For Openers

Mizzou looks for its sixth consecutive home victory on Friday (Dec. 30) when it welcomes the Oakland University Grizzlies to Mizzou Arena for a rare 8:05 p.m. tip following the Tiger football team's Independence Bowl contest in Shreveport, La. ... The five consecutive home court wins are the most in the brief two-year history of Mizzou Arena and is the best home-court run since the club won six consecutive at the Hearnes Center from Jan. 24 - Feb. 24, 2004 ... Mizzou is 2-0 all-time vs. Oakland, including a 70-61 win over the Grizzlies on Dec. 4, 2004 ... Thomas Gardner and Jason Conley each scored 18 points to pace Mizzou ... The initial meeting was a 90-85 Tiger win on Nov. 29, 2003, in Detroit ... Both Missouri and Oakland will be playing on just one day's rest ... Missouri claimed a 68-56 victory over Eastern Illinois on Wednesday, while the Grizzlies fell at Toledo 64-61 despite holding the Rockets to 0-of-22 shooting from three-point range ... Mizzou got a terrific inside-outside performance from Marshall Brown and Thomas Gardner in Wednesday's victory ... Brown recorded his first career double-double with 19 points and 11 boards, while Gardner topped the 20-point plateau for the sixth time this season ... Mizzou got great balance in the win over Eastern Illinois, as all-10 players who saw action scored at least two points, including Marcus Watkins, who made his first career start and played 18 minutes ... As its 5-1 record at home would indicate, Missouri has been a much improved team within its friendly confines, especially on the glass ... Missouri is outrebounding its foes by 5.5 boards per game at home with 4.3 of those 5.5 boards coming on the offensive end ... When the Tigers play away from Mizzou Arena, however, they are being outrebounded by 7.3 rebounds per game (40-to-32.7).

Tiger Trends (Team Quick-Hitters)

- Friday's game vs. Oakland will be the 206th of Quin Snyder's career ... Only three coaches, George Edwards (353), Wilbur Stalcup (374) and Norm Stewart (967) have coached more games on the Mizzou sideline than Snyder.
- Mizzou has made at least one three-point field goal in every game under Quin Snyder (205 games) ... The Tigers have made multiple treys in 203 of those 205 games, including double-figure triples (10+) 56 times.
- Mizzou continues to be an improved second-half club, outscoring its opposition by an average of 41.6-to-37.2 (374-to-335) over the final 20 minutes ... The Tigers have shot better than 50 percent from the floor in the second half of four of those games, including 56.0 percent (14-of-25) in the 72-63 home win over Furman.
- The Tigers are one of the Big 12's top offensive rebounding clubs ... Mizzou ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 14.7 offensive caroms and have out-rebounded its foes on the offensive glass in four consecutive games.
- The Tigers continue to excel at getting to the free throw line ... Mizzou has shot 207 free throws compared to the 156 by its opponents, but have scored just 14 more points at the charity stripe due to its 61.8 percent shooting as a club.
- Gotta give credit to Mizzou's free-throwing in the 68-56 win over Eastern Illinois however ... Mizzou shot a season-best 71.9 percent from the line (23-of-32), thanks to a career-best 10-

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of-10 shooting effort from the foul line by junior Thomas Gardner ... Marshall Brown also had an improved night, hitting 9-of-13 "freebees".

● Mizzou continues to show improvement with its ball security ... The Tigers turned the ball over just 12 times vs. Eastern Illinois and have 14 or fewer miscues in four of the last five games.

● Mizzou's defensive effort against UMKC had numerous record book implications ... The 42 points scored by the Kangaroos were the fewest by an MU opponent since a 45-42 win over DePaul on Nov. 24, 1997, in the opening round of the Maui Invitational ... UMKC's 15 first-half points were the fewest in the two-year history of Mizzou Arena ... The 15 total field goals by the Kangaroos were also the fewest in the history of the building and was the lowest total by Tiger opposition since Arkansas-Pine Bluff netted just 11 buckets on Dec. 9, 1998.

Tigers Tidbits (Player Quick-Hitters)

● Kevin Young continues to be one of the Big 12's top rebounders ... Young is producing career numbers with 8.0 points and 7.9 boards and ranks third in the league with his 7.9 caroms per game ... The Kingston, Jamaica, native also leads the Big 12 with 4.3 offensive rebounds per game.

● Young has provided a consistent scoring presence as well and has topped double figures in points twice in nine games... Entering the year, Young had just one career double figure scoring effort and narrowly missed his third with nine points vs. Furman.

● Marshall Brown has reached double figures in scoring four times this season, including a career high 20 points in the season-opener against Sam Houston State ... The Austin, Texas, native nearly duplicated that feat against Eastern Illinois when he scored 19 points thanks to 9-of-13 shooting from the foul line, while adding a career high 11 rebounds.

