FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

The cross of Jesus stands as one of the most potent and enduring symbols in human history. It is etched not only into

the architecture of churches and cathedrals, but also into the hearts and minds of countless individuals who have sought hope, forgiveness, and purpose within its shadow. To reflect on the cross is to embark on a journey through paradox—the intersection of suffering and love, humiliation and glory, death and life. It is an invitation to explore mystery and meaning, to confront the depths of human brokenness and the heights of divine compassion.

Before it became the emblem of Christian faith, the cross was a Roman instrument of execution—a brutal and public display of imperial power. Crucifixion was reserved for the lowest: criminals, rebels, and slaves. For Jesus of Nazareth, an itinerant teacher and healer from Galilee, the path to the cross was marked by betrayal, misunderstanding, and injustice. Yet, early Christians saw in this ignominious death not merely an end, but a beginning.

The cross, carved from rough timber and driven into the earth outside Jerusalem's city gates, would become the axis around which history turns. What was intended to extinguish a movement instead ignited transformation. The humiliation of one became, paradoxically, the hope of many.

Within the Christian tradition, the cross is not only a historical fact but a theological mystery. It is the locus of sacrifice—a place where the innocent suffers for the sake of the guilty. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son," writes John, encapsulating the idea that Jesus' death was not accidental but purposeful. The cross thus becomes both altar and battleground: a place where the weight of sin, guilt, and

separation is borne and overcome. HURRICANE PRAYER
