For Openers...

> The Tigers will face off against the Notre Dame Fighting Irish Monday night at Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo., in the championship round of the Progressive CBE Classic ... Tonight is the ninth-ever matchup between the two teams, with Mizzou ahead in the all-time series 6-2 ... The two clubs last met on Jan. 12, 1995 in Columbia, Mo., when the Tigers earned a 64-54 victory.

> Mizzou is making a record fourth appearance in the CBE Classic (2001, 2004 and 2007), which was previously known as the Guardians Classic ... The Tigers won the event in 2001 ... Thursday's win over Niagara improved MU's all-time wins record in the event to 11 ... Mizzou now owns an 11-3 all-time mark in the Classic.

> The CBE Classic is a homecoming for four different Tigers who call Kansas City home ... Seniors Marcus Denmon, Steve Moore and Jarrett Sutton and junior Michael Dixon all hail from the City of Fountains.

> Mizzou has been hot from 3-point land the last two games, as the team has shot 52.3 (23-of-44) percent from long distance during the span ... The 23 threes over a two-game span was the most for the Tigers since they made 31 in consecutive games in Dec. 2009 ... Overall on the season, the Tigers are shooting 48.3 percent, which leads the Big 12 ... Senior Kim English is doing most of the damage from beyond the arc, as he is sporting a 61.9 (13-of-21) 3-point field goal shooting percentage, which is tops among Big 12 players with at least 10 attempts.

> Sophomore Phil Pressey leads the Big 12 with 3.3 steals per contest ... The guard has nabbed five steals in the last two contests ... over his last five games dating back to last season, Pressey is averaging 5.3 steals per contest.

> Missouri moved up to #24 in the AP Top 25 poll last week and remained #25 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Tigers entered 2010-11 ranked #25 in both polls to start the year... Last season marked the first year that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason since 2003-04 ... Missouri opened the year #5 in 2003-04, the highest preseason ranking in school history.

Mizzou Quick Hitters

> Mizzou continues play in the Progressive CBE Classic on Tuesday and will face Cal or Georgia in either the championship (9:30 p.m.) or consolation game (6:45 p.m.).

> Mizzou looks to improve to 4-0 for the second consecutive season and the 31st time overall.

> The Tigers are shooting an impressive 48.3 percent from behind the arc in their first three games, which ranks second among Big 12 Conference schools.

> Senior Kim English has made 13 treys in MU's first three games this season, which is the most ever by a Tiger in the first three games ... The previous record for treys in the opening three games was 12, set by Paul O'Liney in 1994-95.

> After swiping just seven steals in the season opener, the Tigers nabbed 14 against Mercer and 13 against Niagara to raise their average to 11.3 per contest ... That mark ranks second in the Big 12 ... Sophomore Phil Pressey leads the way with 3.3 steals per game to pace the conference.

> Senior Marcus Denmon scored 22 points against Niagara on Nov. 17, his second 20-point outing in MU's first three games ... Dating back to last season, the preseason All-American has reached the mark four times in his last six games and scored at least 19 points in seven of his last nine contests.

> Three different Tigers rank in the top 10 in field goal percentage among Big 12 players, in games played through Nov. 19 ... Mizzou is the only school to at least two in that list, nevermind three ... Senior Ricardo Ratliffe ranks second at 60.0 percent, English is sixth at 51.7 percent and Denmon ranks tied for ninth at 48.6 percent.

> English and Denmon are also two of the Big 12's best 3-point shooters, as English ranks fourth (61.9 percent) and Denmon ranks tied for seventh (50.0 percent) ... Most impressive is that the duo are the only players in the top seven with at least 10 attempts, as English has attempted 21 and Denmon 16.

> Seniors Marcus Denmon and Kim English continue to move up Missouri's all-time scoring list ... Denmon now has 1,210 in his career, which puts him 25th all-time at Mizzou ... Denmon needs 21

more points to tie Leo Lyons for 24th ... English stands at 1,114 points, good for 31st place ... The two surpassed the 1,000 point mark in 2010-11.

