



## 23rd March 2025 3rd Sunday of Lent



The Parable of the Unfruitful Fig Tree seems harsh, yet we also find compassion here in the second chance given to the fruit tree to be fruitful. Moreover, intensive care is offered; fertilizer is dug into the soil. God is the God of second chances, and third and fourth, and more, seventy-times seven, or, as Peter found out, God's forgiveness and love is without limits. But if God's mercy cannot be exhausted neither is it meant to be assumed. The parable intends that we for our part seize the day and seek to live fruitful lives from

now on. There is an urgency, "today is the day of salvation" not some far off, distant time. The sooner we assume our identity as God's children, the better; the more likely we are to produce the fruit of the Spirit, which is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Such things take time to grow, best tended to as soon as possible.

The weekly collection is used to meet the routine running costs of the parish, including energy costs (heat and light), sanctuary candles, liturgical consumables (altar breads, altar wine), pastoral activities, office expenses (including telephone/internet/stationery), maintenance and repairs of buildings and grounds, priest's stipend and staff wages. We do our best to monitor costs at all times and to make the best possible use of the money which you so faithfully contribute each week.

**Gift Aid** greatly enhances the collection – thank you to all who participate in the scheme. If you are a tax-payer, and have not already signed up for Gift Aid, you are encouraged to do so. Remember, at no extra cost to you, the Parish can claim 25p on every £1 you contribute.
