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toys at the Mizzou Arena gates. Fans will be allowed to donate a new or slightly used toy and receive a coupon for one free admission to the game. All donations go to the Toys For Tots program.

The Salukis, like the Tigers, have been off from competition since last weekend, when they broke a three-game losing streak with a 75-59 win over South Dakota State. Sunday's game will continue SIU's early-season schedule pattern of being on the road for every other game to date; Southern in 1-2 on the road so far this season.

Southern Illinois is led in scoring by 6-foot-1 junior forward **Carlai Moore**, who is averaging 16.4 points per game. Moore is one of three transfers – all among SIU's top three scorers – who joined second-year Head Coach Dana Eikenberg from UMKC; all three are in their first season at SIU.

Cindy Stein will see a familiar face across the scorer's table; she and Eikenberg worked together for two seasons at Illinois in the mid-1990's (1993-95).

Every Mizzou player posted a rebound, and for the fifth time in the last six games five Tigers scored in double figures, as Mizzou won its sixth straight Sunday in an 88-34 decision over Nicholls State. The winning streak ties the longest of Cindy Stein's eight-year tenure in Columbia. ***For more on the game, refer to the recap and box score on page 12.***

Last Sunday's win over Nicholls State was about as complete a win as possible. Ten of MU's 14 players either tied or set a season or career-high mark; in all, 19 different individual career or season-high marks were set, and another 15 were tied. Among the notable achievements:

- ▶ **Tamika Jackson**, who sank her first field goal as a Tiger on a baby hook with 5:25 left in the first half, had a monster game with 11 points and eight rebounds in just 15 minutes of action;
- ▶ **K-Kay Pickens** hit her first two field goals – both of them 3-pointers – as a Tiger. She finished with six points and two rebounds and played the final four minutes of the game;
- ▶ With seven assists, **Tiffany Brooks** dished out more than double her previous career high; she had three assists on six different occasions over the last two years. Brooks also had a career-high eight rebounds.

(NOT) TURNING OVER A NEW LEAF?

Mizzou did its best job of ball-handling, by far, in years against Nicholls State. The Tigers had 26 assists, which ties the third-highest total in the last six years.

To counter that, Mizzou had a ridiculously low six turnovers against the Lady Colonels. That's the fewest in a single game in at least the last six years; in fact, the Tigers have had single-digit turnovers just four previous times in that span.

TIGERS STREAKING IN A GOOD WAY

As mentioned earlier, Mizzou is on a six-game winning streak, which ties the longest span of Cindy Stein's eight years in Columbia.

You have to go back to the 1999-2000 season to find the last winning streak that is longer; Mizzou won the last nine games of the non-conference schedule before starting Big 12 play. Not to look ahead, but the Tigers could match that feat with wins on Sunday, and later against Alabama State and Western Michigan before the Big 12 Conference schedule opens on Jan. 4 against defending NCAA National Champion Baylor.

BOND... LATOYA BOND!

This may be the biggest case of "burying the lede" in these notes in my four years here, but senior guard **LaToya Bond** has done a heck of a job quarterbacking the Tigers this season.

Bond has scored in double figures in each of Mizzou's nine game this season. She was held to a season-low 11 points on Sunday against Nicholls State, but that wasn't the big news to come out of the three-year starter's stat sheet. Bond also had a season-high seven rebounds, and a near-career-high eight assists, to come this close to a triple-double.

Bond already has two tournament MVP awards under her belt this season, and is Mizzou's leading scorer at 16.4 points per game. She has a Big 12 Conference-leading 3.22 steals per game, and is among the Big 12 leaders in seven different categories, including – at 5-foot-10 – blocks!

LIKE A GOOD TEAM, MIZZOU IS THERE

With apologies to Tiger Classic sponsor State Farm and Barry Manilow, composer of the insurance company's "Like a Good Neighbor" jingle, the Tigers were indeed a good team Dec. 2-3 in picking up their 19th Tiger Classic title in the 28 years of the winter tournament.

week, and senior center **Christelle N'Garsanet** and junior forward **Carlynn Savant** earned spots on the all-tournament team. It is the third all-tourney nod of N'Garsanet's career, while Savant picked up her second. Bond earned her fourth all-tournament team honor, including her second this season.