> Sophomore Phil Pressey was fantastic on the offensive end against Mercer on Nov. 14 ... The guard posted a career high 22 points after shooting 6-of-11 from the floor, 3-of-6 from behind the arc and 7-of-8 from the charity stripe ... The total bested his previous high of 17 set at Kansas last season.

> Missouri has typically played some tough schedules over the years and that trend continues in 2011-12 ... After the release of the preseason polls, Mizzou will have 11 games against teams ranked receiving votes in the preseason AP top 25 and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll... Included in that list are #12 Baylor, #13 Kansas, #19/20 Texas A&M, #24 California, Texas, Illinois, and Notre Dame.

> Senior Laurence Bowers will be forced to redshirt the 2011-12 season after suffering a season-ending knee injury (ACL) in October ... Bowers averaged 11.6 points, 6.1 rebounds and 1.8 blocks a year ago.

> This year's seniors mark the winningest class in Missouri Basketball program history...The team's 77 wins over the last three seasons mark the most in a three-year stretch at Mizzou...The Tiger clubs from 1980-83 and 1988-91 won 75 games over a three-year stretch ... The class now has a record of 80-29.

>The Tigers recorded 23+ wins in each of the last three campaigns for the first time in program history...Mizzou won 31 games in 2008-09 and went 23-11 in 2009-10 and 2010-11.

>Missouri recorded it's 1,500th win in program history last season when the the Tigers triumphed over Texas Tech 88-84 in the Big 12 Tournament... Mizzou finished the season 23-11 overall, 1,500-1,039 all-time.

TIGER TIDBITS

#1 Phil Pressey, 5-10, 175 Pounds

> Averaging 13.3 points, 3.7 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.3 steals per game this season.

> Leads the Big 12 with 3.3 steals per contest after nabbing five in the last two games.

> Posted a career high 22 points against Mercer ... also grabbed five steals.

>Had an explosive first year with the Tigers averaging 6.5 points, 2.3 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 2.0 steals per game.>Pressey ranked seventh in the Big 12 and topped all Big 12 freshmen with 3.9 average assists and 117 total assists. He also broke the program's freshman record for steals and assists per game.

> His older brother **Matt Pressey** is a senior on

this year's club and his father, **Paul Pressey**, is currently an assistant coach for Byron Scott and the Cleveland Cavaliers.

#3 Matt Pressey, 6-2, 195 Pounds

> Scored a season high 12 points against Niagara.

> Started all three games this season.

> Reached double figures scoring six times during the 2010-11 season.

> Came to Mizzou as a junior college All-American at Navarro College.

> His younger brother **Phil Pressey** is a sophomore on this year's club and his father, **Paul Pressey**, is currently an assistant coach for Byron Scott and the Cleveland Cavaliers.

#10 Ricardo Ratliffe, 6-8, 240 Pounds

> Shot 6-of-7 shots from the field against Niagara to finish with 12 points.

> Posted game highs of 20 points and eight rebounds in the season opener.

> Reached double figures twice this season.

> Ranks second in the Big 12 in field goal percentage at 60.0 percent.

>Posted marks of 16.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and shot 56.8 percent from the field in MU's three exhibition games.

>Earned preseason All-Big 12 honors along with teammates **Marcus Denmon** and **Laurence Bowers** this season. Last season he was named Big 12 Conference Presesason and Postseason Newcomer of the Year as well as honorable mention All-Big 12. He was also named to the

> Passed Doug Smith for fifth all-time among Mizzou Juniors with a 57.1% shooting percentage from the field.

> Highly-coveted big man out of Central Florida College, that was twice named a first team NJCAA All-American. That made him one of only 13 players in NJCAA history to be named back-to-back first team All-American.

#11 Michael Dixon, 6-1, 185 Pounds

> Reached double figures twice this season, including 12 points against Niagara last time out.