● The 19-point, 11-rebound double-double was the first of Brown's career and made him the third Tiger to record a double-double this season, joining Kevin Young and Thomas Gardner.

● Over the last two games Brown has averaged 10.0 rebounds thanks to the nine boards he collected against No. 6 Illinois on Dec. 21.

● Thomas Gardner has reached double figures in points in 12 of his last 13 games ... Gardner has led the Tigers in scoring seven times (out of nine games) this season and 14 times over his career.

● Gardner currently leads the Big 12 with a pair of 30-point contests, including a 30-point night at Davidson on Dec. 7 ... Gardner hit eight treys vs. the Wildcats, the fourth-highest single-game total in the NCAA's this year and the third highest single-game total in school history ... He has now made at least one three-pointer in 16 consecutive games, the longest three-point streak of his tenure.

● Gardner leads the Big 12 with 3.44 three-point field goals per game and ranks 13th nationally in that category, while his three-point percentage of 44.9 ranks third in the Conference.

● If there had been one area of emphasis for Gardner it was his free throw shooting, but the 6-foot-5 junior hit a career-best 10-of-10 vs. Eastern Illinois and now has a run of 11 consecutive makes dating back to the Dec. 18 contest with Furman.

● Gardner's 12 rebounds vs. UMKC tied a career high ... His 17-point, 12-rebound double-double was also the second of his career ... His first was a 19-point, 12-board effort against Brown in the 2004-05 season-opener.

● Jason Horton continues to be one of the Big 12's top assist-men ... Horton is averaging 4.6 dimes a game and has a 1.54-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio.

● The Dallas native is among the League's top thieves as well, ranking fourth with 2.3 steals per game including a career high five vs. Furman.

● Horton has also provided a much-needed scoring boost over his last two outings, averaging 11.0 points on 50.0 percent (4-of-8) shooting from beyond the arc.

● Also, has there been a more improved perimeter defender in the Big 12 than Horton thus far? The sophomore held UMKC's Quinton Day (Southern Cal transfer) 20.5 points below his season average of 27.5 points in Mizzou's 60-42 win on Nov. 29 and held Arkansas point guards Eric Ferguson (1-of-5), Dontell Jefferson (1-of-1) and Sean McCurdy (0-of-0) to a combined 2-of-6 shooting and six total points ... In addition to his five steals vs. Furman, Horton held point guard Tony Carter to two points on 0-of-4 shooting.

● Freshman Matt Lawrence has been impressive from three-point range this season ... The St. Louis native is 4-of-10 from bonus distance, including a 2-of-2 effort in front of 17,427 screaming fans at Arkansas en route of a career high six points ... Lawrence made his first career trey vs. UMKC and added a fourth at Davidson.

● It's not just shooting where the 6-foot-7 freshman has been near flawless ... Lawrence has added 10 boards (five offensive) and ranks fourth on the squad with five steals in 8.9 minutes per game.

● Senior Jimmy McKinney is finding his consistency offensively over the past five games and is averaging 12.8 points per game during that stretch ... McKinney opened the run with 16 points at Davidson, before scoring a season high 19 vs. Texas A&M-CC on a career best 12-of-14 foul shooting ... The St. Louis native has added 11 points in back-to-back games vs. No. 6 Illinois and Eastern Illinois.

● While the Tigers have struggled from the line as a team, McKinney sure hasn't ... The senior ranks third in the Big 12 in free throw shooting at 80.6 percent (29-of-36).

● Nicknamed "Rock" by his teammates, the former Vashon High School standout missed his first game as a Tiger because of a fractured frontal sinus, but has been a "Rock" for Mizzou ever since, failing to miss a game.

● McKinney's hit his 100th career three-pointer vs. Texas A&M-CC ... Only 15 Tigers have more than 100 career triples, including teammate Gardner (116).

● Junior forward Marcus Watkins made the first start of his career vs. Eastern Illinois.

● Freshman Leo Lyons narrowly missed his first career double-double after recording career highs of eight points and eight boards vs. Furman on Sunday ... Lyons also added a career high two blocked shots and now leads the team with seven swats.

● Sophomore center Kalen Grimes enjoyed his best game of the year vs. Illinois in his hometown return to St. Louis ... The 6-foot-9 center grabbed a career high seven boards vs. the Illini and scored a season-high five points on 2-of-3 shooting.

● Grimes also recorded the first assist of his career vs. Eastern Illinois on a pitch-back to Thomas Gardner at the 17:00 mark of the second half ... Prior to the assist, Grimes had played 386 career minutes without a "dime".

