CSHE's Technical Assistance Directory features partner organizations, individuals and consultants specializing in health equity, social innovation, organizing, research, evaluation, healing justice, and civil rights advocacy. This directory ensures that our community has access to specialized expertise and critical resources that drive systemic transformation of our health care system.

This directory is a reflection of the years of purposeful relationship-building, constructive dialogue, and collaborative growth. With each interaction CSHE has had throughout its development, we have learned and taught something along the way. CSHE's Transformed TA Approach

Since 2020, CSHE-P's Technical Assistance (TA) approach has evolved to center community knowledge, experiences, and grassroot solutions. This year, we will launch a refined TA Model designed to foster deeper collaboration and knowledge exchange, strengthening the experiential knowledge and power of the communities we serve.

Our refined and transformed TA model embraces a collaborative approach where every participant—whether representing a community, institution, or organization—is both a student and a teacher. Through intentionally designed spaces, we will cultivate innovation and transformation by facilitating meaningful exchanges of knowledge, strategies, and lived expertise.

Our knowledge exchange practices will expand beyond virtual engagements to include in person opportunities for collaboration among our partners. These spaces will include Community Connection Hours, Skills and Strategy Sessions, Interactive Training Sessions, Knowledge Exchange Series, Committees and Working Groups, Site Visits & Cultural Exchanges, and One-on-One Technical Assistance.





How to Use this Guide

Connect

Connect with CSHE's Program Director to express your interest in a resource from the TA Directory.



- The Program Director will engage with you to learn about what kind of skills/strategies you would like to learn or implement and who you would like to connect with.
- The Program Director will then provide an inquiry form to gather the information and begin processing the request.

Request

Request your Technical Assistance support by submitting the form provided by CSHE's Program Director.



- Once the form is submitted the CSHE Team will work on coordinating space for you and the resource requested to meet and facilitate the initial technical assistance meeting.
- This process will inform CSHE's practices, strategies, and programmatic strategic direction.
