SEC GYMNASTICS WEEKLY HONORS PRESENTED BY ALLSTATE

SEC Gymnast of the Week – LSU’s Kailin Chio, a sophomore from Henderson, Nev., collected five event titles and a pair of 10.0s in the win over No. 3 Alabama and the victories at the Podium Challenge against Alabama, No. 17 North Carolina and Arizona. In Friday’s meet against the Crimson Tide, Chio won the all-around with a 39.800 along with event titles for vault (9.975), beam (10.0) and floor (9.975). At Sunday’s quad meet, she posted another 10.0 on beam to take first place and finished second on bars with a 9.95.

SEC Specialist of the Week – Florida’s Skye Blakely, a sophomore from Frisco, Texas, earned two event titles in the quad meet win over Arizona State, Fisk and host Texas Woman’s. Blakely recorded her first career 10.0 on the balance beam, becoming the second gymnast in the nation this season to earn a perfect score on the apparatus. She also captured the top spot on bars with a 9.975.

SEC Freshman of the Week – Oklahoma’s Mackenzie Estep, a freshman from Auburn, Wash., registered a career-high 9.975 on floor to win the event title in the win over No. 15 Auburn. Estep also tied for third place on vault with a 9.90 and tied for sixth place on bars with a 9.875 to help the Sooners earn their second consecutive SEC regular-season title.

The No. 3 Alabama gymnastics team came up short at No. 2 LSU, 197.975-197.600, on February 27 at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The team total marked the second straight week the Crimson Tide recorded one of its top two road scores of the season.

National bars leader Chloe LaCoursiere continued her dominant run on the apparatus, scoring 9.950 to capture her seventh bars title of the season and ninth overall. Noella Marshall set her career high on vault with a 9.875. On bars, Ryan Fuller matched her season high with a 9.900, while Jamison Sears' 9.925 marked the seventh meet this season the junior has hit 9.900-threshold on the apparatus. Fuller later added a career-high-tying 9.900 on beam before Kylee Kvamme anchored the lineup with a career-high 9.950.

Alabama closed its busy weekend with a second-place finish at the P&G Podium Challenge on March 1 at the Raising Cane's River Center. No. 2 LSU scored a 198.200, followed by the Crimson Tide's second-highest road score of the season with a 197.650. No. 17 North Carolina came in third with a 195.950, as Arizona rounded out the group with a 195.000.

LaCoursiere continued her dominant run on nars, scoring 9.925 for the ninth straight meet. Azaraya Ra-Akbar's career-high-tying 9.975 stole the event and ended as the highest score across the quad meet. Gabby Gladieux won the all-around, posting a 39.575, while Marshall tied her career high on vault with a 9.875 and Kvamme (9.925) went 9.925-or-higher on beam for the third consecutive week.

Alabama will return home Friday, March 6, against the Kentucky Wildcats for its Be the Change meet. The contest will begin at 6:30 p.m. CT and will stream live on SEC Network+.

It was a tight battle all the way through, but ultimately No. 7 Missouri took down No. 8 Arkansas in the SEC dual, 197.425-197.225.

There was plenty for the Gymbacks to be proud of in the meet, starting with the all-around performance of freshman Allison Cucci. She earned a career-high score of 39.500, good for the all-around crown and the highest of any freshman in the nation this season. Cucci also tied for first on vault (9.900) and got second on beam (9.925).

Redshirt junior Lauren Williams had a fantastic outing as a floor specialist, earning a share of the event title with a 9.925 on the apparatus. Williams also garnered a share of first place on vault with a 9.875. Senior Morgan Price earned a big 9.925 at bars anchor, which tied for first on the event.

The last two events of the day kept Arkansas in contention with Mizzou, as the Gymbacks went 49.425 on both floor and beam, the latter a season high.

Arkansas returns to Bud Walton Arena for its home finale against Oklahoma on Friday, March 6. Action is set for 7:15 p.m. CT and the meet will be streamed live on SEC Network+.

The No. 15 Auburn gymnastics team traveled to No. 1 Oklahoma for an SEC contest and fell to the Sooners, 197.975-196.150 on February 27 in the Lloyd Noble Center.

Vault was a bright spot for the Tigers as the team went 49.300. Sophomore Marissa Neal and freshman Brynn Torry each reached career highs with a 9.9s and junior Paige Zancan had a team-high 9.925 to earn a share of the vault title. Freshman Mia Leverton chipped in a 9.8 and junior Julianne Huff once again chipped in a 9.775.