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Getting To Know Today's Foe

Oakland enters this evening's contest 5-6 overall following a 64-61 loss at Toledo on Dec. 28 ... The Grizzlies led the entire way vs. the Rockets, but a pair of late turnovers sealed their fate in the three-point decision ... The Grizzlies do boast one of the nation's top scorers ... Calvin Wooten, a transfer from Rutgers, averages 22.8 points on 44.0 percent three-point shooting and supplements his scoring with a team-leading 28 steals ... Another Division I transfer, Vova Severovas (transferred from Wright State), is averaging 12.5 points and 5.5 rebounds, while Derrick Nelson rounds out the double-figure scorers with 10.0 points and 6.4 rebounds ... A solid rebounding club overall (+5.6), Patrick McCloskey paces the team with 7.5 boards per night, while Shawn Hopes adds 7.4 ... In addition to rebounding, Oakland has done a nice job defending the three-point arc ... The Grizzlies are holding opponents to 33.5 percent from bonus distance, which includes an 0-of-22 night by Toledo on Wednesday.

Mizzou vs. The Grizzlies

Tonight's game will mark the third all-time meeting between Missouri and Oakland ... Mizzou is 2-0 vs. the Grizzlies with a 70-61 win coming on Dec. 4, 2004 at Mizzou Arena, and a 90-85 decision coming Nov. 29, 2003, in Detroit, Mich., which served as a homecoming for former Tigers Rickey Paulding and Arthur Johnson.

Mizzou vs. The Mid-Continent Conference

The Mizzou offense has excelled throughout the second half this season as the Tigers are averaging 41.6 points on 49.8 percent (128-of-257) shooting ... Missouri has topped the 50-point plateau in the second half twice already and has outscored its opponents by combined 39 points (4.4 average) over the final 20 minutes ... Mizzou scored a season high 54 points in the second half of its win over Northwestern State ... The 54 tallies were the most scored by the Tigers in a half since a Nov. 19, 2004, game vs. Davidson ... Mizzou also scored 54 second-half points in that game as well.

Rock-Solid Play For McKinney

Teammates call him "Rock" and Jimmy McKinney has been just that for the Tigers over his 3-plus seasons in Columbia ... The selfless guard has done it all for head coach Quin Snyder and the Tigers and now the former Vashon High School standout is providing career high scoring numbers (11.1 ppg) to go with his outstanding all-around play.

- McKinney is on pace to become just the fifth player in school history to record 1,000 points (needs 106), 400 rebounds (needs 52) and 300 assists (304).

- He currently ranks second on the team with his 11.1 ppg. average, bolstered by four double-figure scoring performances over the last five games.

- Against Davidson, McKinney hit 7-of-15 shots en route to 16 points ... Just to show how unselfish McKinney has been throughout his Mizzou career, those 15 field goal attempts were a career high for a player then-competing in his 100th consecutive game.

- The senior then responded with a 19-point game vs. Texas A&M-CC, including the game-winning tip-in with :09 seconds remaining and the Tigers trailing 81-80 ... While the last-second bucket proved to be the difference, it was his career-best 12-of-14 free throw shooting that kept Mizzou in position for the win.

- Speaking of free throws, the St. Louis, Mo., native ranks third in the Big 12 with 80.6 percent shooting on the year.

Gardner Player of the Week

Thomas Gardner was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 12 after averaging 30.0 points, 3.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.5 steals in games vs. Davidson and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

- Gardner became the first Tiger with back-to-back 30-point games since Anthony Peeler (1991-92) and was the first Tiger to earn Big 12 Player of the Week recognition since Rickey Paulding on March 1, 2004.

- Gardner hit 13-of-23 three-point field goals during the week, including a career best 8-of-14 effort from beyond the arc at Davidson on Dec. 7 ... He concluded the week with 5-of-9 three-point shooting vs. Texas A&M-CC.

Gardner Digging His Leading Role

Taking on a larger role following the departure of key players is nothing new for Thomas Gardner ... Last season, the 6-foot-5 wing played alongside NBA draft pick Linas Kleiza and senior Jason Conley, but still managed to rank third on the team with 10.4 points per game ... This season, minus both standouts, Gardner has seen his scoring totals nearly double (20.2), virtually duplicating the performance he turned in as a high school junior.

- Prior to signing at Mizzou, Gardner played on the same high school team with former Kansas Jayhawks Aaron Miles and Michael Lee, but saw his stock soar following their departure and his ascent into a leadership role for Jefferson High School in Portland, Ore.

- So far this season Gardner is the Big 12's leading scorer (20.2 ppg.) thanks to back-to-back 30-point nights at Davidson (Dec. 7) and Texas A&M-CC (Dec. 10) ... Gardner also leads the Conference with 3.44 three-point makes per game, ranks third in three-point percentage (44.9) and ranks 15th in overall field goal percentage (44.9).

Just to show he wasn't all about scoring, Gardner also chipped in a career high four steals, including the game-clinching theft in the final :05 seconds.

