

## PROPOSAL FOR PRESIDENTIAL EMERGENCY ACTION

**Subject: *Emergency Farm and Food Security Plan (Trump's "ReGrow America")*: To Save Small to Medium Farms and Restore Healthy Food Production**

### I. PURPOSE AND JUSTIFICATION

This proposal recommends the immediate issuance of a Presidential Emergency Action Directive (PEAD) to address the escalating crisis in U.S. agriculture and food production.

Small to medium farms and ranches—foundations of America's food independence—are facing unprecedented financial, structural, and ecological pressures. Rapid consolidation of farmland, rising interest rates, supply chain instability, and the erosion of local food infrastructure threaten not only rural livelihoods but also national food security and public health.

**To prevent irreversible loss of domestic food capacity and generations of regenerative farming practices, this proposal outlines an Emergency Farm and Food Security Plan designed to stabilize agricultural operations, rebuild regional food systems, and reestablish the sovereignty of America's food supply chain.**

The President is urged to **adopt all measures outlined in this plan for immediate emergency implementation** under the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. §§1601–1651) and related executive authorities.

### II. OBJECTIVES:

Trump's Operation *ReGrow America* will:

- Stabilize and sustain small and medium-sized farms, preventing widespread bankruptcy and the loss of America's independent agricultural base.
  - Secure the nation's food supply for defense and emergency readiness.
  - Restore soil health and regenerative agricultural systems.
  - Strengthen economies by creating millions of jobs.
  - Rebuild regional food systems and reestablish national food sovereignty.
  - Restore America's capacity to feed itself with real, nutrient-rich food.

### III. TOP PRIORITIES TO SAVE SMALL-MEDIUM FARMS AND RESTORE HEALTHY FOOD PRODUCTION

**Financial Stability and Support for Farmers:**

1. **Freeze all farm and ranch bankruptcies and foreclosures** until agricultural stability is restored.
2. **Reduce all long-term farm and ranch loans to 0–3% interest.** 3% for all Ag but eligible to reduce to 0% if farm incorporates acceptable regenerative practices.

3. **Set all annual farm operating loans** at 0-3% interest immediately.
4. **Eliminate land or equipment taxes on** agricultural property long term.
5. **Provide 0% interest financing** for agricultural equipment and trucks.
6. **Simplify and expedite access to FSA, SBA, and USDA loan access** by cutting red tape.
7. **Redirect all funding from weather modification/geoengineering programs** from other departments to implement the 'ReGrow America' initiative.
8. **Allow farmers to have 2 deferred payments per decade** without credit or interest penalty.
9. **Expand crop insurance to all non-fuel crops and stop all foreign involvement in claim** -- Minimum historical AUMs or 80% historical production rate must be met to be eligible for crop insurance.
10. **Make sale of agricultural land to small or medium farmers exempt from federal income and capital gains tax.**

#### **Production and Expansion**

11. **US shall purchase seed** for 250,000 new farms for planting next year's crops.
12. **Ban all lab-grown food products** from sale or distribution within U.S. borders.
13. **Incentivize soybean farmers to convert** to alternative, regenerative crops.
14. **Develop and support non-GMO agricultural systems** through federal grants or aid.

#### **Processing, Infrastructure, and Distribution**

15. **Fast-track the approval, construction and inspection** of 10,000 new regional food processing facilities to support all agriculture products.
16. **Establish a "Farm Shipping Rate"** for UPS, FedEx, and USPS—similar to the existing Library rate—to reduce costs for agricultural shipping.

#### **Food Access, Nutrition, and Education**

17. **Implement the updated National Dietary Guidelines immediately** emphasizing healthy fats, nutrient-dense, locally grown foods.
18. **Transfer SNAP program administration from USDA to HHS** to coordinate directly with the Emergency Farm Plan—**treating farmers as essential food providers equivalent or greater importance to SNAP recipients.**
19. **Launch national agricultural and butchering educational programs** through FFA partnerships in all high schools.
20. **Partner with *Moms for America*** to provide cooking education through hands-on school-based breakfast and lunch meal programs.
21. **Use freeze-dried, canned, and dehydrated foods** from eligible farms in schools and hospitals.
22. **Incorporate "Food as Medicine" programs into Medicare and Medicaid** nationwide under HHS.

#### **Economic Protection and Fair Trade**

23. **Implement real-time market monitoring** to adjust trade flows and stabilize the domestic agricultural sector.
24. **Suspend foreign aid agriculture and food programs** until farms are established and domestic food security is restored.
25. **Mandate and enforce clear "Product of USA" labeling** requirements for all consumer products.
26. **Enhance federal oversight of all major corporate food entities** to ensure fair market practices.
27. **Seize agricultural land or assets** owned by foreign countries or US or foreign persons linked to treasonous activity.
28. **Transition all crop-based fuel programs** to the **Department of Energy (DOE)**

## Organization and Communications

29. **Establish the “Farm Corps”** under the Department of Defense, in coordination with the **United States Regenerative Small Farm and Food Act, USDA, and HHS.**
30. **Launch a national media campaign** on radio, television, and social media promoting the value of real, nutrient-rich healthy food—and the understanding that good food is worth more.
31. **Ensure fair compensation for independent agricultural advisors consulting any US policy changes**—specifically those not connected to large firms or lobbyists.

## IV. ELIGIBILITY

**Identify family farms vs. corporate farms and establish clear parameters of who is eligible** for the emergency plan and define **family farms vs. corporate farms**

Eligibility for financial and emergency support programs is limited to independently owned, family-managed farms, ranches, branded food programs, processors and feeders with gross cash farm income (GCFI) of **\$10 million or less**. Both small-medium and family farms meeting these criteria—particularly those relying primarily on family labor—are eligible. Farms that are divided business entities, large corporate-owned, or primarily controlled by non-family or investment groups are **excluded** from program eligibility. See eligibility table:
