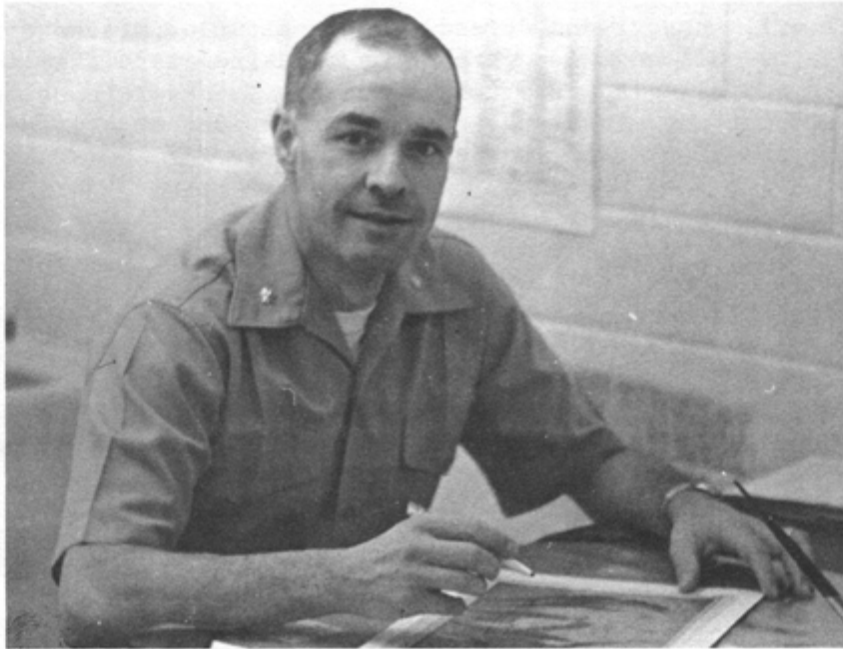
This day marks the end of the beginning and the beginning of your military career.

LTCOL Donald H. Strain has been a familiar figure to University of Texas midshipmen both on and off the drill field for the past three years. Among his many duties at the unit was included the position of military advisor for the battalion and as such he was responsible for the orderly and efficient operation of the battalion. At times this position required a great deal of tact as well as a firm hand in guiding the battalion. But his main function at the unit was in his position as the Marine Option instructor. He has been the main driving force turning out well trained second lieutenants for the Marine Corps. Not only has he guided Marine Option midshipmen in their paths toward commissioning, but he has also guided Navy line and Navy supply corps options both on and off the drill field here at the campus as well as during the second class summer training periods held in Corpus Christi.

Donald H. Strain was born in Washington, D.C., on 23 October 1929. He attended and received a BA degree from the University of Virginia where he was quite active in sports, receiving three varsity letters in baseball and being the assistant varsity baseball coach in 1953. He received his commission on 5 June 1953 by having gone through the Platoon Leader Corps program.

Since receiving his commission in 1953, LTCOL Strain has attended many service schools. These include Marine Corps Basic School, Quantico, Virginia; U.S. Army Artillery School, U.S. Army Radar School, and U.S. Army Rocket and Missile School, all three located at Fort Sill, Oklahoma; Marine Corps Aerial Observer School, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina; and the John F. Kennedy School for Special Warfare at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. This schooling has been interspersed in his many varied assignments.



He has served as Aerial Observer and then Executive Officer, 155MM Howitzer Battery, 10th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division; Executive Officer and then Commanding Officer, 105MM Howitzer Battery, 12th Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division; Operations and Training Officer, 2nd Field Artillery Group, Atlantic Force Troops; Instructor, Marine Corps Station, Quantico, Virginia; Instructor, U.S. Army Artillery and Missile School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma; Commanding Officer, Marine Detachment, USS Shangri-La (CVA-38); and instructor here at the University of Texas. LTCOL Strain served in the Cuban Blockade and twice in the Dominican Republic Crisis in 1961 and again in 1965. It was during his tour of duty here at the University of Texas that he was selected for promotion to the rank of lieutenant colonel.

Yes, LTCOL and Mrs. Donald H. Strain and their daughter "Happy" have been a familiar "threesome" at Unit functions. When he left this spring for Command and Staff College, Quantico, Virginia, in preparation for duty in Vietnam, he himself was gone. But he has left behind a military tradition which will shape careers of University of Texas midshipmen for years to come. The University of Texas has been just another step in his bright future. We have gained a lot from his sojourn here. Maybe you too, LTCOL Strain, have gained something from us. Thus it is, not with a sad note of departure but rather a hearty "Best Wishes" in your career, that we dedicate this year's Longhorn Log to you.