CHRISTELLE HAS A GOOD REASON TO MISS PRACTICE...

Senior center **Christelle N'Garsanet** did not start Mizzou's exhibition game vs. Missouri Southern on Nov. 5 because she missed a pair of practices in the week leading up to the game. Often, that is cause for concern, yet N'Garsanet's absences were certainly excused, and even welcomed: The accounting major from Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire, was in St. Louis for a job interview with a Big Four accounting firm.

Mizzou's most-improved player a year ago, N'Garsanet has been the Tigers' pre-sense in the paint for the last two seasons. She is currently MU's second-leading scorer and rebounder, averaging 12.7 points and 7.2 boards a game. She also is tied for the team lead in blocks (13).

SAVANT GOES OFF FOR CAREER GAME; FIRST ALL-TOURNEY SPOT

Junior forward **Carlynn Savant** had a career-high 19 points last Saturday night vs. Murray State in the State Farm Tiger Classic title match. She was 6-of-9 from the field, 2-of-4 on 3-pointers, and made all five of her free throws to top her previous best of 16 points set the previous Tuesday vs. Northwestern. For her efforts, she was named to the all-tournament team.

For the season, Savant is third on the squad in both scoring (10.0 ppg) and rebounding (5.4 rpg).

HOME SWEET HOME

The Tigers played five of their first six games on the road, and have fared relatively well away from Mizzou Arena this season, winning both of their neutral-site games, and going 1-2 on the road. They have started to regain a measure of dominance at home, where the Tigers were 5-8 in the inaugural season at Mizzou Arena.

This weekend's game is part of a school record-tying eight-game homestand that will extend into the second week of January; Mizzou does not hit the road again until a January 11 contest at Nebraska. The other time the Tigers had such a long homestand came in the 1991-92 season; Mizzou was 7-1 in that stretch – the loss came to Iowa in the championship of the Mid-America Classic (now the State Farm Tiger Classic) – and finished the season 16-12.

Conversely, the Tigers are second in the league in 3-point shooting themselves, averaging 36.2 percent per game.

After holding Nicholls State to a paltry 34 points, Mizzou is now holding opponents to an average of 57.0 points per game; that's also second in the league only to Kansas State's 56.6 ppg.

Members of Mizzou's Valley of the Sun alumni chapter banded together to raise funds to build a library for the school, and three representatives of the alumni chapter joined the team at Tertulia Thursday morning.

FOUR SIGN NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT FOR 2006-07 SEASON

Four standout prepsters have signed National Letters of Intent to enroll at the University of Missouri and play basketball, Head Coach Cindy Stein announced in mid-November.

The four are 5-foot-11 forward **Amanda Hanneman** (Blue Springs, Mo. / Blue Springs South HS), 6-foot-1 forward **Jessra Johnson** (Fayette, Mo. / Fayette HS), 5-foot-6 guard **Antoinette "Toy" Richbow** (Detroit, Mich. / Pershing HS) and 6-foot-2 forward **Marissa Scott** (Iola, Kan. / Iola HS).

As a sophomore and junior at Blue Springs South under former assistant and current head coach Adam Courter, **Hanneman** earned all-conference and Blue Springs Examiner all-area honors, and helped the Jaguars to district titles as a freshman and sophomore. She enters her senior season with career averages of 15.4 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. Hanneman led South to Class 2 state titles in golf as a sophomore and junior, and helped the Jaguars to a runner-up finish this year. She's a two-time all-state honoree, and earned all-district and all-conference plaudits all four years as a golf prepster.

Johnson is a three-time Lewis and Clark Conference Most Valuable Player for the Fayette Falcons. She's twice earned all-state honors from the Missouri Basketball Coaches Association – in Class 3 as a junior, and Class 2 as a sophomore. Under coach Kristen Conrow, Johnson led the Falcons to the Class 2 quarterfinals in 2003 and 2004. Last season, current freshman Rachel Oswald's Boonville Pirates eliminated Fayette in their Class 3 district championship. For her high-school career, Johnson is averaging 17.5 points, 10.9 rebounds and five blocks per game.

Richbow helped lead Pershing to a 17-1 record and a Detroit city championship last year under coach Gerald Weatherspoon. She averaged 12 points, five rebounds, four assists and four steals last year in earning first team all-city honors. She also led the Doughgirls to a district title as a sophomore.