> Shooting 94.7 (18-19) percent from the free throw line this season ... Now tied for second all-time at MU with a career .846 free throw percentage.

> Ranked second on the team with 17.0 points per contest in exhibition play. Also shot an incredible 69.2 percent from the floor, 64.3 percent from behind the arc and dished out 4.0 assists per game.

> Returning junior that made eight starts as a rookie and 17 last year.

> Scoring point guard that ranked in the top 10 of the Big 12 with 3.5 assists (9th), 1.8 steals (8th), a .825 free throw percentage (6th), and 1.9 assists/turnover ratio (4th).

> He ranked second on the team with 113 total assists last season.

#12 Marcus Denmon, 6-3, 185 Pounds

> Reached double figures the last 12 games, dating back to last season.

> Averaging a team high 18.0 points and ranks second on the team with 6.7 rebounds.

> Shooting 48.6 percent from the floor and 50.0 percent from beyond the arc.

> Named to the 2011 preseason All-Big 12 team, the Wooden Award Watch List and the Naismith Watch List.

> Has 1,210 total points to rank 25th all-time at Mizzou.

> Led the club in scoring, 3-point shots made (82) and three-point field goal percentage (.448) and was ranked in the top 10 of the Conference in scoring (7th), field goal percentage (5th), steals (3rd), 3-point percentage (2nd) and 3-point makes per game (5th).

> His 82 3-point makes were the 7th most in school history and his 3-point percentage tied fellow Kansas City native Kareem Rush for 7th.

> He was voted as one of the top seniors by Rivals.com coming off of an impressive 2011 season that earned him 2011 All-Big 12 First Team honors along with 2011 NABC All-District and 2011 USBWA All-District awards as well.

> Over the summer, Denmon played for team USA at the World University Games in China where he started four games and averaged 7.6 points and 1.9 steals while leading the team in steals with 15.

#15 Kadeem Green, 6-8, 210 Pounds

> Made his official collegiate debut against SEMO and notched two points, two rebounds and a block.

> Had four points and four rebounds against Mercer.

> Sat out the 2010-2011 campaign as a redshirt to recover from a torn Achilles tendon that he suffered in high school.

> Averaged 17.7 minutes in MU's three exhibition games and grabbed a total of 14 rebounds.

#21 Laurence Bowers, 6-3, 185 Pounds

> Bowers will miss the 2011-12 season after suffering an ACL injury in preseason practice.

> Earned preseason All-Big 12 honors.

> Coming off of an incredible junior season where he earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors and was chosen for the Big 12 All-Defensive Team.

> Averaged 11.6 points, 6.1 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 1.8 blocks per game and made 27 starts in 2010-11.

> Finished second in the Big 12 with 62 blocked shots, the third most in school history and most-ever by a Tiger junior. He blocked eight shots against Colorado to tie Arthur Johnson for most rejections in a game.

> He recorded the first 20-point, nine-rebound, six-steal game in school history vs. Baylor.

#24 Kim English, 6-6, 200 Pounds

> Second on the team with 17.0 points per contest, while shooting an incredible 51.7 percent from the floor and 61.9 percent from 3-point land.

> His 13 3-pointers in the first three games of the year are the most ever for a Tiger player during the span.

> Reached double figures all three games so far this season.

> Notched 19 and 18 points in consecutive games against SEMO and Mercer to start the season ... That marked the first time since early in his sophomore season the guard posted at least 18 points on back-to-back games, after accomplishing the feat against Illinois on Dec. 23, 2009 (24 points) and Austin Peay on Dec. 27, 2009 (23 points).

> Averaged 9.3 points per contest in exhibition action, to go with 4.3 rebounds.

> He scored his 1,000th point last season and he ranks 31st all-time in scoring in Missouri's basketball history with 1,110 career points.

> He and **Marcus Denmon** need 26 games played this season to break the school record (134) set by Mike Sandbothe.

