RANKED TIGERS HIT THE ROAD FOR SHOWDOWN VS. HUSKERS

The Mizzou women's basketball team (12-2, 2-0 Big 12), ranked 24th in the country and riding an 11-game winning streak, hits the road for the first time in seven weeks on Wednesday when the Tigers travel to Lincoln, Neb., and a matchup against Nebraska (10-3, 2-0).

First place in the Big 12 is on the line, as both teams registered a pair of solid wins in the opening week of league play. In addition to its overall winning streak, Mizzou is looking to keep a second streak alive on Wednesday: The Tigers have won the last five meetings in Lincoln. Included in those are a pair of nailbiters in the last two matchups: a 78-76 win in 2004 in which then-freshman **EeTisha Riddle** sank a back-door layup with 10 seconds left, and a 70-65 overtime win last year.

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QUICK HITS: NOTES ON THE RUN

MIZZOU NOTABLES

- ▶ The Tigers are riding an 11-game winning streak, Mizzou's longest since a school-record 13-game streak in the 1984-85 season.
- ▶ The 11-game winning streak is also the fifth-longest in the country at the moment.
- ▶ No. 4 Baylor was the second-highest-ranked opponent that Mizzou has ever beaten. The Tigers defeated No. 3 Colorado in the 1994 Big Eight Tournament Championship game.
- ▶ At 12-2, Mizzou has its best start in school history after 14 games, matching the start by five other Tiger squads.
- ▶ In six of the last 11 games (all MU wins), five Tigers have scored in double figures. Mizzou had one such game all of last year.
- ▶ Mizzou has a pair of regular-season tournament titles under its belt: the Pittsburgh Thanksgiving Classic (defeated Towson and Pitt) and the State Farm Tiger Classic (Arkansas-Pine Bluff and Murray State).
- ▶ The title at Pitt was Mizzou's first tournament championship away from Columbia since 1999.

PLAYER NOTABLES

- ▶ Senior G **LaToya Bond** is fifth in the Big 12 in scoring (18.4 ppg), leads the league in steals (3.0 spg) and is ranked in a total of nine different categories. She scored a Mizzou Arena-record 34 points against Western Michigan on Dec. 29 in the Tigers' non-conference finale.
- ▶ Senior C **Christelle N'Garsanet** leads the Tigers in rebounding (7.7 rpg) and is second in scoring (12.1 ppg). She has four double-doubles this season, including two in the last five games.
- ▶ Junior F **Carlynn Savant** has scored in double figures in eight of MU's 14 games, and is averaging 10.6 points per game (third on team).
- ▶ Junior F **EeTisha Riddle** is just shy of giving Mizzou four players in double-figure scoring for the season (9.8 ppg); she has four double-doubles herself on the year, including two in a row.
- ▶ N'Garsanet and Riddle give Mizzou two players with at least four double-doubles this year; only Iowa State can make the same claim.

FROM RANK TO RANKED: THE 2005-06 MISSOURI TIGERS

OK, so it isn't very catchy, and since last year's team that went 11-18 is essentially the same squad that is now in the Associated Press Top 25, "rank" might not be appropriate, either, but one thing is certain: Mizzou is in the AP Top 25 for the first time since the 1984-85 season.

Close followers of the Tigers vividly recall the 2001 NCAA Sweet Sixteen squad and might wonder why that team wasn't ranked. It had more to do with the relative strength of the Big 12 – Mizzou was fifth in the league that year – and the fact that the final AP poll is released at the conclusion of the regular season, before the Tigers' deep run in the NCAA Tournament occurred.

Mizzou was ranked 19th in the final coaches' poll of 2001; the Tigers received the 28th-highest total of votes on Tuesday.

BOND NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior guard **LaToya Bond** was named Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week by a media voting panel for games played from Jan. 3-8. It is the first conference weekly award for Bond, who became the first Mizzou player to win the award since current Mizzou Coordinator of Basketball Operations **Tracy Franklin** in 2001.

Bond went over the 20-point mark in each of Mizzou's wins last week while directing the Tigers to a 2-0 conference start for the first time since 1992-93. She started the week with a team-high 21 points as MU upset Baylor and ended the Lady Bears' 30-game winning streak. She played all 40 minutes, shooting 7-of-15 from the field while adding three assists, two blocks, two steals and four rebounds. The Urbana, Ill., native added a game-high 20 points, going 7-of-8 from the field, making her only 3-point attempt, and also hitting all five of her free throws, in just 27 minutes on Saturday. The victory snapped a nine-game losing streak against Kansas State and improved Mizzou's winning streak to 11 games (fifth-best in the nation). Last Saturday's game was her sixth 20-point scoring effort of the year.

TIGERS STREAKING (IN A GOOD WAY!)