Scott earned Kansas Class 4A honorable mention all-state honors as a junior last year at Iola for coach Becky Carlson. The Fillies finished fourth in the state her freshman year, and were sub-state champions a year ago. A talented multi-sport athlete, Scott led her volleyball team in kills as a sophomore, and led the squad to a conference title this year. She also is Iola's record holder in the javelin throw, which she did as a sophomore.

WOMEN PICKED 10TH BY BIG 12 COACHES

The Missouri women's basketball team has been picked to finish 10th in the Big 12 Conference in a polling of the league's coaches, Big 12 officials announced on Oct. 13.

Mizzou, which returns all five starters from last season's 11-18 squad, accumulated 37 voting points from the 11 other coaches – coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams – in being picked between Iowa State and Oklahoma State.

The preseason poll has traditionally underestimated the Tigers' success, as MU

has finished at or above its selected position in all but one of the eight previous polls (no poll was conducted in 1996-97, the first year of the league); that came last year, when an eighth-place prediction ended in a tie for ninth place on the court. Five of the eight times have resulted in the Tigers improving upon their predicted finish.

“Obviously, I would prefer for us to be in a position with the target on our backs. If everyone wants to believe the polls, which have only been correct a couple times, so be it,” said Head Coach Cindy Stein. “I can promise our fans that the Missouri women’s basketball team will be very competitive in our league and will be an exciting team to watch. You don’t want to miss out watching us this year – that, I can promise.”

WOMEN’S BASKETBALL CLEANS UP MIZZOU ARENA

The women’s basketball team took time out from their strength and conditioning testing and workouts on Aug. 31, to help spruce up the grounds surrounding Mizzou Arena.

Done in conjunction with the women’s basketball’s 2005-06 theme of “TEAM MIZZOU”, the team pulled weeds and trimmed the sidewalks of Mizzou Arena – their year-old basketball mecca – as a show of pride. At the conclusion of the afternoon, a small tree was planted on the northwest corner of the grounds.

NEW ASSISTANTS JOIN TIGER FAMILY

Matt Daniel and Kerensa Barr are Mizzou’s new assistant women’s basketball coaches, and Evan Unrau is the program’s new graduate assistant.

A former assistant at Colorado under legendary former head coach Ceal Barry, Daniel will work with the Tiger post players during practice, and will oversee scheduling, game preparation and scouting, while assisting with recruiting.

One of the best guards in Mizzou history, Barr will work with the Tiger guards during practice. Her promotion comes after serving last year as a graduate assistant.

Barr finished a stellar four-year career in 2003 as the Tigers’ all-time leader in assists (489) and free-throw percentage (.812). She also finished in Mizzou’s career top 10 in steals (242, second) and 3-pointers (109, third - she is currently fourth), and is currently 17th all-time in scoring with 1,161 points. Barr is also listed in the season top-10 charts 11 times in five different categories, including posting the top two free-throw-shooting seasons in Mizzou history; she made 88.5 percent of her charity tosses in 2001-02. She was a two-time honorable mention All-Big 12 player.

Unrau, who returned from a successful professional stint in Europe this past winter, will assist the coaching staff with video editing, film exchange, as well as camps and clinics. She earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 2004 after back-to-back First Team All-Big 12 nods – MU’s first back-to-back all-conference performer since MU Hall of Famer Renee Kelly in 1985-86. Unrau’s name appears in Mizzou’s career and season record books no fewer than 15 times.

In the first neutral-site game of the 2005-06 women's college basketball season, Mizzou had four players score in double figures, including a game-high 17 from **Christelle N'Garsanet**. N'Garsanet added 10 rebounds and was joined in the double-double club by **Eetisha Riddle** and **Carlynn Savant**. Riddle had 14 points and a game-high 13 rebounds, while Savant added 10 points and 12 boards.

Carrie Frist, Clemson's 6-foot-4 center, played prominently in the first three minutes of the game. She hit three of her first four field-goal attempts in helping build an 8-2 lead for Clemson, yet also picked up three fouls — including one when a substitute was waiting to come in for her — just 2:49 into the game.