Huff and junior Olivia Greaves competed in the all-around for the Tigers, scoring a 39.150 and a 38.925, respectively.

Auburn returns to the Plains for a non-conference match up with Michigan State. The Tigers and the Spartans will face off at 7 p.m. CT in Neville Arena on Friday, March 6. Auburn follows with a Sunday quad meet on the podium, traveling to Huntsville for the annual Elevate the Stage meet on March 8. A school-record 49.80 on balance beam was set by the Gators. Florida claimed three apparatus wins, all with collegiate best marks. Skye Blakely's 10.0 on beam and 9.975 on bars took both wins. Danie Ferris claimed her first floor exercise win at 9.925.

Florida returns home to play host to LSU on Sunday, March 8 for Gators Senior Night. The careers of Florida's seniors Lori Brubach, eMjæe Frazier, Selena Harris-Miranda and Riley McCusker will be celebrated in a post-meet ceremony.

Friday's win is the first SEC road win in the Cécile Canquetau-Landi and Ryan Roberts era at Georgia. The GymDogs' 197.275 is their highest SEC road score of the season.

Freshman Autumn Reingold captured a share of the bars title, scoring a 9.875 on the event. Fellow freshman Brooke Pierson scored a 9.825, a season high, in her second bars routine of the season.

Senior Ja' Free Scott and sophomore Nyla Aquino each shared the vault title, putting up a 9.900 each. Scott tied her career high. Georgia did not count a score lower than 9.850 on vault, tying its third-best vault score of the season with a 49.375.

Junior Ady Wahl and freshman CaMarah Williams each won a share of the floor title with a 9.925 on the event. Wahl tied her career high. Senior Nicole King made her season debut on floor, scoring a 9.875, finishing fifth on the event.

Freshman Kelise Woolford won the beam title outright, tying a season-best 9.950. Scott anchored Georgia's beam lineup with a 9.900 to clinch the win for the GymDogs in the final rotation.

Georgia will host Missouri at Stegeman Coliseum on Friday, March 6 in the final home meet of the season. The meet will begin at 7 p.m. ET on SEC Network+. Georgia will honor its seniors following the meet.

No. 2 LSU Gymnastics defeated No. 3 Alabama by a final score of 197.975-197.600 on February 27 inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

A crowd of 13,292 watched the Tigers extend their home win streak to 19 straight victories in the PMAC. LSU has not dropped a meet at home since January 16, 2023.

The night was highlighted by a perfect 10 from sophomore Kailin Chio. LSU took home four event titles on the night against Alabama. Chio took home the all-around with a 39.800, as well as the vault (9.975), beam (10.000), and floor (9.975) titles, bringing her total to 49 in her career and 27 this season.

LSU finished on top of the fourth-annual Podium Challenge with their score of 198.200 on March 1 in the Raising Cane's River Center. The Tigers first in the quad meet followed by No. 13 Alabama in second (197.650), North Carolina in third (195.950) and Arizona in fourth (195.500).

Chio posted another perfect score at the meet, marking her fourth meet with a perfect 10 and third straight on beam. She is currently tied with Lloimincia Hall, needing one more to share the program record of eight with Aleah Finnegan, Kiya Johnson and April Burkholder. Junior Amari Drayton won her fourth career vault title (9.95), and junior Kylie Coen took home her first ever career title on floor (9.975).

LSU will hit the road for another top five battle amongst the SEC's best next week, this time against No. 4 Florida at 5 p.m. CT on Sunday, March 8 on SEC Network.

She was joined on vault by Kimarra Echols, on bars by Miaya Terry, whose 9.925 marked a career high, and on floor by Kaia Tanskanen. Railey Jackson captured the balance beam title, matching her personal-best mark of 9.950.

Missouri travels to Athens, Ga., to take on the Georgia Bulldogs at Stegeman Coliseum on Friday, March 6 at 6 p.m. CT. The meet will be live streamed on SEC Network+.

Lily Pederson tied her career high with a 9.95 to take the bars title, while Faith Torrez won her sixth beam title with a 9.95. Mackenzie Estep claimed floor with a 9.95 of her own.

A double weekend awaits the Sooners with a road trip to Arkansas on Friday, March 6, followed by the final home meet of the season against Texas Woman's University on Sunday, March 8.