As mentioned earlier, Mizzou is on an 11-game winning streak, which is the longest since Mizzou's school-record 13-game winning streak in 1984-85 (see box at right). **Mizzou's 12-2 start is the best in school history through 14 games; it matches the starts by five previous teams (1976-77, 1977-78, 1982-83, 1983-84 and 1992-93).**

Mizzou's 11-game winning streak is currently the fifth-longest in the country, behind only Tennessee, Duke, North Carolina and LSU.

TIGERS EXCEED LAST YEAR'S WIN TOTAL

Of all the measures of the success of this year's team, the most compelling might be this: With the win over Kansas State on Saturday, Mizzou bumped its win total to 12 this season; the Tigers had 11 wins all of last year (11-18, 4-12 Big 12).

LAST TIME OUT: MIZZOU 68, KANSAS STATE 42

EeTisha Riddle hit a clutch 3-pointer down the stretch, and then a clinching free throw with three seconds left, as the University of Missouri women's basketball team ended defending NCAA National Champion Baylor's 30-game winning streak with a 64-61 win Wednesday night at Mizzou Arena. **For more on the game, refer to the recap and box score on page 15.**

SCOUTING NEBRASKA

The Huskers (10-3, 2-0) have an eight-game winning streak of their own, second only to Mizzou's 11 games among Big 12 schools. Nebraska started off Big 12 play with an 18-point win over Colorado for NU's first win in Boulder since 1985, and followed up by handing previously unbeaten Kansas its first loss of the season on Saturday (73-61).

Nebraska has won six straight at home since a season-opening 68-49 loss to South Dakota State. The Huskers' only other losses this season have been to top-10 opponents: No. 3 LSU on Nov. 25 in Miami, and then-No. 10 Minnesota on Dec. 3 in Minneapolis.

Junior guard Kiera Hardy once again paces the NU offense, averaging a team-best 18.2 points per game. Freshman Kelsey Griffin is second on the squad in scoring 14.7 ppg) and leads the Huskers with 7.2 rebounds a game. She is the reigning Big 12 Rookie of the Week.

Nebraska has been playing all season without senior Jelena Spiric, the 2005 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, after she suffered a knee injury in practice on Oct. 18. Spiric averaged 9.3 points and 4.6 rebounds per game, and posted a double-double in NU's upset win over Baylor last season. She will be eligible to apply for a medical hardship and return for her senior season in 2006-07.

SERIES VS. THE HUSKERS

Nebraska leads the overall series, 32-27, yet the Tigers have won eight of the last 10 games in the series, including the last five in Lincoln.

The most useless stat of the series is that Mizzou is a perfect 5-0 against Nebraska when the Tigers are ranked; Missouri has not entered a game vs. the Huskers as a ranked opponent since Feb. 11, 1984, when Mizzou came away with a 106-78 win in Columbia.

BOND... LATOYA BOND!

With apologies to Ian Fleming, senior guard **LaToya Bond** has left opponents shaken this season and fans stirring in their seats.

She has led the Tiger offense to have five scorers in double figures six times over Mizzou's 11-game winning streak (after Mizzou did so just once last year). Bond has been a primary part of that success, scoring in double figures in each of Mizzou's 14 games this season, including seven times over 20 points.

The most recent example of that came in Saturday's win over Kansas State, when Bond had a team-high 20 points. She had a team-high 21 in Wednesday's upset win over the defending national champs, and poured in a Mizzou Arena-record 34 points the previous Thursday vs. Western Michigan. Bond had 27 of those points in a comeback second half in which she went 11-of-12 from the field, and made all four of her 3-point shots.

On Dec. 11 against Nicholls State, Bond countered a season-low 11 points to go with a season-high seven rebounds, and a near-career-high eight assists, to come this close to a triple-double.

Bond has two tournament MVP awards under her belt this season, and is Mizzou's leading scorer at 18.4 points per game (fifth in the Big 12). She has a Big 12 Conference-leading 3.0 steals per game, and is among the Big 12 leaders in nine different categories, including – at 5-foot-7 – blocks!

"RIDDLE" ME THIS: WHO CAN BEAT THE SHOT CLOCK?

It would be an understatement to say that junior forward **EeTisha Riddle** is not Mizzou's first option when it comes to 3-point shooting; she has made just seven (out of 37 attempts) in her three-year career, but none was more important than the one she swished home with 2:08 left in Wednesday's win over Baylor.

With the Tigers down 59-58, Carlynn Savant rebounded an errant Tiffany Brooks jumper, then fired the ball outside to Riddle, who let the ball go with two seconds left on the shot clock. Mizzou didn't relinquish the lead after the trey.

Riddle has been Mizzou's heart and soul on the defensive end. When she wasn't providing help coverage on All-American Sophia Young, Riddle was working on holding Baylor's Abiola Wabara under her season averages of 11.3 points and 6.5 rebounds per game (Wabara finished with nine points and five rebounds).

She earned all-tournament honors at the Pittsburgh Thanksgiving Tournament, averaging 7.0 points and 8.5 rebounds in Mizzou's two wins out east. For the season, Riddle is just shy of a double-figure scoring average, scoring 9.8 points per game (fourth on the team), and is second in rebounding (7.6 rpg).