Mizzou continued to crash the boards in the first half, getting 14 second-chance points. The Tigers took their first lead of the game, at 18-17, on a **Tiffany Brooks** jumper with 8:41 left in the half. Clemson was plagued with foul trouble, yet Mizou couldn't take advantage with an unfathomable 6-of-22 shooting performance from the free-throw line in the half.

MU began to pull away late in the first half. On the final possession before the final media timeout, Mizzou used good ball movement to find **Kassie Drew** in the corner for a 3-pointer to put the Tigers up 31-21. Drew hit another trey from around 25 feet on the left wing a couple of minutes later to cap a 16-0 run, and Mizzou took a 41-29 halftime lead.

After Clemson got two quick baskets to start the second half, Frist was sent to the bench again after picking up her fourth foul just 1:12 into play. MU once again went to work inside, getting its next 10 points on post moves, fastbreaks or putbacks.

Clemson had its own 9-0 run to move within 51-44 with 10:57 to play. Adrienne Bradshaw had five of those points, yet Mizzou broke that run with a layup from N'Garsanet. **LaToya Bond** drove the right baseline on a backdoor screen for a layup, and the next time down the floor, N'Garsanet pulled down her 10th rebound for her double-double. Mizzou went on an 18-5 run over the next 6:29, though, to push the lead to 20 points.

Christelle N'Garsanet added 13 points and a game-high nine rebounds; both she and Bond were named to the all-tournament team. **Kristen Kovesdy** led the Sun Devils (2-0) with 16 points.

The game started at a frenetic pace, with both teams choosing to push the ball up the floor. Arizona State got four inside buckets, and held an 8-6 lead after the first media timeout just 4 minutes, 18 seconds into the game. The Tigers took their first lead of the game, at 10-8, with 13:38 left in the half on a drive to the basket by **EETisha Riddle**. The teams went back and forth over the next several minutes, and the score was tied at 12 at the second media timeout with 11:44 left.

Arizona State continued to apply pressure to Mizzou's defense, and rarely took enough time off the shot clock to use a set offense. Instead, transition baskets allowed the Sun Devils to get fastbreak points in the first half and use a short 5-0 to create some distance. Yet the Tigers stuck with the Sun Devils, sitting in just a three-point deficit (19-16) with 7:54 left. With Riddle and N'Garsanet on the bench in foul trouble, the Tigers did an excellent job staying in the game against a formidable inside presence by the Sun Devils. There was a stretch late in the first half where **Carlynn Savant** was the tallest Tiger on the floor against an ASU frontcourt that averaged 6-foot-4.

Tamika Jackson drew Mizou's first charge of the season with just over two minutes left in the half, yet ASU got a pair of Jill Noe free throws and a putback from Kristen Kovetsy to cap a 6-0 run. A layup by Bond completed the first-half scoring and sent the Tigers into the locker room with a seven-point deficit (29-22).

Arizona State continued to slowly extend its lead, moving it to nine points (35-29) at the first media timeout of the second half. Danielle Orsillo immediately pushed it to 11 with a pair of free throws coming out of the break, and Amy Denson stole the ball at midcourt and went in for a layup for a 39-26 lead with 14:28 remaining. Despite a pair of N'Garsanet steals, ASU pushed its lead to 14 with 11:51 left on a Briann January jumper.

The Tigers still played staunch defense, getting four steals in the middle of the half. Savant got a 3-point play to start an 11-5 run. After an ASU 3-pointer, the Tigers drew within single digits (57-49 with 2:49 left) for the first time in over 12 minutes on a Bond 3-pointer, and a crossing drive through the lane the next time down.

Arkansas State 70, Mizzou 67

November 19, 2005 – Convocation Center

JONESBORO, Ark. – Arkansas State put the Missouri women in an early hole, and got key rebounds in the closing moments to stave off a Tiger comeback attempt in posting a 70-67 win Saturday night at the ASU Convocation Center.

Tiffany Brooks led the Tigers (1-2) with 15 points, **LaToya Bond** added 13 points and five steals, and **Carlynn Savant** finished with 12 points and eight rebounds. Adrianne Davie had a game-high 17 points and 11 rebounds for Arkansas State (1-0).

