

History Corner - This week, a brief history of Grand Ocean!

The Grand Ocean was designed by architect RWH Jones — who also created Saltdean Lido — and opened its golden doors in July 1938. Built in the glamorous Streamline Moderne style, it was the epitome of seaside Art Deco luxury. Guests enjoyed a sweeping spiral staircase, a grand ballroom, roof gardens, an outdoor pool and even an American-style cocktail bar. Stars such as Bette Davis and ballerina Margot Fonteyn swished through its doors, while royalty and high society made it the place to be seen.

This glittering era was short-lived. In 1941, the hotel was requisitioned by the Auxiliary Fire Service as a wartime training college. With over 370,000 fire personnel, 80,000 of which were women, satellite training was needed across the country.

The priority at the hotel was to train instructors who could then go out and teach all around the country. There could be anything up to 300 officers training at the hotel at any given time. Though spared bombing, the building's elegance faded under heavy use. The building was pivotal in providing the fire service with training which allowed them to cope with the Blitz and remained a training college until 1948.

A revival came in 1953, when Billy Butlin bought the near-derelict site for £250,000 — later stating it was "the best investment I ever made!" Reopened as part of the Butlin's empire, it became known as the "Honeymoon Hotel." Guests flocked for affordable holidays packed with talent contests, knobbly knees competitions and lively Redcoat entertainment. Future stars such as Des O'Connor and Jimmy Tarbuck cut their teeth here, while resident organist Jimmy Noon played for nearly forty years.

It remained with Butlin's until 1972 when the company was taken over by Rank Organisation. There was one last glimpse of its past in 1993 when the hotel became a TV star when it was used in an episode of Poirot. It was the perfect backdrop to this story of Agatha Christie's detective Hercule Poirot who, while on vacation in Brighton, solved the mystery of stolen jewels.

The Ocean Garage, where patrons used to park their cars in the early days, with staff quarters on the first floor, is now occupied by Homeridge House, a retirement complex.

In 1998 it was bought by the Grand Leisure Hotel Group and acquired the "Grand" in its name. Story has it that more than a few confused guests arriving at Brighton Station would hail a taxi telling the cabbie that they were staying at The Grand Hotel. However, they would very soon be in for a shock when a rather snooty concierge informed them, there was only one 'Grand Hotel' in Brighton, and their accommodation was some five miles out of town at what used to be a Butlin's holiday hotel.

In 2004 the hotel closed its doors forever. When the developer, Explore Living bought the Grade II listed building in 2005, it looked less than grand. The windows were smashed, and vandals and vermin had got in. Most of the 4-acre sloping site was cleared and the swimming pool was demolished.

The Old Hotel Building was restored retaining many original features; the entrance with its fountain, the reception desk, stunning staircase, lift,

golden doors and beautiful garden with fountains and ponds reflecting the bow of the Queen Mary Liner.

Today the Grand Ocean Estate houses the Grade II listed Grand Ocean Hotel building and 5 other modern buildings made up of 235 apartments plus two doctors surgeries.

On the 29th August this year, residents, local dignitaries and architectural heritage organisations were invited to a reopening ceremony of the splendid, historic Grade II-listed Grand Ocean Building, followed by a garden soirée, after a major two-year renovation.

From Art Deco glamour to holiday camp fun, the Grand Ocean remains one of Saltdean's most fascinating landmarks.

The History of Brighton Male Voice Choir




The Brighton Male Voice Choir has roots reaching back to 1926, a time of hardship when unemployment was high, workhouses still existed, and daily survival was tough. To provide jobs, a project was launched to build the undercliff walk from Brighton to Rottingdean.

Many of the men who came to work were Welsh miners, skilled in rock work and steeped in a strong choral tradition. They brought with them a deep love of music, and soon the *Brighton and Hove Harmonic Society* was formed. The choir flourished, even being regularly featured by the BBC on *Friday Night is Music Night*.

23 Bus Service Extended to Woodingdean!



Residents of Woodingdean will soon benefit from bus services linking the community directly with Falmer.

Brighton and Hove Buses has confirmed that from September 28th it will extend its 23 bus service to Woodingdean, providing new links to Falmer, Lewes Road, Queens Park and Brighton Marina.

Nearly a century later, the choir continues under the name *Brighton Male Voice Choir*, now drawing members from across Brighton and East Sussex.

Over the years, it has been led by a succession of inspiring Musical Directors; today, Pat White from Seaford guides the choir on its ongoing journey of learning and enjoyment.

The choir remains open to all men who enjoy singing—whether experienced musicians or complete beginners. No audition is required, and there is no need to read music.

Rehearsals take place every Thursday evening at 7.00pm at Woodingdean Methodist Church. The focus is simple but powerful: singing for pleasure and sharing that joy with audiences.

At school times, journeys on route 23 will be diverted via Wilson Avenue, Vines Cross Road, Swanborough Drive, Swanborough Place (AM only), Whitehawk Way and Whitehawk Road. This is to provide a new school link between Whitehawk and Brighton Aldridge Community Academy (BACA). Journeys from Woodingdean to Lewes and beyond can be made by changing to routes 28, 29, 29A & 29B at Falmer Station, running up to every 10 minutes.

Route 23 will serve Brighton University and Falmer Station and will no longer serve University of Sussex campus. A much more frequent service will operate to Northfield Crescent and East Slope on the revised route 25.

This improvement is supported by funding from the Brighton & Hove Bus Service Improvement Plan.