CHRISTELLE HAS A GOOD REASON TO MISS PRACTICE...

Senior center **Christelle N'Garsanet** did not start Mizzou's exhibition game vs. Missouri Southern on Nov. 5 because she missed a pair of practices in the week leading up to the game. Often, that is cause for concern, yet N'Garsanet's absences were certainly excused, and even welcomed: The accounting major from Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire, was in St. Louis for a job interview with a Big Four accounting firm. She has already secured an internship for next summer.

Mizzou's most-improved player a year ago, N'Garsanet has been the Tigers' presence in the paint for the last two seasons. She is second on the team in scoring (12.1 ppg) and is MU's top rebounder (7.7 rpg). Like Riddle, N'Garsanet also has four double-doubles on the season.

SAVANT LEADS THE BIG 12 SHARPSHOOTERS

Junior forward **Carlynn Savant** is one of the key reasons that the Tigers are hitting on all cylinders offensively. On Dec. 18, she was 7-of-8 from the field, including a perfect 3-of-3 from 3-point range, in scoring 18 points vs. Southern Illinois.

Just two weeks earlier, Savant had a career-high 19 points vs. Murray State in the State Farm Tiger Classic title match. She was 6-of-9 from the field, 2-of-4 on 3-pointers, and made all five of her free throws to top her previous best of 16 points set the previous Tuesday vs. Northwestern. For her efforts, she was named to the all-tournament team.

For the season, Savant is third on the squad in both scoring (10.6 ppg) and rebounding (5.4 rpg). Savant leads the Big 12 Conference in 3-point field-goal percentage, as she is shooting 49.1 percent (28-of-57) from beyond the arc.

(NOT) TURNING OVER A NEW LEAF?

Mizzou did its best job of ball-handling, by far, in years against Nicholls State on Dec. 11. The Tigers had 26 assists, which ties the third-highest total in the last six years.

To counter that, Mizzou had a ridiculously low six turnovers against the Lady Colonels. That's the fewest in a single game in at least the last six years; in fact, the Tigers have had single-digit turnovers just four previous times in that span. For the season, Mizzou has a positive assist-to-turnover ratio (227-to-220). ***Mizzou has never had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio for a season; the closest came in 2003-04 (489-to-498, or 0.98-to-1).***

HOT-SHOOTING TIGERS SET BENCHMARK FOR THIS DECADE

Mizzou shot a sizzling 58.3 percent from the field Dec. 18 against Southern Illinois, hitting on 38 of its 65 shots. That's the best single-game shooting percentage in the last six years (box on page 2). It's the first time this season that the Tigers shot better than 50 percent in a game; Mizzou is fifth in the Big 12 in field-goal percentage this season at 45.3 percent.

The hot shooting began with a 55.9-percent first half, but the Tigers shot lights-out in the final 20 minutes by canning 19 of their 31 attempts for a whopping 61.3 percent.

LIKE A GOOD TEAM, MIZZOU IS THERE

With apologies to Tiger Classic sponsor State Farm and Barry Manilow, composer of the insurance company's "Like a Good Neighbor" jingle, the Tigers were indeed a good team Dec. 2-3 in picking up their 19th Tiger Classic title in the 28 years of the winter tournament.

Senior guard **LaToya Bond** was named tournament MVP for the second straight week, and senior center **Christelle N'Garsanet** and junior forward **Carlynn Savant** earned spots on the all-tournament team. It is the third all-tourney nod of N'Garsanet's career, while Savant picked up her second. Bond earned her fourth all-tournament team honor, including her second this season.

sophomore. She enters her senior season with career averages of 15.4 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. Hanneman led South to Class 2 state titles in golf as a sophomore and junior, and helped the Jaguars to a runner-up finish this year. She's a two-time all-state honoree, and earned all-district and all-conference plaudits all four years as a golf prepster.

Johnson is a three-time Lewis and Clark Conference Most Valuable Player for the Fayette Falcons. She's twice earned all-state honors from the Missouri Basketball Coaches Association – in Class 3 as a junior, and Class 2 as a sophomore. Under coach Kristen Conrow, Johnson led the Falcons to the Class 2 quarterfinals in 2003 and 2004. Last season, current freshman Rachel Oswald's Boonville Pirates eliminated Fayette in their Class 3 district championship. For her high-school career, Johnson is averaging 17.5 points, 10.9 rebounds and five blocks per game.

Richbow helped lead Pershing to a 17-1 record and a Detroit city championship last year under coach Gerald Weatherpoon. She averaged 12 points, five rebounds, four assists and four steals last year in earning first team all-city honors. She also led the Doughgirls to a district title as a sophomore.