The Tigers got the first basket of the game on a drive from Brooks. But the Lady Indians used 8-0 and 11-0 runs to surge to a 21-6 lead just 6 minutes, 41 seconds into the game. ASU made its first six shots, and 10 of its first 12 in boosting its lead to 26-10 with 11:04 left in the first half.

After both teams traded baskets, Amber Abraham hit her third 3-pointer of the half to extend ASU's lead to 19 (31-12). A series of free throws from the teams brought the Lady Indian lead over 20 (35-14) a few minutes later before the Tigers finally started hitting their shots. A quick 9-0 run, capped by an **Eetisha Riddle** jumper, brought Mizzou to within 12 (35-23) with 3:05 to play.

While the Tigers were improving on the offensive end, they also turned up the intensity on defense, holding ASU without a field goal for a span of 8:21. The Indians went into the locker room with a 41-25 lead at the half.

Mizzou made three of its first four shots coming out of the break, including a Savant 3-pointer on the fastbreak, and closed the deficit to 47-35 after the first media timeout. Sophomore Kassie Drew (Anna, Ill. / Anna-Jonesboro HS) banked in a 3-pointer from the right corner to pull Mizzou within 10 (49-39) before ASU went on a quick 5-0 run.

The Tigers stormed back, though, buoyed by a 3-point play from **Blair Hardiek**. She finished a 17-6 run with a pair of runners through the lane to pull Mizzou within four at 60-56 with 4:53 left.

Kelsey Lock ended an 8:46 field-goal drought with a pair of buckets, then Rudy Sims stole a crossing pass and went coast-to-coast for a 66-58 lead with 2:25 left. That allowed the Lady Indians some breathing room after the Tigers missed several 3-point attempts and ASU made five free throws down the stretch.

Mizzou 87, Northwestern 64

November 22, 2005 – Mizzou Arena

COLUMBIA, Mo. – The University of Missouri women's basketball team found the win column in emphatic fashion, as a 37-5 run near the start of the contest helped the Tigers defeat Northwestern University 87-64 and even their overall record at 2-2 on the year.

For the first time since a 70-65 overtime win at Nebraska last season, all five Tiger starters reached double figures, led by **LaToya Bond**. She poured in a game-high 19 points on 5-of-7 shooting and went a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line to go with her second-straight five-steal game.

Carlynn Savant added 16 points thanks to a 4-of-6 shooting night from three-point range, while **Tiffany Brooks** and **Eetisha Riddle** each contributed 12. **Christelle N'Garsanet** rounded out the double-digit scorers for Mizzou, pouring in 11.

A.J. Glasauer and Ifeoma Okonkwo led the Wildcats (1-1) with 16 points apiece.

Although the Tigers were solid from the floor (27-of-61, 44.3 percent) and outstanding from beyond the arc (8-of-17, 47.1) it was Mizzou's defensive pressure that dictated the outcome in this contest. Missouri scored a remarkable 23 points off Wildcat turnovers in the opening stanza, culminating with its largest lead of the game, 37-7, at the 6:10 mark.

Down 2-0 following a Glasauer put-back, Mizzou rattled off the next 11 tallies to seize control. Savant initiated the burst with her first of three treys in the opening period to give the Tigers a lead they wouldn't relinquish. An N'Garsanet free throw and four consecutive Bond points segued to a second Savant triple as the Tigers forged in front 11-2.

The two clubs then traded buckets to keep the Missouri advantage at 10 (17-7), but 20-0 MU surge over the ensuing 5:46 helped the hosts pull away for good. Northwestern missed all eight of its field goal attempts and committed eight of its 15 first-half turnovers during the rally, which Mizzou promptly converted into 12 points.

Missouri remained in control throughout the final period despite an improved offensive effort from the Wildcats. After Missouri's pressure held Northwestern to just 28.6 percent shooting (8-of-28) in the opening half, the Wildcats improved to a 51.6 percent success rate from the floor (16-of-31), yet managed to slice Mizzou's lead below 20 points on just one occasion (74-55 at 4:10).

The Tigers built their lead to as many as 29 in the second half after carrying a 46-21 lead into the halftime break. Bond scored 12 of her 19 points over the final 20 minutes to keep Northwestern at arms length and hand the hosts their sixth consecutive home-opening victory.

