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CELEBRATE NATIONAL ICE CREAM MONTH WITH A FUN HOMEMADE TREAT!



What better way to celebrate National Ice Cream Month than by creating your own homemade ice cream? Don't worry if you don't have an ice cream maker - we've got you covered with a simple and fun bag-and-ice method. Get ready to cool down and indulge in a delicious homemade treat that will make this month even sweeter!

Basic Vanilla Ice Cream in a Bag

Ingredients:

- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1 cup whole milk
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

You'll also need:

- 2 large resealable plastic bags (1-gallon size)
- Ice cubes
- 1/2 cup rock salt or kosher salt
- Oven mitts or a kitchen towel for handling

Instructions:

- In a mixing bowl, whisk together the heavy cream, whole milk, granulated sugar, and vanilla extract until well combined and the sugar has dissolved.
- Pour the mixture into a resealable plastic bag and seal it tightly, removing any excess air. Make sure it's properly sealed to prevent leaks.
- Fill the other resealable plastic bag halfway with ice cubes and add the rock salt or kosher salt. The salt helps lower the freezing point of the ice and creates a colder environment for the ice cream to freeze.
- Place the sealed bag containing the ice cream mixture inside the bag of ice and seal the outer bag tightly.
- Holding the bag with oven mitts or wrapping it in a kitchen towel, shake and massage the bags vigorously for about 5-10 minutes. This motion helps the ice cream mixture freeze evenly.
- Check the consistency of the ice cream by gently pressing on the inner bag. Once it reaches a soft-serve consistency, remove it from the outer bag.
- Wipe off any salt from the bag before opening it. Scoop the homemade ice cream into bowls or cones, and get ready to savor your cool and delightful creation!

Shake, shake, shake those bags and enjoy the magic of transforming liquid goodness into frozen delight. So, gather your supplies, gather your loved ones, and create a memorable ice cream experience to cherish during this special month dedicated to the sweetest dessert of all. You should focus your energy on that one person who loves you, and start there. Then eventually that one will turn into 100. And that 100 into 1000." And he was right! Focusing your attention on the ones who are rooting for you and blocking out the negative folks was some of the most helpful advice I've ever been given.

What is the craziest thing a fan has done to get your attention?

I've been flashed, by both men and women. Flowers have shown up at my house and on my car. One fan even hand drew a flip book and knew exactly where I would be to slip it under the door. The book ended with him and I on a date -- but needless to say, I didn't take him up on the offer. But I think the wildest thing would be when a sweet fan got my signature tattooed on their arm. And of course it was written in bright pink! When he showed it to me he told me that a conversation I had with him kept him from ending his life one night. I was floored. And speechless. You never know how powerful your impact can be on anyone at any given time.

What is your go-to comfort food?

I'm a huge fan of Sushi House on Edgewood Road -- the "Love Roll" never disappoints. But if I'm staying at home, then it's definitely a quick call to Pizza Hut on Mt Vernon Road for a thin crust taco pizza with no meat! I am also a fan of dipping Doritos into Ramen noodles. What is one thing that people would be surprised to learn about you?

What are you most looking forward to this year?

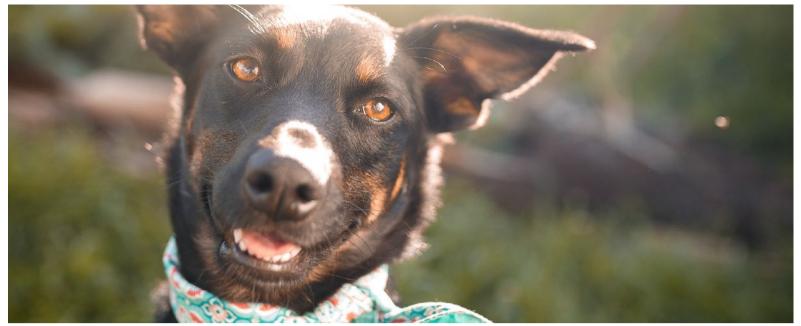

How to Stay Active in Warm Weather

Ample sunshine, longer days, and warmer temperatures provide more opportunities for the whole family to get outside and get active. Try walking, swimming, biking, skating, jumping rope, building a backyard obstacle course, or organizing a neighborhood soccer game. Even gardening, pushing a stroller, or walking the dog counts.

But when the temperature goes up, being active outdoors can be more challenging. It's easier to become overheated when the sun is beaming down all day. The warm months also bring humidity to many parts of the country. With humidity, your sweat doesn't evaporate as quickly, so your body has a harder time releasing heat.

Tips to keep in mind.

* Timing is key: Try to avoid exercising outside in the early afternoon. It's usually hottest between noon and 3 p.m.

* Hydrate: Drink water before, during, and after physical activity, even if you don't feel thirsty. Bring a bottle of water with you, or plan water stops along your route.

* Dress for success: Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothes. Moisture-wicking fabric can also be a big help. Protect yourself from the sun with sunglasses, a hat or visor, and plenty of sweat-resistant sunscreen.

* Listen to your body: Take frequent breaks in the shade, and drink water before you're thirsty. Allow yourself time to adapt to the heat -some experts say that this can take 4-14 days. You may not be able to work out as long or as hard as usual when it's very hot.

* Doctor's orders: Check with your healthcare professional before starting an exercise routine or moving your workout outdoors if you have cardiovascular disease, diabetes, other chronic diseases, or any medical concerns. Certain medications like beta blockers, ace receptor blockers, ace inhibitors, calcium channel blockers, and diuretics can exaggerate the body's response to heat.

* Buddy up: If you can, work out with a partner for safety ... and fun!

Many communities require an upfront buy-in fee or a longterm lease. Search for a community that doesn't charge a buy-in fee and provides a month-to-month lease in the event of an emergency discharge. In addition, an "All Inclusive" community is peace of mind knowing that the monthly rent includes all of the necessary convenience services rather than purchasing a la carte which add cost in addition to your levels of care fees, which are common





When is it the right time?

Only you can make that decision. However, remember the goal of moving an aging adult to a senior community is to:

* help alleviate the possibility of a major incident that causes them to need an even higher level of care. (nursing home)

- * improve socialization
- * encourage physical and cognitive activity
- * meet unmet needs to make life easier
- * help the aging adult to remain independent for as long as possible

Ultimately the big picture is to improve quality of life and reduce risks of failing health. If you see your loved one failing or not enjoying the every day things we take for granted. That is when you need to consider a transition.

Just remember the senior themselves, as well as the family, are going through an emotional process. Change can be challenging. The keys to success are preparation, a positive attitude, along with patience and understanding.

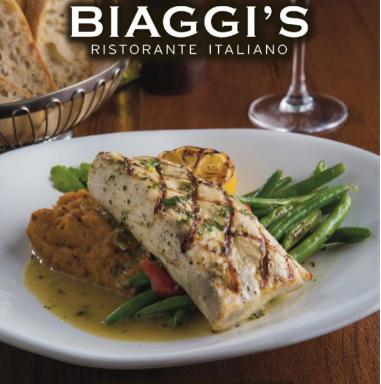

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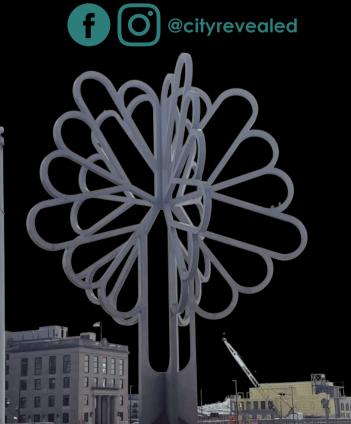
