Missouri Heads To The Golden State For Ninth Time In School History

This week's trip to the Bay Area will mark the ninth time in program history that a Missouri squad has traveled to California ... the first visit came in 1982 when MU faced Maryland in the NCAA Tournament in Maples Pavilion (also the only prior trip to the facility) ... this trip marks the third time in the Cindy Stein-era that the Tigers have played in the Golden State, with the two previous visits coming during the same Thanksgiving Holiday time period (Nov. 1999 at the San Diego State Tournament and Nov. 2000 at Pepperdine's Tournament).

Mizzou Takes On SEC Foe For The First Time In Five Years

Friday's opening-round game against Alabama will mark the first time Missouri has faced a school from the Southeastern Conference since meeting Bama in the 2002 WNIT First Round in Columbia, Mo. ... the Tigers are 8-16 all-time against SEC schools and 3-4 under Cindy Stein ... Mizzou's last win over an SEC team came in the 2001 NCAA Tour-

namment, when it upset fourth-ranked Georgia in Athens to advance to the program's second Sweet 16 ... for those looking to compare the top conferences in the nation, the Big 12 and SEC have met on the hardwood twice this season - Vanderbilt held off a late Colorado charge to win 81-76 on Nov. 12 in Boulder, Colo., and on Tuesday of this week Baylor defeated LSU, 64-60, in Waco, Texas.

Turkey With The Tigers

In each of Cindy Steins' nine seasons at Mizzou her squad has participated in a Thanksgiving holiday tournament ... this is primarily due to the fact that MU hosts its own event the first week of December each year - and will do so again next week with the 29th State Farm Tiger Classic ... previous Thanksgiving tourney destinations have included Iowa City, Iowa (1998), San Diego, Calif. (1999), Malibu, Calif. (2000), Durham, N.C. (2001), Corpus Christi, Texas (2002), Green Bay, Wis. (2003), Albuquerque, N.M. (2004) and Pittsburgh, Pa. (2005) ... MU won titles in 1999 and 2005, while claiming runner-up finishes in 2000 and 2003.

Recognized as one of the nation's top young women's basketball coaches, Cindy Stein has led the Mizzou women's basketball program to levels not seen in 20 years in Columbia. The latest installment of that success was shown in 2005-06 with the Tigers' top-four finish in the Big 12 Conference, first-round bye and a semifinal appearance in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Championship – achievements accomplished for the first time in school history.

It also shows up in the 20 wins Mizzou compiled in the regular season, something the Tigers hadn't hap-

pened since 1990. That was also the last time a Missouri squad finished as high as fourth in its conference, as the Tigers did a year ago.

In guiding the Tigers through the rigors of the Big 12 Conference, recognized as one of the toughest in the country, Stein has led her troops to records of .500 or better three times, something that hasn't happened in mid-Missouri since 1983.

Members of Stein's teams have earned First Team Academic All-Big 12 honors 27 times in her eight years at MU, and five others have earned Second Team or Honorable Mention recognition by the league. In addition, current assistant coach Kerensa Barr earned Academic All-America honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America in 2002.

Stein, who was inducted into the Greater Peoria Sports Hall of Fame in March of 2002, was named the 2001 Coach of the Year by the Columbia chapter of the Women's Intersport Network.

About Alabama

Alabama is 3-1 on the season and has won two consecutive games for the first time this season after splitting their home opener against Samford (W,62-53) and road opener at Arkansas State (L,56-73) ...senior G Kate Mastin leads the Tide in scoring (14.3 ppg) and has a team-high 12 3-pointers and two blocks ... 12 of her 17 made field goals have come from outside ...senior G/F Navondra Moore is second in scoring (11.3 ppg) after leading the team with a 12.3 ppg average a year ago ...she was a second-team All-SEC pick last year and is a preseason second-teamer this year as well ...freshman PG Nikki Davis has handed out 19 assists to accompany her 8.3 ppg and 6.3 rpg ...a slasher who likes to penetrate into the lane, she has only attempted one 3-pointer all year ...junior F Nathalie Reshard leads the team in rebounding at 6.8 boards per game, while ranking fourth in scoring at 6.8 ppg ...the Tide have a plus-9 rebound margin and are allowing just under eight offensive rebs per game ... head coach Stephany Smith is in her second season in Tuscaloosa after eight years at Middle Tennessee, where she led the Blue Raiders to the NCAA Second Round in 2004 and 2005.

Tigers In Regular-Season Tournament Play

With its participation in the Hilton Concord Thanksgiving Tournament, Missouri is competing in its 65th regular-season tournament ... the Tigers have compiled a 101-48 (.673) mark in those events ... in the eight previous years under coach Cindy Stein, Mizzou is 25-11 (.694) with eight titles to its credit ... six have been in the State Farm Tiger Classic, in addition to the 1999 San Diego State Tournament and last year's Pitt Thanksgiving Tournament ... the Tigers have won their last two regular-season tournaments and three overall in the last three years.

Is MU More Balanced This Season Than Last?

Well, that may not be a fair question to ask after just four games but a check of the numbers and it appears that Missouri is more productive in just about every major statistical category this year than last ... the chart below shows Mizzou's numbers at the same point in each of the past two seasons:

Mizzou's 39.7 percentage currently ranks second in the Big 12 behind Texas A&M's shocking figure of 57.6.

Tigers Loving The Charity Early On

A combined 64.4 percent free-throw shooting team a year ago, this season's squad is already showing a new-found commitment to success at the charity stripe ... in four games the Tigers have combined to make 61-of-71 (86 percent) while making more freebies than their opponents have attempted (61 made to 51 opponent attempts) ... MU currently sits atop the Big 12 rankings, ahead of Iowa State (.786) and Texas (.746) ... last season's .644 final tally ranked 11th.

