

...that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign or domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I ... about to enter, So help me God.

This ceremony marks the beginning of the beginning.

The years following this ceremony mold each midshipman into a general form which approaches that of a young naval or marine officer. There are social events, athletic events, at-sea training cruises and the ever present educational process, which takes its toll; all of these comprise the majority of each midshipman's time. It is these facets of your college life which is portrayed in this issue of your Longhorn Log.

Then comes THE DAY. Two ceremonies take place this time, neither of which is as simple or informal as the original ceremony. Again, the words begin to go by:

This day marks the end of the beginning and the beginning of your military career.




