



## **Mizzou Men's Basketball Post Game Notes vs. Utah**

**Mizzou Arena - Columbia, Mo.**

**Final Score: Mizzou 83, Utah 75**

### **TEAM**

- Mizzou claimed their first victory over Utah in school history, making the series 3-1 in favor of the Utes. The game was the first of the series played in Columbia.
- Saturday afternoon was the Tigers' third straight victory over a PAC-12 team, including last season's neutral site victory over Oregon. Mizzou hasn't lost to a PAC-12 team since falling to Utah on Nov. 16, 2017 in Salt Lake City.
- Mizzou won the rebounding battle 41-33, advancing to 6-1 on the season when out rebounding their opponent.
- The Tigers had just six turnovers, tied for the fewest under head coach Cuonzo Martin. The last time Mizzou had less than six was March 21, 2013.
- Saturday marks Mizzou's second win this season after trailing at halftime.
- Mizzou is 4-1 this season in games following a loss.
- The game featured 21 ties and 11 lead changes.
- Mizzou continued to dominate inside, outscoring the Utes inside the paint.
- The Tigers bench came up big, contributing 39 points as every player who came off the bench scored a field goal.

### **INDIVIDUAL**

- Anton Brookshire and Trevon Brazile made their first collegiate starts.
- Kobe Brown (27), Amari Davis (17), Javon Pickett (12), and Ronnie DeGray (10) scored in double digits, marking the 30th consecutive game in which multiple Tigers scored in double figures.
- This also marked the fifth time this season four or more Tigers have scored in double figures.
- Kobe Brown's 27 points on the day set a new career high, as well as marking the fourth time he has surpassed 20 points in a game, and fifth in his career.
- Kobe also set a new career high in free throws, going 11-for-13 from the charity stripe.
- Every Tiger that saw action in today's game snagged a rebound.
- Yaya Keita's five rebounds are a new career high.
