

FAMILY BIBLE STUDY GUIDE - WEEK 2

Theme: Understanding Sin, Consequences, and God's Rescue Plan

Opening Discussion:

- Have you ever done something wrong and tried to hide it?
- How did it feel when your parents found out?
- What do you think Adam and Eve felt when they disobeyed God?

Read Together: Genesis 3:1-15

(Have a child or parent read aloud, stopping to explain words if needed.)

Discussion Questions:

1. The Sneaky Snake

- Who tricked Adam and Eve? (Satan, disguised as a serpent)
- What did he say to make them doubt God? (He questioned God's words and told a lie.)
- Do we sometimes believe lies about God? (Example: "God doesn't really love me" or "I can do whatever I want.")

2. Disobeying God

- What rule did Adam and Eve break? (They ate from the one tree God told them not to.)
- What happened when they sinned? (They felt ashamed and tried to hide from God.)
- When we sin, should we hide from God or go to Him? (God wants us to confess and trust Him.)

3. The First Promise of Jesus

- Read Genesis 3:15 again. Who do you think is the "offspring" that will crush the serpent? (Jesus!)
- Why is this important? (It's God's first promise to send Jesus to rescue us from sin.)

Activity Time:

Option 1: Sin & Forgiveness Object Lesson

- Take a clear glass of water (pure like Adam and Eve before sin).
- Add a drop of food coloring (sin entering the world).
- Ask: Can we make the water clear again by ourselves? (No!)
- Now, pour in a little bleach (symbolizing Jesus' forgiveness).
- Watch the water clear up and explain that only Jesus can take away sin.

Option 2: Craft – The Rescue Plan

- Draw a picture of the Garden of Eden, Adam & Eve, and a snake.
- On the back, write “God sent Jesus to rescue us!” (John 3:16).
- Display it as a reminder of God’s love.

Memory Verse:

Romans 5:19 – *“For as by one man’s disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man’s obedience the many will be made righteous.”*

Prayer Time:

- Thank God for loving us, even when we sin.
 - Ask God to help us listen and obey Him.
 - Thank Jesus for coming to rescue us from sin!
