout, making it more accessible and user friendly. The recently renovated four seasons porch is right off the kitchen and acts as a bonus room for entertaining. This is where they spend most of their time. The exterior wall of the porch is decorated with refurbished wood from an old corn crib. The white-washed wood is the perfect accent to the room. Sheer curtains on each window allow for natural sunlight and a fantastic view of the beautifully landscaped backyard. The multi-gray tone flooring is installed at an angle that ties in with the tile backsplash in the kitchen. White shiplap makes up the rest of the wall coverings. A cozy rattan sectional, an array of plants, and some natural sunlight makes this a great space to curl up with your favorite book.

The rest of the main level consisted of remodeling two bathrooms and two bedrooms. The Derecho damage enabled Shelley and Steve to rearrange the space by adding square footage to both bathrooms and converting a bedroom into a walk-in closet. The original master bedroom closet was converted into a walk-in shower. The new design has unique tile accent walls in both bathrooms. White molding throughout adds a clean and polished look to the entire project.

"We are so happy with how it all turned out! Now our focus is on renovating the basement." says Shelley.

Tips for Starting Your Veggie Garden

Gardening has increased greatly over the last few years. People are home more and eager to grow some of their own food. Below are a few tips on how to start a home vegetable garden.

- 1. Pick your plot. Vegetables grow best in well-drained, fertile soil, with at least six to eight hours of direct sunlight each day. The ground for your garden should also be fairly level and tilled well to allow good root growth and drainage.
- **2. Keep it small.** Do yourself a favor and stick to a small plot for the first year or two until you have down what you are planting. A 4 by 8-foot plot is a great start for a veggie garden. If you don't have a lot of room you can even start smaller, planting container-friendly veggies and herbs in pots or window-boxes on a sunny deck.
- 3. Grow what you will eat and what is easy to grow in your zone. Peppers, tomatoes, bush beans, leafy greens, carrots, and radishes are just a few that make the easy-to-grow list. It's tempting to start growing a bunch of different veggies. But you want to make sure that you and your family will eat what you grow.
- **4. Have a relatively close water source.** Initial seedlings will need to be watered well and frequently to start growing. After crops are established you can get away with watering every two days depending on the weather. I like to set up my garden with soaker hoses down the roes to make watering easier, and to water the soil and root, and not the tops of the plants. To conserve water and reduce the need to irrigate, mulch your soil. This will also suppress weeds and make taking care of your garden easier!

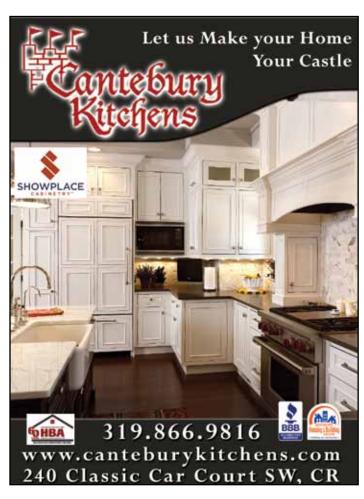

Everything Bagel and Egg Casserole

Ingredients:

- 4 everything bagels cut into bite-size pieces
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese
- 8 oz. cream cheese, cut into cubes
- 1/2 red onion chopped
- 3 scallions chopped
- 8 large eggs
- 2 cups heavy cream
- 1/2 cup chicken stock
- Sea Salt and Pepper to taste
- Fresh basil for garnish

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350°. Spray large baking dish with cooking spray. Place bagels, all cheeses, scallions, and onions into the dish. Toss lightly. Whisk together eggs, cream, and chicken stock. Season with salt and pepper. Pour egg mixture over bagels in baking dish. Bake covered with foil for 30 minutes and uncovered for another 20 minutes or until eggs are cooked through and light golden brown. Tear basil into pieces and sprinkle on top. Serve and enjoy.

*Swap out the shredded cheddar, parmesan and onions for chopped cherry tomatoes, chopped ham and shredded Swiss for another delish' variation!



Easy Cinnamon Roll Casserole Ingredients:

- 3 cans refrigerated cinnamon rolls
- 4 large eggs
- 1 cup of milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- A dash of nutmeg
- Butter

Directions:

Preheat oven to 325. Butter large baking dish and layer the ready to bake cinnamon rolls into the dish. Whisk together eggs, milk, vanilla, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Pour egg mixture over the cinnamon rolls and bake for 20 minutes or until the eggs are cooked through and casserole is golden brown.

Let cool for a few minutes and then drizzle with the icing that comes with your cinnamon rolls. Enjoy!



2 Ingredient Bagels Ingredients:

1 cup self-rising flour

1 cup non-fat plain greek yogurt

*Optional seasonings

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350. Combine your self-rising flour and Greek yogurt in a mixing bowl and knead for 2-4 minutes until the dough comes together. Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper or non-stick baking sheet. Cut your dough into 4 equal sections. Roll each section into a small log and pull ends and pinch together to make a bagel shape.