Crashing The Boards Paying Dividends Early On

Every coach in the country will tell you that rebounding is one of the most important aspects of the game of basketball ... and nowhere is that more evident than with the 2006-07 edition of the Missouri women's team ... while the Tigers field goal percentage (.339) is lower

than their opponents (.445), their ability to be successful on the offensive glass (60 rebs thus far) has proved vital in their success ... MU has produced 52 second-chance points this year while allowing just 33 in four games.

Double Your Pleasure

Carlynn Savant and EeTisha Riddle each posted double-doubles in points and rebounds against Arkansas State last Friday night, bringing the team's season total to three ... that was the first time this year that multiple players accomplished the feat in the same game ... a year ago, that occurred just twice ... below is a list of Mizzou DD's this year and the career totals for all active players.

Brooks Picking Up Where She Left Off In 05-06

While much of the talk this preseason centered around Missouri's seven seniors and how they were going to replace WNBA Draft Picks LaToya Bond and Christelle N'Garsanet, senior G Tiffany Brooks quietly went about her business and has shown true leadership as one of two co-captains (with Carlynn Savant) ... over her last 11 games dating back to the Oklahoma State game (2/15/06), she is averaging 15.2 points, 3.5 rebounds and shooting 52.4 percent from the floor ... she has also posted nine double-figure scoring games during the stretch with seven of at least 15.

Savant's Assault On Missouri's 3-Point Record

It's no secret that senior F Carlynn Savant is a deadly shooter from behind the three-point arc, although she has struggled to the tune of just 35.3 percent this year on 6-of-17 ... last season she set a school-record for three-point accuracy by connecting on 46.0 percent (57-of-124) of her attempts ... that figure also ranked first in the Big 12 and sixth in the NCAA ... she enters the Alabama game with 106 career three-point field goals made, which is fifth at Missouri and 35 shy of Tracy Lozier's record of 140 ... her .408 career 3-point percentage is second all-time but sits 28 points back of Stacy Williams' benchmark of .436.

Mizzou's all-time record in the finest on-campus basketball arena in the country now stands at 20-10 ... following a 5-8 mark in the initial season, the Tigers have gone 15-2, including a streak of 11-consecutive non-conference victories dating back to a 71-55 loss to Stanford on Dec. 18, 2004 ... against all non-Big 12 opponents MU is 13-2 in the facility.

Savant's Career Night Leads

Missouri Past Arkansas State, 74-53

Senior F Carlynn Savant posted her fourth-career double-double as Missouri defeated Arkansas State, 74-53, for its 11th-consecutive non-conference home win ... Savant established career highs with 22 points and four blocks to go along with 12 rebounds and four assists. She also made a game-high three 3-pointers in 36 turnover-free minutes ... senior G Tiffany Brooks tied for team-high honors with 22 points and a career-best six steals ... senior post EeTisha Riddle posted her seventh career double-double with 10 points and 12 boards ... the Tigers grabbed 46 rebounds for the second-straight game as they held a 46-33 edge on the glass ... Mizzou committed a season-low 14 turnovers while turning 21 Lady Indian miscues into 20 Tiger points.

Stein Notches 200th Career Win

With the Tigers' 89-60 victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi last Tuesday, MU Head Coach Cindy Stein registered her 200th career win in her 12th season as a college head coach ... in her eight seasons at Mizzou, she has compiled a 135-107 mark with three NCAA Tournament appearances ... she is now 201-113 overall.

Hollins Nets Career High 21 In 89-60 Win

Over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi

Behind sophomore Alyssa Hollins' career-high 21 points, Missouri rolled past Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, 89-60, in its home-opener at Mizzou Arena Tuesday night ... 13 players scored, while 12 recorded at least one rebound and 11 combined to hand out 24 assists (on 35 made baskets) ... making her first-ever start, Hollins set career-highs for 3-pointers made, with five, and assists, with three ... senior Tiffany Brooks finished with 15 points on 7-of-11 shooting and added team-highs with seven rebounds and six assists ... senior post EeTisha Riddle scored the first six points of the game for the Tigers and completed her night with 10 points and four rebounds ... Missouri improved to 26-7 all-time in home openers.

Brooks Leads Four In Double Figures

As Mizzou Defeats SIU, 71-60

Senior Tiffany Brooks had 15 first-half points and finished with 19 as Missouri used a 13-0 run late in the game to defeat Southern Illinois, 71-60, in the season-opener for both teams ... classmates Carlynn Savant and EeTisha Riddle added 14 points as well, with Riddle posting her sixth-career double-double with 12 rebounds ... sophomore Alyssa Hollins came off the bench to net a career-high 13 points in 20 minutes.

Mizzou Runs Past SIU With Quick Strikes

While they didn't officially record any fast-break points against SIU, Missouri did score fast and often over a couple of key periods in the game ... In the first half the Tigers reeled-off nine-consecutive points over a 1:52 stretch midway through the first half as their claimed their first lead ... late in the second half, MU turned a 56-52 deficit into a 65-56 lead thanks to a 13-0 run that lasted just 3:05 ... following the 13-0 run, the Tigers held the Salukis in check, limiting them to four points (1 FG and 2 FT) and three turnovers over the final three minutes.

Tigers Picked Ninth By Big 12 Coaches

In a vote of the league's head coaches, Missouri was picked to finish ninth in the Big 12 Conference. Last year the Tigers were selected to finish tenth but ended the year in fourth place with a 10-6 record. Under ninth-year head coach Cindy Stein, the Tigers have finished higher than their preseason prediction six times.