A familiar and welcome Officer at all of our Unit activities this year has been our new "Skipper", Captain Hartsel Dale Allen. Captain Allen became our Professor of Naval Science and Commanding Officer in August of 1967.

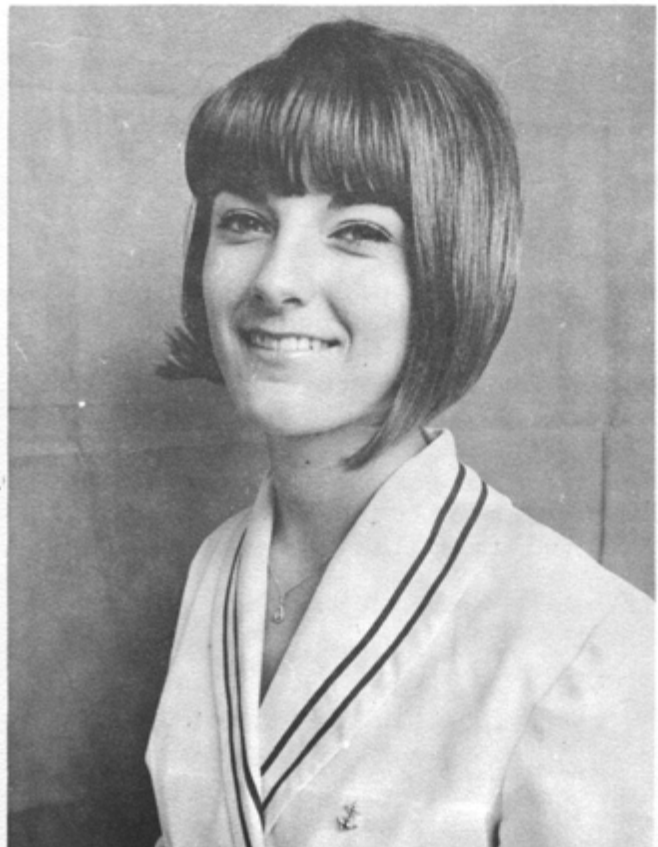


## **Chandler Strain**

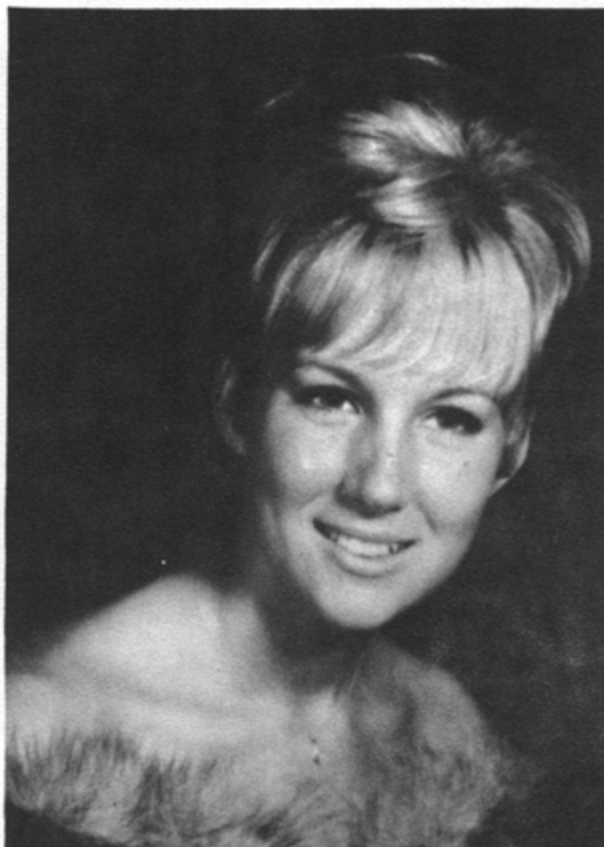
## **Barbara Hughes**

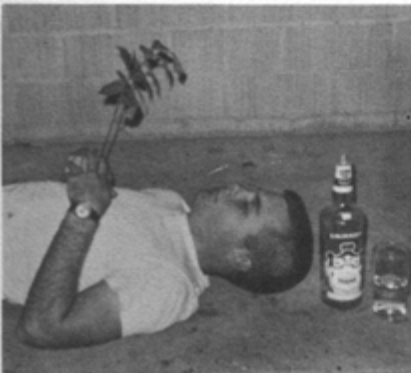
# CROW'S NEST