Scott earned Kansas Class 4A honorable mention all-state honors as a junior last year at Iola for coach Becky Carlson. The Fillies finished fourth in the state her freshman year, and were sub-state champions a year ago. A talented multi-sport athlete, Scott led her volleyball team in kills as a sophomore, and led the squad to a conference title this year. She also is Iola's record holder in the javelin throw, which she did as a sophomore.

WOMEN PICKED 10TH BY BIG 12 COACHES

The Missouri women's basketball team has been picked to finish 10th in the Big 12 Conference in a polling of the league's coaches, Big 12 officials announced on Oct. 13.

Mizzou, which returns all five starters from last season's 11-18 squad, accumulated 37 voting points from the 11 other coaches – coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams – in being picked between Iowa State and Oklahoma State.

The preseason poll has traditionally underestimated the Tigers' success, as MU has finished at or above its selected position in all but one of the eight previous polls (no poll was conducted in 1996-97, the first year of the league); that came last year, when an eighth-place prediction ended in a tie for ninth place on the court. Five of the eight times have resulted in the Tigers improving upon their predicted finish.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CLEANS UP MIZZOU ARENA

The women's basketball team took time out from their strength and conditioning testing and workouts on Aug. 31, to help spruce up the grounds surrounding Mizzou Arena.

Done in conjunction with the women's basketball's 2005-06 theme of "TEAM MIZZOU", the team pulled weeds and trimmed the sidewalks of Mizzou Arena -- their year-old basketball mecca -- as a show of pride. At the conclusion of the afternoon, a small tree was planted on the northwest corner of the grounds.

Arkansas State 70, Mizzou 67

November 19, 2005 – Convocation Center

JONESBORO, Ark. – Arkansas State put the Missouri women in an early hole, and got key rebounds in the closing moments to stave off a Tiger comeback attempt in posting a 70-67 win Saturday night at the ASU Convocation Center.

Tiffany Brooks led the Tigers (1-2) with 15 points, **LaToya Bond** added 13 points and five steals, and **Carlynn Savant** finished with 12 points and eight rebounds. Adrianne Davie had a game-high 17 points and 11 rebounds for Arkansas State (1-0).

The Tigers got the first basket of the game on a drive from Brooks. But the Lady Indians used 8-0 and 11-0 runs to surge to a 21-6 lead just 6 minutes, 41 seconds into the game. ASU made its first six shots, and 10 of its first 12 in boosting its lead to 26-10 with 11:04 left in the first half.

After both teams traded baskets, Amber Abraham hit her third 3-pointer of the half to extend ASU's lead to 19 (31-12). A series of free throws from the teams brought the Lady Indian lead over 20 (35-14) a few minutes later before the Tigers finally started hitting their shots. A quick 9-0 run, capped by an **Eetisha Riddle** jumper, brought Mizzou to within 12 (35-23) with 3:05 to play.

While the Tigers were improving on the offensive end, they also turned up the intensity on defense, holding ASU without a field goal for a span of 8:21. The Indians went into the locker room with a 41-25 lead at the half.

Mizzou made three of its first four shots coming out of the break, including a Savant 3-pointer on the fastbreak, and closed the deficit to 47-35 after the first media timeout. Sophomore Kassie Drew (Anna, Ill. / Anna-Jonesboro HS) banked in a 3-pointer from the right corner to pull Mizzou within 10 (49-39) before ASU went on a quick 5-0 run.

The Tigers stormed back, though, buoyed by a 3-point play from **Blair Hardiek**. She finished a 17-6 run with a pair of runners through the lane to pull Mizzou within four at 60-56 with 4:53 left.

Kelsey Lock ended an 8:46 field-goal drought with a pair of buckets, then Rudy Sims stole a crossing pass and went coast-to-coast for a 66-58 lead with 2:25 left. That allowed the Lady Indians some breathing room after the Tigers missed several 3-point attempts and ASU made five free throws down the stretch.

Mizzou 87, Northwestern 64

November 22, 2005 – Mizzou Arena

COLUMBIA, Mo. – The University of Missouri women's basketball team found the win column in emphatic fashion, as a 37-5 run near the start of the contest helped the Tigers defeat Northwestern University 87-64 and even their overall record at 2-2 on the year.

For the first time since a 70-65 overtime win at Nebraska last season, all five Tiger starters reached double figures, led by **LaToya Bond**. She poured in a game-high 19 points on 5-of-7 shooting and went a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line to go with her second-straight five-steal game.

Carlynn Savant added 16 points thanks to a 4-of-6 shooting night from three-point range, while **Tiffany Brooks** and **Eetisha Riddle** each contributed 12. **Christelle N'Garsanet** rounded out the double-digit scorers for Mizzou, pouring in 11.

A.J. Glasauer and Ifeoma Okonkwo led the Wildcats (1-1) with 16 points apiece.

Although the Tigers were solid from the floor (27-of-61, 44.3 percent) and outstanding from beyond the arc (8-of-17, 47.1) it was Mizzou's defensive pressure that dictated the outcome in this contest. Missouri scored a remarkable 23 points off Wildcat turnovers in the opening stanza, culminating with its largest lead of the game, 37-7, at the 6:10 mark.

