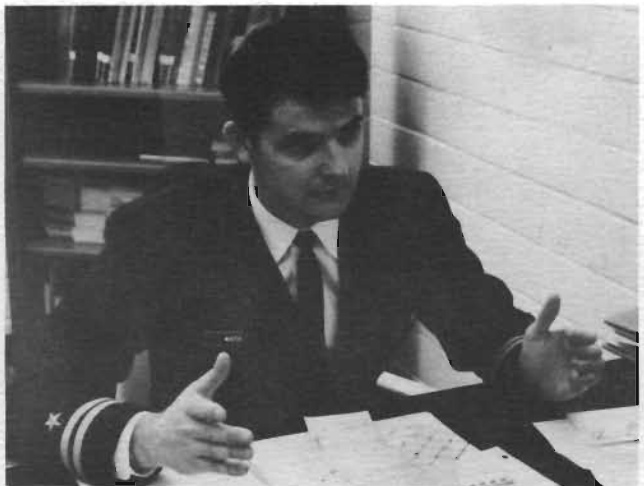
Staff Officers

Midn. Capt. John Conly, a native of San Antonio, readily demonstrates the fact that a contract student need not feel inferior in the Unit. The Fall Battalion CO was a 1964 graduate of Alamo Heights High School. This Spring he will receive his degree from the University in Electrical Engineering with a minor in nuclear power. With his degree and commission, he will proceed to Nuclear Power School, and then on to nuclear submarines.

Unit activities for Captain Conly have included 4/c member of the Buccaneers, and also Outstanding 4/c, 3/c, and 2/c Midshipman. He was a member of the rifle team during his 3/c year and basketball player throughout his stay at the University. Rank is earned in the NROTC Unit, and Capt. Conly went from squad member, to Platoon Commander, to Battalion CPO and then finally to Battalion Commanding Officer this past Fall.

The Captain of Scabbard and Blade, Mr. Conly is a member of Phi Eta Sigma, Delta Kappa Epsilon, and has received the Order of Alcalde. In June, he will be recognized as a Distinguished Naval Graduate.

Captain Conly summarizes his stay in the University of Texas NROTC with two statements: "Leadership is people," and speaking of job satisfaction "You get out what you have to put in."

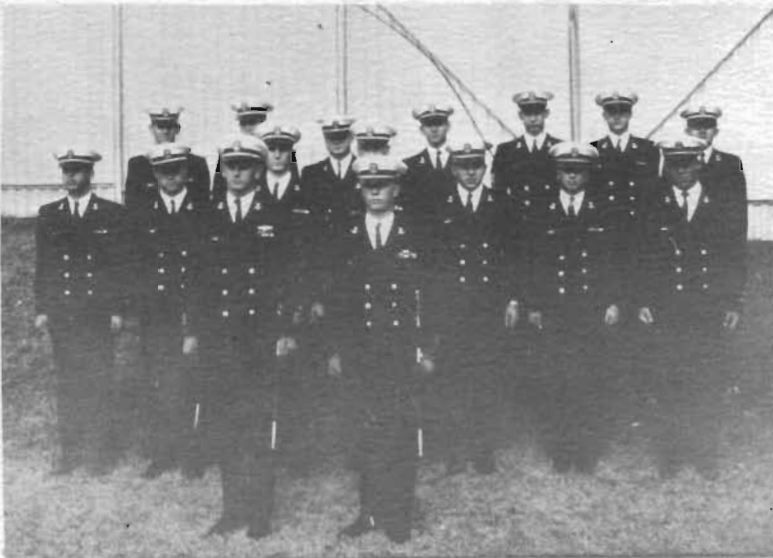

A member of the Texas Cowboys, Scabbard and Blade, and Semper Fidelis, Captain Olson has received the Sons of the American Award and served as co-chairman of the 1969 Roundup Showcase, a Challenge discussion leader, and a member of the Student' Association Speakers' Tour committee.

"I only regret not ever having been a member of the Buccaneers," summarizes Captain Olson about his Navy ROTC days. "The Buc's are an example, not only for the University, but also for the Navy ROTC. They should be given more recognition and money, and membership should be more strongly emphasized."