> Played in all 34 games and earned 30 starts his junior season, averaging 10 points, 3.1 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 1.2 steals per game.

Tigers Knocking Down the Three

In the first three games of the season, the Tigers are shooting an impressive 48.3 percent from behind the arc, which is tops among Big 12 teams.

> In the last two games, Missouri has been especially hot from three, making 23-of-44 shots for a percentage of 52.3.

> In the last outing against Niagara, the Tigers made 12-of-22 shots from 3-point land ... Four days earlier against Mercer, the team made 11-of-12 from behind the arc.

> The two-game span was the first time Mizzou shot at least 50 percent from three in consecutive games since Feb. 20 and 24 of 2010, when the team accomplished the feat against Nebraska (57.9 percent) and Colorado (64.3 percent).

> Additionally, the 23 threes over a two-game span was the most for the Tigers since they made 31 over consecutive games in Dec. 2009 against UT Pan American and Chattanooga.

> Mizzou's 11 threes against Mercer were the most for the Tigers since the team made 12 against North Alabama on Jan. 5 of last year.

> The game against Mercer also was the first time Missouri shot 50 percent from three since Dec. 18 of last year against Central Arkansas.

Dixon Money From the Charity Stripe

Junior guard Michael Dixon entered the 2011-12 season ranked fourth on MU's all-time free throw percentage list.

> Dixon has helped his cause this season as he has made 18-of-19 so far this season to up his career free throw percentage to .846, which ties him for second in the MU record books.

> On the season, his 94.7 percent shooting from the charity stripe ranks fourth in the conference.

Balanced Scoring Once Again

Five different Tigers are averaging double figures in scoring through the first three games of the season.

> Last season Mizzou finished the year with five players scoring 10-plus points a contest, which marked just the fourth time in school history that happened.

> Denmon leads the way at 18.0 points, followed by English (17.0), Phil Pressey (13.3), Ricardo Ratliffe (11.7) and Michael Dixon (11.3).

Denmon and English Moving up the Charts

Seniors Marcus Denmon and Kim English continue to move up Missouri's all-time scoring list.

> Denmon now has 1,210 in his career, which puts him 25th all-time at Mizzou ... He Denmon needs 21 more points to tie Leo Lyons for 24th > English stands at 1,114 points, good for 31st place ... He needs 32 to tie Jimmy KcKinney for 30th place.

> The two surpassed the 1,000 point mark in 2010-11.

Tigers Tough in Non-Con at Home

Mizzou is in the midst of a 61-game non-conference home court winning streak at Mizzou Arena.

> The run, which dates back to the 2005-06 campaign, is a school record, topping the 29 consecutive non-conference home wins from 1979-83 ... That streak ended with an overtime loss to Marquette.

> Missouri's last non-conference loss at home came against Sam Houston State in the 2005-06 season opener.

Denmon Named to Naismith Preseason Watch List

Senior Marcus Denmon was named to the 2011-12 Naismith preseason watch list, announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club Monday.

> The Kansas City, Mo., native led Mizzou in scoring, 3-point shots made and three-point field goal percentage last season averaging 16.9 points en route to First Team all-Big 12 recognition.

> Denmon is one of 50 players on the list, including one of five from the Big 12 Conference.

Denmon Named to Wooden Top 50

Missouri senior guard **Marcus Denmon** was named a preseason candidate for the prestigious **John R. Wooden** Player of the Year trophy announced by The Los Angeles Athletic Club

> The list features 50 of the top players in college basketball who, based on last year's individual and team performances, are considered to be the early frontrunners for one of the top honors in college hoops this season ... Transfers and incoming freshmen are not eligible to for the preseason list, but can play their way into mid-season consideration for the honor.

> Denmon's selection marks the third consecutive year a Tiger has made the Wooden Preseason ledger ... **J.T. Tiller** was a Top 50 nominee as well as teammate **Kim English**.

