1. Automate the repetitive tasks:

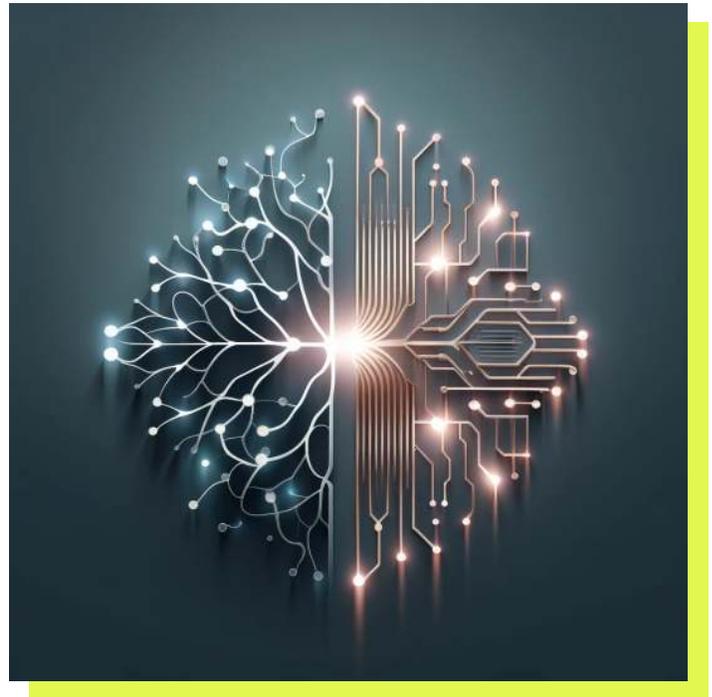
AI tools like Monday.com or Trello streamline workflows, while chatbots handle routine queries. This frees up your time for higher-value work.

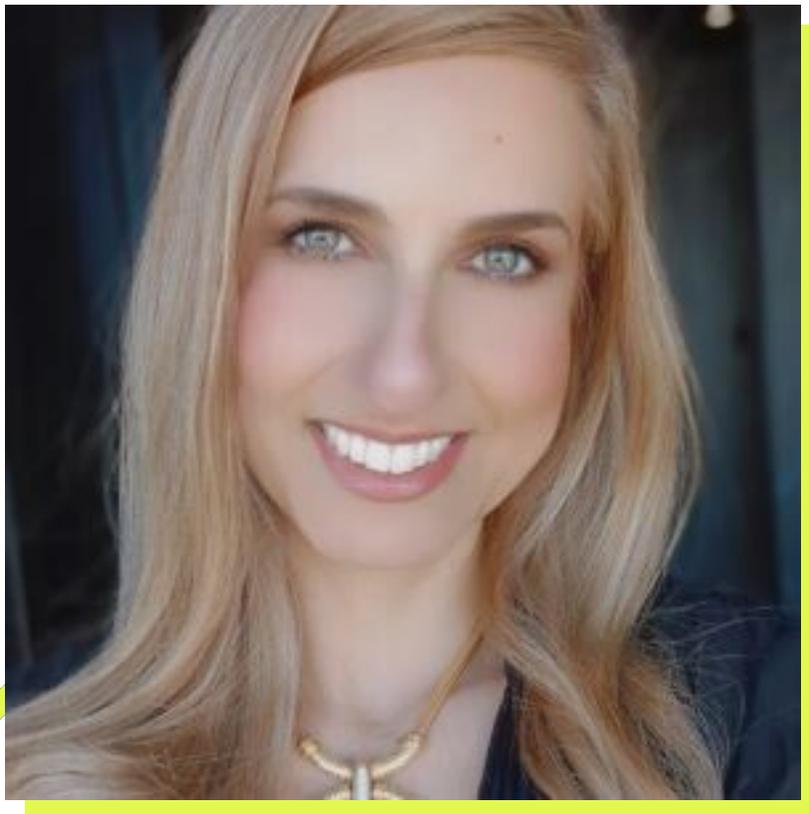

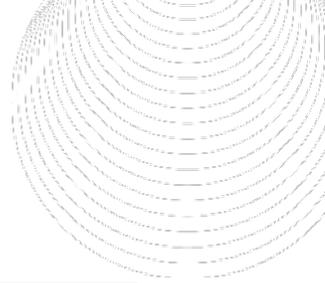