Mizzou 69, Pittsburgh 60**Pittsburgh Thanksgiving Classic****November 27, 2005 – Petersen Events Center**

PITTSBURGH, Pa. – LaToya Bond earned Most Valuable Player honors in leading the Mizzou women to their first tournament title on the road in six years, a 69-60 decision over the host Panthers in the final of Sunday's Pittsburgh Thanksgiving Classic.

Bond had 14 points, five rebounds, three steals, and game highs of five assists and four blocks to lead five Tigers in double-figure scoring. **Christelle N'Garsanet** led Mizzou with 18 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her fifth career double-double; **Tiffany Brooks** added 11 points, six rebounds, two assists and two blocks; **EeTisha Riddle** had 10 points and six rebounds, and **Blair Hardiek** tied her career high with 10 points.

N'Garsanet and Riddle joined Bond on the all-tournament team.

Both teams made their first three shots of the game, and a 3-pointer by Maddy Brown gave Pitt a 7-6 lead just 1 minute, 44 seconds into the game. Both teams also cooled from there, however, missing their next seven shots combined.

Pitt (4-1) regained its shooting touch and extended its lead to 19-9 on a Mallorie Winn 3-pointer with 12:54 to play in the half. The Panther lead remained 10 at 26-16 with 7:02 left at the under-eight media timeout before the Tigers made a short run. Three straight baskets from N'Garsanet brought Mizzou within five at 30-25 with 4:16 to play. Brooks completed a 16-9 run with a 19-footer from near the top of the key to trim the deficit to three (35-32), and Pitt took a 37-32 lead into the locker room.

Mizzou hit its first three shots of the second half, capped by a Brooks jumper, to give the Tigers a 38-37 lead with 18:17 left to play. Missouri continued to push the tempo, and got an N'Garsanet basket on the fast break to go with a coast-to-coast steal and layup from Bond to push the lead to 42-39 with 15:47 to go.

Midway through the half, the Tigers ratcheted up their defense, forcing a shot-clock violation and getting a Bond steal that led to a fast break layup for Hardiek. Earlier in that sequence, N'Garsanet drew Marcedes Walker's fourth foul to force Pitt's post presence to the bench. With the Tigers clinging to a seven-point lead, Walker fouled out on a fight for a rebound with 3:42 left. Pitt would get no closer than four the rest of the way, as Mizzou made six of their 10 free throws down the stretch.

NOTES: Mizzou's previous tournament win on the road came at the San Diego State Tournament in 1999, when the Tigers defeated Portland State and San Diego State. . . . Sunday's win is the second in less than a week in which five Tigers scored in double figures. All five starters did so in Tuesday's win over Northwestern in Columbia. . . . The Tigers were Pittsburgh's first opponent to score 50 points this season.

Mizzou 79, Arkansas-Pine Bluff 51**State Farm Tiger Classic – First Round****December 2, 2005 – Mizzou Arena**

COLUMBIA, Mo. – Christelle N'Garsanet led five Mizzou women in double-figure scoring, helping the Tigers to a 79-51 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the opening game of the 28th annual State Farm Tiger Classic. In continuing their streak on Friday night of winning their first-round match of every single Tiger Classic, Mizzou will face Murray State on Saturday.

N'Garsanet had a game-high 17 points, while **EeTisha Riddle** posted her third career double-double with 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. **LaToya Bond** went 8-of-9 from the free-throw line in her 14-point night for their Tigers (5-2), who have won four in a row.

Blair Hardiek, making her first start of the season, had a career-high 12 points; **Tiffany Brooks**, whom Hardiek replaced, matched that total. Arica Green led UAPB (0-4) with 13 points.

Both teams had trouble establishing themselves in the first several minutes. UAPB turned the ball over on their first four possessions, while the Tigers missed their first five shots. LaToya Thomas made the game's first basket on a jumper two minutes and 35 seconds into the game, though, and Bond converted a 3-point play on a contested layup the next time down the floor.

Despite clinging to an 11-9 lead, the Tigers were having problems both on offense (36 percent shooting) and the boards, as they were out-rebounded by a 10-5 margin. Yet on the next series, Mizzou got four straight offensive rebounds, culminating in a putback by **Carlynn Savant** for a 13-9 lead with 11:00 to go.