Down 2-0 following a Glasauer put-back, Mizzou rattled off the next 11 tallies to seize control. Savant initiated the burst with her first of three treys in the opening period to give the Tigers a lead they wouldn't relinquish. An N'Garsanet free throw and four consecutive Bond points segued to a second Savant triple as the Tigers forged in front 11-2.

The two clubs then traded buckets to keep the Missouri advantage at 10 (17-7), but 20-0 MU surge over the ensuing 5:46 helped the hosts pull away for good. Northwestern missed all eight of its field goal attempts and committed eight of its 15 first-half turnovers during the rally, which Mizzou promptly converted into 12 points.

Missouri remained in control throughout the final period despite an improved offensive effort from the Wildcats. After Missouri's pressure held Northwestern to just 28.6 percent shooting (8-of-28) in the opening half, the Wildcats improved to a 51.6 percent success rate from the floor (16-of-31), yet managed to slice Mizzou's lead below 20 points on just one occasion (74-55 at 4:10).

The Tigers built their lead to as many as 29 in the second half after carrying a 46-21 lead into the halftime break. Bond scored 12 of her 19 points over the final 20 minutes to keep Northwestern at arms length and hand the hosts their sixth consecutive home-opening victory.

Mizzou 69, Pittsburgh 60**Pittsburgh Thanksgiving Classic****November 27, 2005 – Petersen Events Center**

PITTSBURGH, Pa. — LaToya Bond earned Most Valuable Player honors in leading the Mizzou women to their first tournament title on the road in six years, a 69-60 decision over the host Panthers in the final of Sunday's Pittsburgh Thanksgiving Classic.

Bond had 14 points, five rebounds, three steals, and game highs of five assists and four blocks to lead five Tigers in double-figure scoring. **Christelle N'Garsanet** led Mizzou with 18 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her fifth career double-double; **Tiffany Brooks** added 11 points, six rebounds, two assists and two blocks; **EeTisha Riddle** had 10 points and six rebounds, and **Blair Hardiek** tied her career high with 10 points.

N'Garsanet and Riddle joined Bond on the all-tournament team.

Both teams made their first three shots of the game, and a 3-pointer by Maddy Brown gave Pitt a 7-6 lead just 1 minute, 44 seconds into the game. Both teams also cooled from there, however, missing their next seven shots combined.

Pitt (4-1) regained its shooting touch and extended its lead to 19-9 on a Mallorie Winn 3-pointer with 12:54 to play in the half. The Panther lead remained 10 at 26-16 with 7:02 left at the under-eight media timeout before the Tigers made a short run. Three straight baskets from N'Garsanet brought Mizzou within five at 30-25 with 4:16 to play. Brooks completed a 16-9 run with a 19-footer from near the top of the key to trim the deficit to three (35-32), and Pitt took a 37-32 lead into the locker room.

Mizzou hit its first three shots of the second half, capped by a Brooks jumper, to give the Tigers a 38-37 lead with 18:17 left to play. Missouri continued to push the tempo, and got an N'Garsanet basket on the fast break to go with a coast-to-coast steal and layup from Bond to push the lead to 42-39 with 15:47 to go.

Midway through the half, the Tigers ratcheted up their defense, forcing a shot-clock violation and getting a Bond steal that led to a fast break layup for Hardiek. Earlier in that sequence, N'Garsanet drew Marcedes Walker's fourth foul to force Pitt's post presence to the bench. With the Tigers clinging to a seven-point lead, Walker fouled out on a fight for a rebound with 3:42 left. Pitt would get no closer than four the rest of the way, as Mizzou made six of their 10 free throws down the stretch.

NOTES: Mizzou's previous tournament win on the road came at the San Diego State Tournament in 1999, when the Tigers defeated Portland State and San Diego State ... Sunday's win is the second in less than a week in which five Tigers scored in double figures. All five starters did so in Tuesday's win over Northwestern in Columbia ... the Tigers were Pittsburgh's first opponent to score 50 points this season.

COLUMBIA, Mo. — Christelle N'Garsanet led five Mizzou women in double-figure scoring, helping the Tigers to a 79-51 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the opening game of the 28th annual State Farm Tiger Classic. In continuing their streak on Friday night of winning their first-round match of every single Tiger Classic, Mizzou will face Murray State on Saturday.

N'Garsanet had a game-high 17 points, while **EeTisha Riddle** posted her third career double-double with 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. **LaToya Bond** went 8-of-9 from the free-throw line in her 14-point night for their Tigers (5-2), who have won four in a row.

Blair Hardiek, making her first start of the season, had a career-high 12 points; **Tiffany Brooks**, whom Hardiek replaced, matched that total.

Arica Green led UAPB (0-4) with 13 points.

