Tigers Look For Fifth Straight Win on Saturday

The University of Missouri men's basketball squad looks to win its fifth straight game on Saturday when it travels to Austin, TX, to take on the Texas Longhorns (18-8, 7-6 Big 12). The Tigers have managed to move into a tie for seventh place in the Big 12 Conference with Texas A&M over the course of the last two weeks with their four straight wins and carry a 14-13 overall record and a 6-7 mark in the Big 12 into Saturday's contest at the Frank Erwin Center.

One of the keys to Mizzou's success over the course of the last four games has been an improved effort on the defensive end. The Tigers have held their last four opponents to just 56.2 points per game and 40.3 percent (23.9 percent from three) field goal shooting. They have also been strong on the boards, outrebounding their opponents by an average of 4.8 boards per contest during the streak.

Freshman Jason Horton, who is a native of Dallas, is coming off of one of the best shooting performances of his career as he scored a game-high 14 points including three 3-pointers against Colorado, all of which came in the second half. Sophomore Linas Kleiza has also been extremely effective with two double-doubles in the Tigers last four games, giving him seven double-doubles on the season.

Saturday's contest, which is set to tip at 12 noon, will be broadcast on the Tiger Radio Network with Mike Kelly, 'The Voice of the Tigers' handling the play-by-play duties and former Tiger great Gary Link handling the analyst duties. The game will also be aired regionally by ABC television with play-by-play guru Ron Franklin on the call and Fran Fraschilla providing expert analysis. Westwood One Radio will also be broadcasting the contest nation-wide with Chuck Cooperstein and Bill Freider on the call.

The Tigers are 1-0 this season when the game is being carried by ABC, 7-0 in games played during the day and have won two straight games over teams from the Big 12 South.

Mizzou is 18-5 during the month of February at home under Head Coach Quin Snyder during his six years at the helm and 27-16 overall during the second month of the year under his tutelage ... The series is tied between MU and UT, 8-8 ... Mizzou is 13-4 at home, 0-3 in neutral court contests and 1-6 on the road ... Mizzou is 0-6 against Texas under Coach Snyder ... Expect to see some 3-pointers taken as these two squads rank No. 1 (Texas, 211) and No. 3 (Missouri, 179) in 3-point field goals made ... The Tigers are 6-2 at Mizzou Arena in 2005 ... The Tigers have won four in a row for the first time since Feb. 10-28 of last season when they won six straight ... Head Coach Quin Snyder is looking for win number 115 at Mizzou ... Sophomore Linas Kleiza has led Mizzou in either scoring, rebounding or in both categories in 20 of the Tigers' 27 games so far this season ... Kleiza had 14 points and five rebounds against Texas last season in Columbia ... Senior Jason Conley has scored in double figures in five of the Tigers' last seven games ... The Tigers have two members of their squad from the State of Texas including freshmen Jason Horton (Dallas) and Marshall Brown (Austin) ... Horton had a team-high 14 points against Colorado on Tuesday, all of which came in the second half ... He recorded 10 assists and only three turnovers against OU; that is the most assists in a game by a Tiger since Wesley Stokes handed out 11 dimes against Coppin State in January of 2002 ... Horton also had a great game against Baylor, scoring a team-high 15 points on 5-of-6 shooting from the field ... Horton had one of the best games of his high school career at the Frank Erwin Center his senior year of high school as he scored 31 points for Cedar Hill High School in the Texas State Tournament Championship game against Houston Milby ... Brown was also a stand out in Austin for LB Johnson High School where he earned First Team All-State honors his junior and senior seasons ... About the Longhorns

Texas enters Saturday's contest with an 18-8 overall record and a 7-6 mark in the Big 12. It has won three of their last four contests despite a loss to Texas Tech, 79-75 in its game on Tuesday. The Longhorns are one of the most explosive teams in the Big 12, averaging 79.3 points per contest, and lead the league in 3-point field goals with 211 on the year.

Offensively, they are one of the most balanced teams in the country with five active players that average better than 9.9 points per contest. Freshman Daniel Gibson has been extremely effective since his arrival in Austin averaging a team-best 14.7 points per game. He also leads the squad in assists (105) and three point field goals (65). He has hit 44 percent of his shots on the year and has grabbed a team-best 47 steals.

Junior Brad Buckman has also been impressive this season. He recorded his fifth double-double in his last six contests with 16 points and 13 boards in Tuesday's loss to Texas Tech. Buckman averages 12.6 points and a team-best 8.6 rebounds per game on the year while leading the team in blocks with 45.

Texas Coach Rick Barnes is in his seventh year at the helm and has registered a 159-66 mark at UT while leading them to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last six seasons.