Denmon Named Preseason All-American

Marcus Denmon was named a preseason All-American by Blue Ribbon Magazine...The Kansas City, Mo., native was a fourth team pick by the publication and joined fellow Big 12 standout Perry Jones (Baylor) on the top-four All-America squads.

> Denmon is coming off a career year in which he earned first team All-Big 12 recognition and is the lone returning member of that squad in 2011-12. The Hogan Prep High School product averaged 16.9 points, 3.5 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.8 steals per game. He led the Tigers in scoring, 3-point field goals (82) and 3-point field goal % (.448), while ranking among the top 10 of the Big 12 in scoring (7th), field goal percentage (5th), steals (3rd), 3-point percentage (2nd) and 3-point makes per game (5th).

> Overall the senior guard started 33-of-34 games and reached double figures in 30 contests, topping 20 points 12 times. He also shot 50 percent from the floor for the year,

the highest for a Missouri guard since Rickey Paulding in 2001-02.

O Brother, Where Art Thou?

Brother tandems aren't necessarily rare at Mizzou, but very few brother tandems have played at the same time for the Black & Gold ... Many Missouri fans remember the days of Slim & Slam (aka **Sammie and Simeon Haley**) and then there were **Mike and Jerry Kirksey** who played together one season (1957-58) and thanks to **Gary Link** for reminding us about the Minx twins, **Beau and Charles**, who played for MU in 1944, but now the Tigers have a new tandem of brothers, **Matt and Phil Pressey**.

> The Pressey brothers get two seasons of play on the hardwood at Missouri as Matt entered the program after earning first team Junior College All-America honors at Navarro College in Texas, while Phil was one of the elite national recruits at the point guard position.

> To this point the most successful tandem (stats-wise) are the Haley Twins who each stood over 7-feet tall and played during the 1994-96 seasons ... The duo combined to score 819 points, grab 541 rebounds and block 120 shots during their two seasons playing together.

> During 1957-58 the Kirksey brothers of Buffalo, Mo., combined to score 125 points, led by Mike, who averaged 5.4 points per night

Big 12 Preseason Poll

The Tigers were picked fourth in this year's Big 12 Preseason Poll, voted on by the league's 10 head coaches. Mizzou received 61 votes in the poll, just two behind third-place Baylor and it received one first-place vote as well. The fourth-place pick in the preseason poll is the highest the Tigers have been picked since the 2003-04 season when they were picked to win the Big 12. Kansas and Texas A&M were picked to win the league this season.

> In eight games Denmon averaged 7.6 points and 1.9 steals. He shot 41 percent from the floor and 75 percent from the foul line in four starts.

>Denmon scored three points and ripped two steals in Team USA's hard-fought 86-83 victory over Germany to secure fifth place at the

2011 World University Games in China. The Americans finished the event with a 7-1 record and handed Germany (6-2) just its second loss of the tournament. Team USA's only loss came from Lithuania.

Winningest Three-Year Stretches at Mizzou

NOTING MIZZOU HEAD COACH FRANK HAITH

Frank Haith enters his first season as the head coach of the Missouri Basketball program. A 25-year coaching veteran, Haith brings Big 12 ties, a family atmosphere and impeccable academic success to a Tiger program which has surged back onto the national landscape.

Haith was officially welcomed to the Missouri family on April 5, 2011, and immediately appreciated the Tiger's passionate fanbase. The Burlington, N.C., native came from the University of Miami where he was not only forced to instill a winning mentality to his players and supporters, but do it at a university void of any lengthy basketball tradition.

"I'm honored to be named the new head coach at the University of Missouri, and I want to thank Chancellor Brady Deaton and Director of Athletics Mike Alden for believing in me and presenting me with this tremendous opportunity to come back to the Big 12 Conference and lead this program," head coach Frank Haith said. "I have always had a tremendous amount of respect for this university and this program. I coached against Norm Stewart. Mizou Arena and the facilities here are first class. The support of the students and administration is second-to-none and the tradition is outstanding. I'll tell you this Mizou Nation, we are going to win and win big!"