Optional: *Spray the tops of your bagel with cooking spray and sprinkle with Everything Bagel Seasoning, cinnamon and sugar or sea salt.

Bake for 20-25 minutes until golden brown. Makes 4 bagels and you will want to eat them all!

Baked Canned Fruit Casserole

- 1 cup of sugar
- 1 stick of butter
- 4 eaas
- 5-7 pieces of white bread torn into pieces (leftover hot dog or hamburger rolls work as well

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Put 5 slices of torn bread in the bottom of a greased casserole dish. Put all other ingredients in a food processor and pulse just until butter is broken into small pieces (about 5 quick pulses). Pour over bread and if it looks a little too runny - add rest of the bread. Bake for 60 minutes Serve with ice cream or whipped topping for a fantastic dessert!

Women face higher risk of stroke

STROKE IN U.S. WOMEN BY THE NUMBERS



One in 5 women has a stroke.

About 55,000 more women than men have a stroke each year.



Stroke is the No. 4 cause of death in women.

Stroke kills over 80,000 women a year.



Among women, black women have the highest prevalence of stroke.

STROKE RISK INCREASES IN WOMEN WHO:



Are pregnant

Pregnant women are three times more likely to have a stroke as non-pregnant women of the same age.



Have preeclampsia

This dangerous condition of high blood pressure during pregnancy doubles stroke risk later in life.



Take birth control pills

These can double the risk of stroke, especially in women with high blood pressure.



Use hormone replacement therapy

It doesn't lower stroke risk if postmenopausal, as once thought.



Have migraines with aura and smoke

Strokes are more common in women who have migraines with aura and smoke, compared with other women.



Have atrial fibrillation

This quivering or irregular heartbeat can increase stroke risk fivefold.

STROKE RISK DECREASES IN WOMEN WHO:

Talk to their health care professional to determine safest medication if pregnant with high blood pressure.

Discuss with their health care professional low-dose aspirin guidelines starting in the second trimester (week 12) to lower preeclampsia risk. Get their blood pressure checked before taking birth control pills and monitor every six months.

Review the risk and benefits

of hormone replacement therapy with their health care professional and discuss if the benefit outweighs the risks. For some women, it might not.

Quit smoking.

All women who experience migraines and smoke should avoid smoking, nicotine use, vaping and e-cigarettes.

Get screened for atrial fibrillation

if over the age of 75 as this condition then becomes more common in women.

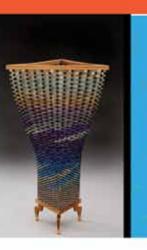

The Marion Arts Festival returns to City Square Park on Saturday, May 21st, celebrating its 30th Annual event! The MAF is a free, outdoor, family-friendly, come-as-you-are fine art happening. No one dresses up or buys a ticket – attendees are invited to arrive in shorts, pushing their strollers, and looking forward to a day in Uptown Marion. Festivities begin at 9 am.

Founded in 1993, the festival presents 50 nationally sourced artists. This year, 10,000 attendees will welcome an All-Star lineup of fan-favorite artists from past festivals, selling artworks ranging from jewelry to printmaking to outdoor sculpture for this milestone event.

The Marion Arts Fest's Empty Bowls project has been a long-standing part of the festival experience! Students from five school districts have created more than 1,000 bowls donated to the festival to be sold at the event, most for just \$5. Area ceramicists, college-level classrooms and clubs, and a local woodturners' group will also contribute bowls to the sale, with 100% of the proceeds donated to food assistance programs. Since its inception 23 years ago, the project has raised more than \$105,000 for area food banks.

Professionals from the Iowa Ceramics and Glass Studio will also be on hand, offering wet clay fun and the opportunity to create an Empty Bowl for next year's sale! This anniversary year marks the return of the MAF half marathon and 5K runs, hosted by Corridor Running. The routes showcase the best of Marion's sites and scenery,

and the finish line preserves long-held traditions, including the spaghetti breakfast! Runners can register for either race as late as 7:00 a.m. on festival day. The marathons are set to start @ 7:30 am.

This year the festival will embrace all of Uptown Marion as its food court, with restaurants offering grab-and-go items to be enjoyed in the park. There will be music and activities in the Uptown Artway alley (located between the buildings on 7th and 8th Avenue) and other community offerings such as the Marion-East Cedar Rapids Rotary Waffle Breakfast at Vernon Middle School and the Marion Heritage Center's "Art by Your Friends and Neighbors" exhibit.

Festival director Deb Bailey has been with the MAF since 2003. "What I love most is how the festival demonstrates to everyone they can have art that is unique to them. Whether it's a \$5 Empty Bowl, a new favorite mug, or a painting that generations will enjoy, everybody deserves something beautiful for themselves." Bailey treasures the conversations overheard between artists and young people as a close second. "Every time a kid asks an artist how they made that, a bell rings in their parents' ears; the festival proves that artmaking can be a bona fide career choice with talent and training. Few places or experiences deliver that message."

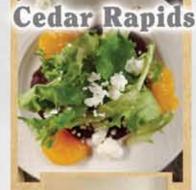