Both teams had trouble establishing themselves in the first several minutes. UAPB turned the ball over on their first four possessions, while the Tigers missed their first five shots. LaToya Thomas made the game's first basket on a jumper two minutes and 35 seconds into the game, though, and Bond converted a 3-point play on a contested layup the next time down the floor.

Despite clinging to an 11-9 lead, the Tigers were having problems both on offense (36 percent shooting) and the boards, as they were out-rebounded by a 10-5 margin. Yet on the next series, Mizzou got four straight offensive rebounds, culminating in a putback by **Carlynn Savant** for a 13-9 lead with 11:00 to go.

Mizzou went on a short run to boost its lead to seven (20-13), yet was still plagued by poor shooting. The Tigers finished the half just 8-of-27 (29.6 percent), and only better-than-normal free-throw shooting – Mizzou made 63.6 percent of its 22 trips to the line – gave them a 29-24 halftime lead.

The shooting was better in the second half, but more importantly, the Tigers did a better job of sharing the ball; Mizzou got assists on eight of their first 10 second-half buckets. Arkansas-Pine Bluff would not go away, however, keeping the deficit within single digits for most of the first 30 minutes of the game.

A pair of Hardiek free throws started Mizzou on a 28-4 run with 10:33 left, turning a 46-39 lead into a comfortable 73-43 margin with 2:47 to play. The Tigers held the Golden Lady Lions to a single field goal in that span.

Mizzou 100, Murray State 55**State Farm Tiger Classic – Championship****December 3, 2005 – Mizzou Arena**

COLUMBIA, Mo. — LaToya Bond had a game-high 20 points, and again led five Tigers in double-figure scoring, to guide the Mizzou women to a 100-55 win over Murray State on Saturday in the championship game of the 28th annual State Farm Tiger Classic. For her efforts, Bond was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player for the second time in as many weeks.

It is Mizzou's largest margin of victory, and first time in triple-digit scoring, since a 103-41 win over Alcorn State in the semifinals of the 2003 Tiger Classic. The Lady Braves captured third place in this year's tournament earlier Saturday evening, besting fellow SWAC foe Arkansas-Pine Bluff by a 56-51 count. It is the 19th time that the Tigers have won their own tournament.

Bond was joined on the all-tournament team by **Carlynn Savant**, who had a career-high 19 points in the title game, and **Christelle N'Garsanet**, who had 10 points and seven rebounds.

The game was virtually decided in the game's first 10 minutes, as the Tigers (6-2), who have won five in a row, held Murray State to single digits in scoring until a Paige Guffey 3-pointer with 9:11 left in the half made it 29-11. That was the first point in the game that the Racers had outscored Bond, who had a pair of 3-pointers in the opening minutes and slashed through the lane for a layup and her eighth point before the first media timeout.

Mizzou was an equal-opportunity team on Saturday; nine Tigers played at least 13 minutes, and all of them scored at least five points. The Tigers posted season highs in assists (21) and 3-pointers (12), and committed a season-low 13 turnovers.

Ashley Brooke Hayes led the Lady Racers had a team-high 15 points, while Ashley Nichole Hayes had a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

Mizzou 88, Nicholls State 34

COLUMBIA, Mo. – Every Mizzou player posted a rebound, and for the fifth time in the last six games five Tigers scored in double figures, as Mizzou won its sixth straight Sunday in an 88-34 decision over Nicholls State.

Eetisha Riddle led all scorers with 15 points, yet every Tiger contributed in holding the Lady Colonels to the 10th-lowest scoring output in Mizzou history. It's also the fewest points an opponent has had against Mizzou (7-2) since 1999, when Centenary scored 31.

LaToya Bond flirted with a triple-double with her 11 points, game-high eight assists and seven rebounds in 22 minutes of action. **Tiffany Brooks** added career highs of eight rebounds and seven assists to go with four points; they led a Tiger offense that had a season-high 26 assists against just six turnovers.

Tamika Jackson came off the bench and nearly had a double-double of her own, as she had season-highs of 11 points and eight rebounds in just 15 minutes of action. No Tiger played more than 22 minutes, but eight played 17 or more. In all, 19 different individual career or season-high marks were set, and another 15 were tied.

Jamie Octave led Nicholls State (1-5) with 11 points. Mizzou scored the first 14 points of the game, and held Nicholls State without a field goal until Jamie Octave's 3-pointer with 13 minutes, 59 seconds remained in the first half. A 3-point play from Katherine Plummer brought the Lady Colonels within single digits (18-9) for the first time since the start of the game, yet the Tigers quickly pushed the lead back to double digits.

As a measure of their dominance inside, Mizzou had already scored 18 points in the paint before NSU scored their first, on a Tarin Seely layup, with 9:07 left in the half. By that point, the Tigers had a 26-13 lead, and had made 45 percent of their shots while holding Nicholls State to just 32 percent.

Carlynn Savant, on the flip side, made each of her first four shots – including a pair of 3-pointers – in hitting double figures in scoring in the first 13 minutes of the game. She finished with 12 on 5-of-6 shooting.

