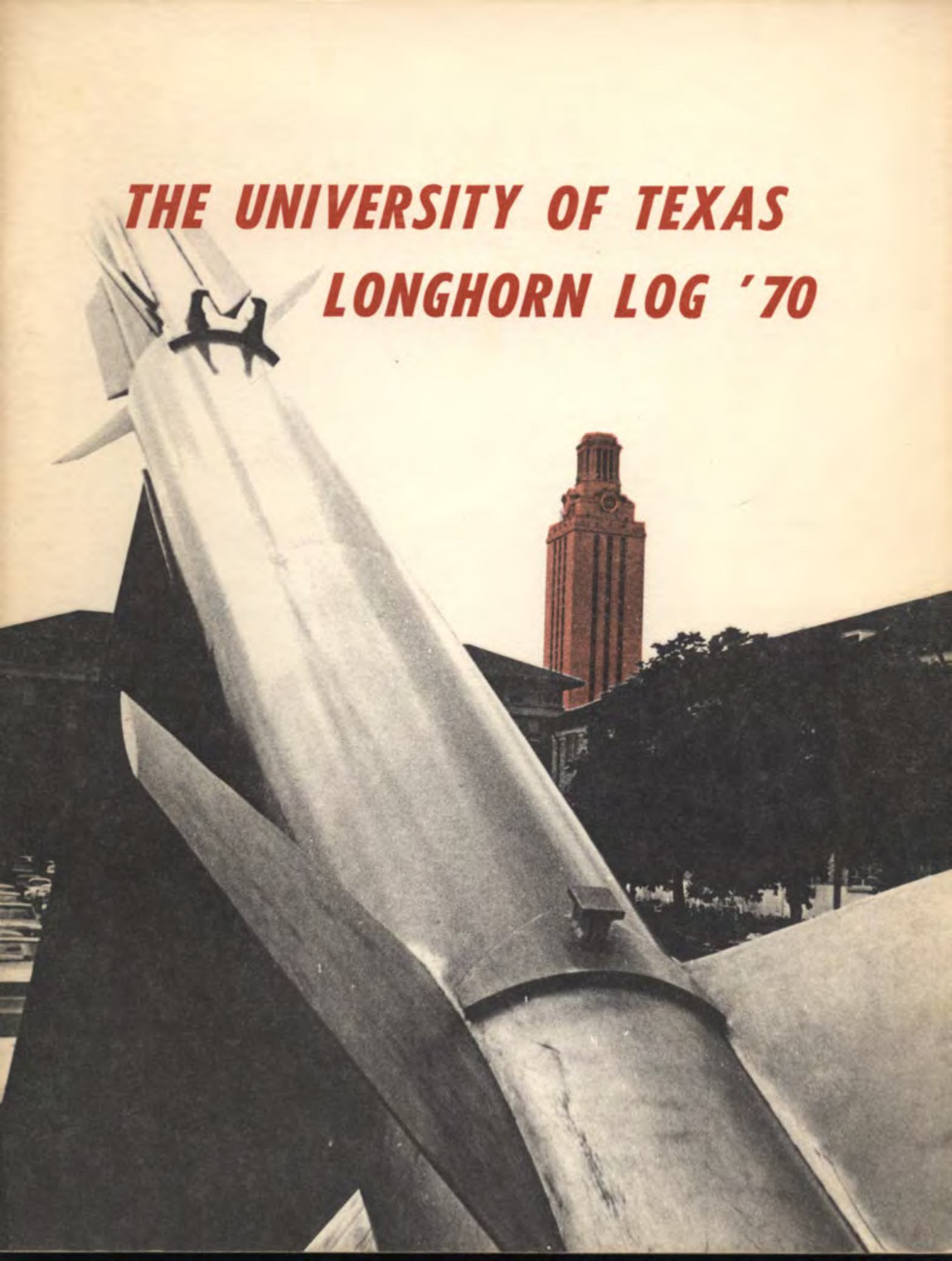

He should be, as well, a gentleman of liberal education, refined manner, punctilious courtesy, and the nicest sense of personal honor. He should be the soul of tact, patience, justice, firmness, and charity."



# In Dedication...

During these times, when ROTC of all types are being questioned, it behooves us to honor those who carry on, the Midshipmen themselves.

What is a midshipman? He is an involvement with himself, with his fellow future officers, and with his University. Not everyone can claim all of these attributes, but perhaps one can be picked, Jim Burns of Granby, Connecticut.

Jim held several offices in the Crow's Nest during his few years here. He served as President of the Semper Fidelis Society, was a member of the Scabbard and Blade Society, played intramural sports and made the Dean's list. In 1966, as commanding officer of the Buccaneers, he led the team to one of its most successful seasons ever. Jim was personally rewarded for his efforts by Chancellor Ransom in a hand written letter of congratulations.



In 1967, Jim was tapped by the Texas Cowboys, in which he was active until his graduation.

During summer training, Jim consistently ranked number one down through O.C.S. for the Corps. In January of 1968, Jim graduated and went to Basic School, where he again graduated number one. After Vietnamese Language School, he reported for duty with the Third Marine Division in the Republic of Viet Nam. Last year, while on patrol as a company commander, he was killed by enemy gunfire. He has been awarded the Bronze Star posthumously.

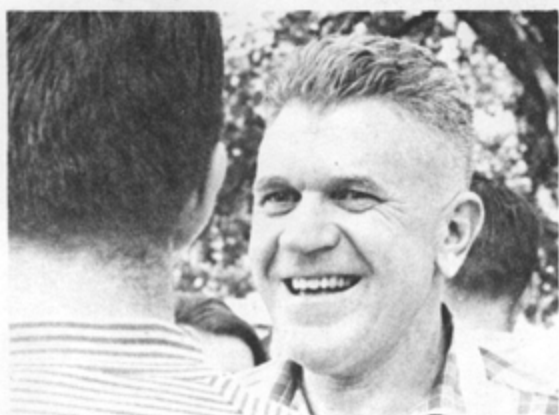
Highly untypical, perhaps, however those who had the honor of knowing Burns would say that he was indeed what the typical midshipman should be.