● Gardner recorded his second career double-double, a 17-point, 12-board effort in the 60-42 win over UMKC ... His second have tomahawk dunk vs. the Kangaroos was No. 2 on ESPN's Plays of the Day for Nov. 29.

Playing Beyond Their Years

Mizzou's newcomers have quickly dispelled any notion of early-season jitters as rookies Marcus Watkins, Leo Lyons, James Douglas and Matt Lawrence have made impacts for the Tigers.

● Watkins is averaging 4.0 points and 2.1 rebounds as Mizzou's sixth man, including eight points and three boards in his hometown return to Charlotte, N.C., vs. Davidson on Dec. 7.

● Matt Lawrence continues to provide the Tigers with a perimeter shooting threat and is a near-perfect 4-of-10 from bonus distance, including a pair of triples at Arkansas (Dec. 2) ... The most impressive part with regards to Lawrence's game is decision making ... Lawrence has 10 rebounds, five steals and two assists, while committing just two turnovers in 71 total minutes.

● Lyons had a breakout game vs. Furman, leading the Tigers with eight rebounds (four offensive) in addition to his career high eight points on 4-of-5 shooting ... The Kansas City native also paces the club with seven blocked shots.

● Douglas has been steady in relief of starting point guard Jason Horton and averages 10.3 minutes per game ... The Detroit, Mich., native also added a career best four points vs. Furman.

Sophomore point guard Jason Horton has gotten into the holiday spirit of giving ... The Dallas native ranks fifth among Big 12 performers with 4.6 assists per game, which included a season-high

Voting runs through Dec. 31, 2005, and the team will be announced Jan. 16, 2006 during the Mizzou-Kansas basketball game at Mizzou Arena ... The team will then be

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honored in person at the Feb. 12 home game vs. Kansas State.

The Long Way Home

It's been a long road for junior transfer Marcus Watkins ... After opening his career at Texas A&M, the 6-foot-4 forward sat out nearly two seasons before seeing his first action as a Tiger in the season-opener vs. Sam Houston State ... Watkins scored nine points in 15 minutes of playing time in that game and ranks sixth on the club with 4.0 points and 17.3 minutes of playing time per game as the team's first option off the bench ... Watkins shed his "reserve" title in the win over Eastern Illinois, making his first career start in the 12-point victory.

Tigers Beat Early Signing Deadline, Ink Lithuanian Standout Vaidatos Volkus

Head Coach Quin Snyder continued to make waves on the recruiting front with the addition of touted junior college forward Vaidatos Volkus (pronounced Vah-dose) (Vole-kuss) ... The 6-8, 220-pound Lithuanian is averaging 11.2 points on 44 percent three-point shooting for Redlands Community College this season after recording norms of 9.2 points and 4.8 boards as a freshman.

Tigers Ink Lawrence, Morrison In Early Signing Period

Head Coach Quin Snyder and the Tigers made a splash in the early signing period when they inked one of the nation's premiere junior college players, Ty Morrison (Phoenix, Ariz. / Redlands CC / Trevor Browne HS), and rapidly rising high school star Keon Lawrence (Newark, N.J. / Weequahic) to national letters-of-intent on Wednesday (Nov. 9). ● A 6-7, 220-pound forward, Morrison is ranked No. 1 nationally among two-year players by Van Coleman and No. 3 nationally by Rivals.com ... A standout for Steve Eck at Redlands Community College in El Reno, Okla., Morrison averaged 10.1 points and 5.6 boards as a freshman for Redlands after earning All-State honors four consecutive seasons in Arizona.

● Lawrence is a 6-2, 180-pound point guard that lit-up the Jersey Shore Summer League, scoring 48 and 43 points against competition that included Detroit Pistons reserve guard Horace Jenkins, Louisville's Taquan Dean and Villanova's Mike Nardi ... An All-Newark Pick by the Newark Star-Ledger, Lawrence has averaged better than 23 points each of the last two seasons and was listed among the Top Five Juniors in the state of New Jersey.

Tigers Have Tough Slate

Although Mizzou faces its first ranked foe of the 2005-06 season tonight, it definitely won't be its last ... The Tigers currently have scheduled games vs. three teams in the Top 25 of the ESPN Top 25 Coaches Poll and games vs. four others receiving votes ... Kevin Young had 13 points and eight rebounds for Missouri. Horton scored nine points, all on second-half 3-pointers. The Tigers shot 9-of-18 from 3-point range, 6-of-9 in the second half.

Both teams struggled from the free-throw line. Missouri went 8-of-17, and Arkansas shot 15-of-23.

The Wildcats continued to pound it inside, with Meno's basket making it 25-7. Johnson's layup with 4:39 to go put Davidson ahead 32-14 and forced Snyder to call his third timeout of the half.

Thomas Sanders' tip-in with 1 second left gave Davidson a 40-24 halftime lead.