Bond and Riddle joined Savant in double-figure scoring within 90 seconds of the start of the second half, which MU began with a 49-21 lead.

Mizzou 96, Southern Illinois 69
December 18, 2005 – Mizzou Arena

COLUMBIA, Mo. – For the sixth time in the last seven games, five Missouri women's basketball players scored in double figures, and for the seventh straight game, Mizzou went out a winner in a 96-69 win over Southern Illinois Sunday evening at Mizzou Arena. The seven-game streak is the longest since Mizzou (8-2) won nine in a row at the start of the 1999-2000 season.

Four of the Tigers' five starters scored more than 16 points, led by a game-high 21 from **LaToya Bond**. Bond hit all six of her free throws, was 7-of-11 from the field, and added seven assists and five rebounds. **Carlynn Savant** added 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting; **Christelle N'Garsanet** picked up her third double-double of the season with 16 points and a game-high 10 rebounds; and **Tiffany Brooks** added 16 points, four rebounds and three assists for the victors.

Carla Moore led four Salukis in double figures with 18 points for Southern Illinois (4-4).

Savant had two 3-pointers in the first four minutes of the game to help the Tigers open a 12-4 lead. Brooks then hit back-to-back buckets less than two minutes later to give the Tigers a double-digit lead. Hot shooting propelled Mizzou to its early start, as the Tigers made eight of their first 12 shots – including Savant's pair from long distance.

Mizzou cooled off considerably midway through the first half – while holding the Salukis to just two field goals in a seven-minute span – before revving back up. A 10-0 run, with most of the baskets coming inside either in transition or on the fastbreak, pushed the Tiger lead to 37-17 with 5:14 to go in the half.

The Tigers entered the locker room with a comfortable 49-25 lead, and Savant, Brooks and N'Garsanet all had 10 points or more at the half.

With the exception of four separate possessions midway through the second half, when Southern Illinois got within 19, Mizzou maintained its 20-point advantage in the second 20 minutes before boosting the lead to 30 on a jumper from **Tamika Jackson**, who finished with 10 points and a pair of rebounds in just eight minutes on the floor.

Mizzou 84, Western Michigan 65

December 29, 2005 – Mizzou Arena

COLUMBIA, Mo. — Behind a Mizzou Arena record and career-high 34 points from **LaToya Bond**, the Missouri women notched their ninth straight win in an 84-65 victory over Western Michigan in the Tigers' non-conference finale Thursday night.

The nine-game streak remains the seventh-longest in the country, and matches the longest winning stretch at Mizzou since the 1999-2000 season. By finishing the non-conference schedule at 10-2, the Tigers have posted the third-best start in Mizzou history through 12 games, behind only the 1992-93 and 1976-77 teams that began 11-1.

Bond, who had 24 second-half points to lead the Tigers from behind, finished 13-of-18 from the field, including 11-of-12 shooting in the final 20 minutes. Her 34 points broke the arena record of 30 set last year by **Tiffany Brooks** against Nebraska. Bond was joined in double-figure scoring by **Christelle N'Garsanet**, who picked up her fourth double-double of the season with 14 points and 11 rebounds, and **Eetisha Riddle** and **Carlynn Savant**, who each added 10.

Casey Rost led Western Michigan (3-7) with 25 points, while Carrie Moore added 16 and Lindsey Brown 13.

Just as they did in their last game against Alabama State, the Tigers shot poorly and faced a team that shot well from outside in the early going. In the first half, the Broncos were 3-of-5 from 3-point range against the Big 12's top defensive squad against the trey.

Meanwhile, Mizzou made two of its first five shots, yet committed three turnovers and was down 10-4 just three minutes, 13 seconds into the game. The Broncos played aggressively on both ends of the floor, and with the Tigers missing their next 10 shots in a row, pushed to a 17-6 lead.

The Tigers would not stay cold, though, getting 3-pointers their next two trips down the floor from Savant and Bond. That fueled a 17-9 run over a span of 6:08 to bring Mizzou back to within three points (26-23) with 3:24 to go in the half. Western Michigan made a late run back to take a 34-28 lead at the break.

As poorly as they shot in the first half (30.3 percent on 10-of-33 shooting), Mizzou finally regained its shooting touch early in the second to slowly chip away at the lead. The Tigers finally earned their first advantage of the game with 13:34 left on an N'Garsanet jumper in the paint to go up 42-41. That came early in a game-breaking 27-3 run, spanning 8:07, in which the Broncos went 0-for-10 from the field and committed six turnovers.

Mizzou 64, No. 4 Baylor 61

January 4, 2006 – Mizzou Arena

COLUMBIA, Mo. — **Eetisha Riddle** hit a clutch 3-pointer down the stretch, and then a clinching free throw with three seconds left, as the University of Missouri women's basketball team ended defending NCAA National Champion Baylor's 30-game winning streak with a 64-61 win Wednesday night at Mizzou Arena.

