Keys to Reading and Understanding the Old Testament:

- The Bible was written over a span of about 1,500 years.
- The Christian, protestant Old Testament is not arranged chronologically.
- The kingdom of Israel was a united kingdom of 12 tribes during the reign of Saul, David, and Solomon; thereafter it was divided into the Northern kingdom of Israel (made up of 10 tribes) and the southern kingdom of Judah (made up of the two tribes of Benjamin and Judah).
- The Old Testament often describes periods of time in the historical record based on who was ruling Israel and/or Judah at the time. (In the third year of the reign of king X in Israel, king Y became ruler of Judah.)
- Many key women, including: Rahab, Tamar, Ruth, Deborah, Jael, Bathsheba. God has a very special and culturally shocking view of women, which is displayed in both the Old and New Testaments.
