Everybody's Talking

Mosaic healer: In Lyon, France, street surfaces are being quietly transformed but not by city crews. A shadowy artist is filling potholes with colourful mosaic patterns. The anonymous figure known as Ememem calls his work "flacking," a nod to the French word for puddle, and has become known locally as the "pavement surgeon." His designs appear in broken sidewalks, mixing geometry and charm where damage once was. Although he shares photos online, Ememem avoids the spotlight entirely, leaving behind only a signature image of a trowel. Inspired by a past in tiling and music, his work has become a form of public care, not protest. What began as a side project now adorns hundreds of streets, and counting.

Cosmic chill: For the first time, glowing auroras have been clearly captured on Neptune, thanks to the infrared capabilities of NASA's Webb Space Telescope. Unlike Earth's polar lights, Neptune's auroras appear nearer the planet's mid-latitudes, an oddity explained by the planet's tilted, lopsided magnetic field. The discovery gives scientists a fresh look into the ice giant's mysterious atmosphere, revealing not just the light show but also that Neptune's high-altitude regions have cooled significantly since their last recorded temperatures. Researchers believe the dramatic cooling may explain why the auroras stayed hidden for so long. The glow is impressive, but the temperature drop leaves scientists with a deeper puzzle to explore.

Coin quest: After years combing the same patch of farmland near Dudley, England, a retired welder with a metal detector uncovered a Roman coin like no other found in the British Isles. The coin featured Emperor Aulus Vitellius, who ruled briefly in 69 C.E., a volatile moment in Rome's history. Unlike typical discoveries from later centuries, this traced back nearly two millennia, making it exceptionally rare. It was later sold at auction to a collector, with proceeds shared between the finder and the landowner. The payout was notable, but the thrill of holding a lost piece of history was the true reward. How it ended up in an English field remains a mystery.

Table friends: A cozy cafe in Tokyo, Japan, has found a charming way to make solo dining less lonely. At the Moomin House Cafe, guests are seated with stuffed Moomins, which are plush, hippo-like characters created by Finnish artist Tove Jansson, to share their table. Diners enjoy pastries and breads shaped like the beloved characters, with recipes that nod to Finnish traditions. Originally a quiet spot, the cafe steadily grew into a favourite destination for both locals and visitors. Its "anti-loneliness" idea continues to resonate, offering a playful and heartwarming way to enjoy a meal. With several locations in Japan and a devoted fanbase, the Moomins remain a comforting presence for anyone dining alone.