Mizzou went on a short run to boost its lead to seven (20-13), yet was still plagued by poor shooting. The Tigers finished the half just 8-of-27 (29.6 percent), and only better-than-normal free-throw shooting – Mizzou made 63.6 percent of its 22 trips to the line – gave them a 29-24 halftime lead.

The shooting was better in the second half, but more importantly, the Tigers did a better job of sharing the ball; Mizzou got assists on eight of their first 10 second-half buckets. Mizzou 100, Murray State 55**State Farm Tiger Classic – Championship****December 3, 2005 – Mizzou Arena**

COLUMBIA, Mo. – LaToya Bond had a game-high 20 points, and again led five Tigers in double-figure scoring, to guide the Mizzou women to a 100-55 win over Murray State on Saturday in the championship game of the 28th annual State Farm Tiger Classic. For her efforts, Bond was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player for the second time in as many weeks.

It is Mizzou's largest margin of victory, and first time in triple-digit scoring, since a 103-41 win over Alcorn State in the semifinals of the 2003 Tiger Classic. The Lady Braves captured third place in this year's tournament earlier Saturday evening, besting fellow SWAC foe Arkansas-Pine Bluff by a 56-51 count. It is the 19th time that the Tigers have won their own tournament.

Bond was joined on the all-tournament team by **Carlynn Savant**, who had a career-high 19 points in the title game, and **Christelle N'Garsanet**, who had 10 points and seven rebounds.

The game was virtually decided in the game's first 10 minutes, as the Tigers (6-2), who have won five in a row, held Murray State to single digits in scoring until a Paige Guffey 3-pointer with 9:11 left in the half made it 29-11. That was the first point in the game that the Racers had outscored Bond, who had a pair of 3-pointers in the opening minutes and slashed through the lane for a layup and her eighth point before the first media timeout.

Mizzou was an equal-opportunity team on Saturday; nine Tigers played at least 13 minutes, and all of them scored at least five points. The Tigers posted season highs in assists (21) and 3-pointers (12), and committed a season-low 13 turnovers.

Ashley Brooke Hayes led the Lady Racers had a team-high 15 points, while Ashley Nichole Hayes had a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

COLUMBIA, Mo. – Every Mizzou player posted a rebound, and for the fifth time in the last six games five Tigers scored in double figures, as Mizzou won its sixth straight Sunday in an 88-34 decision over Nicholls State. The winning streak ties the longest of Cindy Stein's eight-year tenure in Columbia.

EeTisha Riddle led all scorers with 15 points, yet every Tiger contributed in holding the Lady Colonels to the 10th-lowest scoring output in Mizzou history. It's also the fewest points an opponent has had against Mizzou (7-2) since 1999, when Centenary scored 31.

LaToya Bond flirted with a triple-double with her 11 points, game-high eight assists and seven rebounds in 22 minutes of action. **Tiffany Brooks** added career highs of eight rebounds and seven assists to go with four points; they led a Tiger offense that had a season-high 26 assists against just six turnovers.

Tamika Jackson came off the bench and nearly had a double-double of her own, as she had season-highs of 11 points and eight rebounds in just 15 minutes of action. No Tiger played more than 22 minutes, but eight played 17 or more. In all, 19 different individual career or season-high marks were set, and another 15 were tied.

Jamie Octave led Nicholls State (1-5) with 11 points. Mizzou scored the first 14 points of the game, and held Nicholls State without a field goal until Jamie Octave's 3-pointer with 13 minutes, 59 seconds remained in the first half. A 3-point play from Katherine Plummer brought the Lady Colonels within single digits (18-9) for the first time since the start of the game, yet the Tigers quickly pushed the lead back to double digits.

As a measure of their dominance inside, Mizzou had already scored 18 points in the paint before NSU scored their first, on a Tarin Seely layup, with 9:07 left in the half. By that point, the Tigers had a 26-13 lead, and had made 45 percent of their shots while holding Nicholls State to just 32 percent.

Carlynn Savant, on the flip side, made each of her first four shots – including a pair of 3-pointers – in hitting double figures in scoring in the first 13 minutes of the game. She finished with 12 on 5-of-6 shooting.

Bond and Riddle joined Savant in double-figure scoring within 90 seconds of the start of the second half, which MU began with a 49-21 lead.