The win is the 10th straight for the Tigers, who led for much of a game that saw 10 ties and nine lead changes. Baylor is the highest-ranked opponent that Mizzou has beaten since upsetting No. 4-ranked Georgia in the 2001 Sweet Sixteen. The only higher-ranked opponent the Tigers have down was No. 3 Colorado in the title match of the 1994 Big Eight Tournament.

LaToya Bond led Mizzou with 21 points to mark the fourth time in the last six games that she has scored 20 or more. **Tiffany Brooks**, who sank the winning bucket with 1:25 left to break a 61-all tie, had 12 points; and Riddle and **Christelle N'Garsanet** both chipped in 10; Riddle added a game-high 12 rebounds for her second-straight double-double, and fourth overall of the season.

All-American Sophia Young led the Bears with a game-high 31 points and 11 rebounds, but was the only Baylor player to score in double figures.

With the Tigers down one (59-58) with just over two minutes left, Brooks misfired on a jumper that was rebounded by **Carlynn Savant**. With the shot clock running down, Savant fired a pass out on the left wing to Riddle, who canned a 20-footer to put Mizzou up two.

After a Chameka Scott putback with 1:43 left tied the game, Brooks hit a jumper with 1:25 remaining to give the Tigers the lead for good. Brooks blocked a Jordan Davis 3-pointer with four seconds left, which Riddle corralled before being fouled. After Riddle made the second toss of a two-shot foul with three seconds to go, Bond, stole Scott's inbound pass and dribbled out the clock.

The first half was marked by large scoring runs for both teams, as the lead changed hands three times with four ties in the game's first 12 minutes. Mizzou took a opening 13-6 lead on the strength of seven points from Bond and three rebounds from N'Garsanet. The Bears countered with a 13-4 run of their own to take a 19-17 lead with 9:04 remaining in the half.

The Tigers kept their poise and tied the game the next time down the floor on a pair of Bond free throws, then got back-to-back 3-pointers from Savant and **Kassie Drew** to regain the lead and fuel a 15-2 run that spanned over four minutes. Baylor closed the gap in the final four minutes of the half as Mizzou made just one of its last eight shots, yet retained a 34-28 lead at the half.

Bond rattled home her second 3-pointer of the game on the first possession of the second half to put the Tigers up nine. Yet Baylor slowly chipped away at the lead, pulling within six (42-36) on Scott's jumper with 13:43 left to play. After a Bond jumper, the Bears sandwiched six free throws around a Sophia Young jumper in the paint to force the game's fifth tie, and Baylor's first since the 8:44 mark of the first half (19-all).

Mizzou 68, Kansas State 42

January 7, 2006 – Mizzou Arena

COLUMBIA, Mo. — **LaToya Bond** had a game-high 20 points in leading the Mizzou women to a convincing 68-42 win, its 11th straight, over Kansas State at Mizzou Arena on Saturday afternoon.

It is the sixth 20-point game of the season for Bond, who was 7-of-8 from the field, and made all five of her free-throw attempts and her only 3-pointer of the day.

At 12-2 overall, the Tigers have matched the best start in school history after 14 games, and Mizzou is 2-0 in conference play for the first time since the 1992-93 season. In addition, the 26-point win is the second-largest for Mizzou against the Wildcats (11-2, 1-1), who shot a dismal 28.8 percent from the field.

Eetisha Riddle and **Marchele Campbell** joined Bond in double-figure scoring. Riddle had 12 points and five rebounds, and defensively held KSU's leading scorer, Claire Coggins, to two points on 1-of-13 shooting. Campbell came off the bench in the second half and contributed 11 points on 4-of-6 shooting, including three 3-pointers.

Mizzou stormed to a 10-point lead in the game's first eight minutes. It was punctuated with a pair of dazzling plays on both ends of the floor. With 12:57 left in the first half, Bond blocked a short jumper by 6-foot-2 center Jessica McFarland. **Kassie Drew** snared the rebound, and after the Tigers transitioned down the floor, used good ball movement to find **Carlynn Savant** wide open at the top of the key for a 3-pointer and a 12-2 lead.

Mizzou held K-State to 1-for-13 shooting in the first 8:35 before the Wildcats got buckets from Shalee Lehning and Danielle Zanotti in their next three trips to cut the lead to six.

But a 20-0 run that the Tigers threw at Kansas State over the next 7:38 — which included three straight baskets from Bond — moved the advantage to 32-6 with 2:41 remaining. Midway through that stretch, Bond followed a layup on the fastbreak with another short, quick jumper. The next time down the floor, Bond banked in a 3-pointer with the shot clock running down. The Tigers led 35-11 at the half, holding Kansas State to 16.1 percent shooting (5-of-31), including 1-of-9 from 3-point range. It was the Wildcats' fewest points scored in a half in the 10 years of the Big 12 Conference.
