Harveys Cross By Douglas d'Enno



High on the Downs, a mile or more from the end of Saltdean Vale as the crow flies, stands a memorial to John Harvey, first erected

in 1819 in the form of a simple milestone-hike marker placed at the spot where the rider fell from his horse and was killed.

Harvey, from Bedfordshire, left a young widow and five children. He had been staying with friends in Rottingdean – ironically, for the improvement of his health. His home was a mansion in Ickwell Bury, and the grounds of his estate still exist although they are no longer in the family's possession. Nor are the buildings standing on them the original ones.

Colonel Harvey was held in high esteem in his locality and is known to have raised a militia for service in the Napoleonic War. The memorial we see today is not a tomb. Harvey's body was conveyed to Bedfordshire at enormous expense with a great number of mourners forming the cortege. In the 1880s, the Harvey family erected a memorial at the site of his death. By the mid-1920s, we know (from a Sussex survey photo in the old Reference Library in Brighton) that a cross surmounted the slab, with an inscription recording details of the tragedy.

Sadly, this was destroyed by our troops in the course of target practice during the Second World War.

On 21 July 1998, this author and his good friend and neighbour in Saltdean, Peter Dutton, visited the forlorn remains of the memorial – so forlorn that we thought it was a drainage structure or similar (see first photo below). Following clearance work and fundraising, we had, by the following year, restored the memorial to its former glory, an event celebrated with a gathering of selected supporters, including Harvey family members, who were major donors.

Suitable rustic entertainment was provided by the legendary folk singer, Bob Copper, and his family.

Despite vandalisation (more than once) in the years that followed, the memorial largely survived and was repaired and fully restored by 2019, when the 200-year anniversary of John Harvey's unfortunate fall was suitably commemorated.