Haith's task in South Beach was monumental. In addition to resurrecting a hoops program that was restarted just two decades prior, he ushered the Hurricanes into the tradition-rich Atlantic Coast Conference where many didn't expect his program to win a single league game. Those critics were wrong.

In his first of seven seasons as the head coach, Haith guided the 'Canes to seven ACC victories (despite being picked last) and qualified for postseason play. He was recognized by being named a Naismith National Coach of the Year finalist and NABC District 6 Coach of the Year.

Miami returned to postseason play the following year. The Hurricanes won 18 more games and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT, recording the program's first postseason wins since 2000. Postseason success was a theme under Haith. His teams won six total games in the NCAA and National Invitation tournaments, including a memorable run to the second round of the Big Dance in 2008. The 'Canes went 23-11 in Haith's fourth season, just one win shy of the school record and he was named a finalist for ACC Coach of the Year and the Skip Prosser Man of the Year honors.

It wasn't just on the hardwood that Haith led a University of Miami renaissance. His young men were as well-rounded as any in America. They were visible on campus and in the Miami community. Most importantly, they graduated. An incredible 21-of-22 seniors to play for Frank Haith walked across the stage to receive a diploma.

"That's my proudest moment," Haith would say. "To know we churned out young men, ready to make positive contributions in the community, ready to be great fathers and husbands. That's

what coaching at the college level is all about."

It's not an accident Frank Haith was hired as the 17th basketball coach at Mizou. The grind from student-assistant at Elon College to being named the National Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com doesn't just happen without a dedication to family, career and your student-athletes.

Haith paid his own way through Elon and graduated in 1988. He helped the Fighting Christians twice win 20 games and earned the opportunity to cut his teeth at perennial power Wake Forest the following year as a graduate assistant. His first full-time coaching position at Division I came at UNC-Wilmington from 1990-92 and he laid the foundation for his job at Missouri with a three-year stop at Texas A&M from 1992-95, which included helping the Aggies reach postseason play in 1994.

A remarkable 21-win campaign during his one season at Penn State (1995-96) allowed the Nittany Lions to reach the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 31 years, and he returned to Texas A&M and the Big 12 Conference for one season as the Aggies' Associate Head Coach in 1996-97 before returning to Wake Forest from 1997-98. The Demon Deacons reached postseason play each of his four years in Winston-Salem, including winning the NIT Championship in 2000 and reaching NCAA Tournament play in 2001.

Haith parlayed that success at Wake Forest into an opportunity at the University of Texas. Coaching alongside friend and mentor Rick Barnes, Haith was a part of (at the time) the winningest three-year stretch of basketball in Texas history. The Longhorns averaged better than 24 wins per season and never failed to reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns advanced to the Final Four in 2003 and Haith worked magic on the recruiting trail, ushering four McDonald's All-Americans to Austin, including Brad Buckman (2002), LaMarcus Aldridge (2004), Daniel Gibson (2004) and Michael Williams (2004). Aldridge and Gibson are now mainstays in the NBA, with Aldridge being drafted No. 2 overall to the Chicago Bulls. The Class was rated No. 2 nationally by Rivals.com and Haith was the nation's hottest young coach. So began the daunting reclamation project at Miami, which concluded with an average of 21 wins over his last three years, national rankings in three of his final four campaigns and three of the school's six (all-time) 20-win ledgers.

One of 10 siblings, family will always be first for Frank Haith, and his student-athletes are part of that family. A proud father and husband, Frank and his wife Pam are the parents of two children, Corey and Brianna. Frank and Pam met in high school, began dating a short time after and have been together for 27 years. The Haith family has been active participants in their home community and spearheaded fundraising and renovation efforts for Morningside Park in Elon, N.C., in the neighborhood in which Haith grew up.
