## **Ordinance 2016-11**

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE DUTIES OF THE TOWN MARSHAL

**WHEREAS**, The Town of Taylor Board of Aldermen desires to establish the duties of the Town Marshal.

**THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Taylor, Mississippi: The Town Marshal is the chief police officer of the town and has the powers of other law enforcement officers in executing the orders of the legislative body and enforcing laws. The Marshal or his deputy:

- 1. shall serve all process directed by the town court or legislative body;
- 2. shall suppress breaches of the peace;
- 3. may, if necessary, call the power of the town to his aid;
- 4. may execute search warrants and arrest warrants;
- 5. may pursue and jail persons who commit an offense; and
- 6. shall serve as the town ordinance enforcement officer, herein after known as the code enforcement officer.

**Be it further ordained that**, the Town Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to cause this ordinance to be posted as required by Mississippi statute.

This ordinance and the rules, regulations, provision, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force and effect 30 days from and after the date of its final passage and adoption and shall take effect and be in force on and after the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of September, 2016.