A Look Back ... Mizzou at Colorado

The Tigers exploded for 45 points in the second half after trailing 24-16 at half time to the Buffaloes. Four Mizzou players broke into double figures including freshman Jason Horton, who scored all 14 of his points in the second half. Below are a couple other notes of note from the CU game ...

Missouri Team Notes after the Colorado Game

- Missouri now holds a 90-50 lead in the all-time series.
- Colorado took the first matchup between these two teams this season, winning 64-62 in Boulder on January 26.
- Mizzou avoided being swept by Colorado in a regular season series for the first time since the 1997 season, when the Buffaloes earned 87-78 and 84-75 wins.
- Mizzou is now 18-5 at home in the month of February under head coach Quin Snyder, and owns a 9-0 mark over CU in Snyder's six years.
- The Tigers improved their record to 13-4 this season at Mizzou Arena.
- Mizzou's four straight wins constitute a season-long winning streak, and also their longest span without a loss since winning six consecutive outings from February 10-28, 2004.
- The Tigers' first five field goal attempts, and the team's first two field goals made, came from behind the 3-point line. Mizzou didn't attempt a 2-point field goal until the 15:08 mark of the first half and didn't connect from inside the arc until the clock showed 8:59.
- The Tigers improved their record to 10-6 this season when they out rebounded the opposing team. Mizzou pulled down 40 boards, while only allowing the Buffaloes to collect 35.

Missouri Player Notes after the Colorado Game

- Sophomore forward Linas Kleiza pulled down a team-high 10 rebounds against CU. Kleiza has now led Mizzou in scoring, rebounding or both in 20 of the Tigers' 27 games this season.
- Senior guard Brian Dailey set a career high in minutes, playing seven against the Buffaloes to eclipse the mark of four he set in last season's win over UNLV. Dailey came off the bench in the first half, and opened the second stanza on the floor.
- Sophomore guard Thomas Gardner had a career-high five assists against CU, and is averaging 4.3 assists per game over his last three outings. He entered the game averaging only 1.7 helpers per game on the year.
- Junior guard Jimmy McKinney's 3-point field goal at the 15:04 mark of the second half gave Mizzou its first lead, at 29-27, since they led 9-8 at the 14:07 point of the first half.
- Freshman guard Jason Horton paced Mizzou with 14 points, marking the third time in his career, and second in the last three MU games, that he has led the Tigers in scoring. Horton is averaging 11.7 ppg over his last three games.

A Look at the Last Four

The Tigers have managed to put together a four-game winning streak including three wins at home and their first road win of the season at Nebraska. The four-game run is Tigers' longest winning streak of the season and is their longest such streak since last February. While Mizzou hasn't exactly exploded offensively during the streak (61.8 ppg.), it has used solid defense, inspired second-half play and has attacked the rim and the paint to kick start this late-season run. Below are a couple other notes of interest during the mini-streak.

- Mizzou has outscored its last four opponents 143-108 in the second half and has shot 50 percent from the field (49-98) during the seconds stanza of the last four games.
- Four Tigers have averaged better than 9.8 points per game.
- * Linas Kleiza leads with 13.0 points and 8.3 rebounds per game.
- Mizzou has shot 45.3 percent (91-201) from the field compared to just 41.1 percent for the season.

- * They have shot 54.9 percent (67-122) inside the three-point arc.
- The Tigers have held their opponents to just 56.2 points per game and 40.3 percent shooting from the field.
- Mizzou has outrebounded its opponents by an average of 4.8 boards per contest (35.5-30.8).
- * Kleiza leads the way with a 8.3 boards per game average, but is trailed closely by senior Jason Conley, who has pulled down 6.5 rebounds per game during the streak.

Horton Has The Hot Hand

The development of freshman point guard Jason Horton has certainly been an encouraging sign for the Tigers during the course of the 2004-05 season. He led Mizzou in scoring for the second time in the last three games against Colorado, scoring 14 points on a scorching 4-of-4 shooting to run the Tigers' winning streak to four in row.

Horton hit a huge running jump shot with just 1:15 left in the game to give Mizzou a three point lead in its win over Nebraska. He just missed a career high on against Baylor when he scored a team-best 15 points on 5-of-6 shooting. It marked the second time in the last four games that he has led the Tigers in scoring this season. In those two contests (the other being the Texas A&M game where he scored 17 points), the talented freshman was 10-of-13 from the field (76.9 percent) including 7-of-9 from three-point land (77.8 percent).

Horton also sandwiched in a 10-assist, three-turnover game against No. 16 Oklahoma as he led the Tigers to the exciting overtime victory in Columbia. On the season, Horton has handed out 93 assists in 26 games played, just four shy of eclipsing the Tigers' assists leader from last season (Jimmy McKinney - 97 assists in 30 games).

Over the Table and Dreaming

The University of Missouri marketing staff, headed up by marketing guru Frank Cuervo, is kicking around the idea of a new promotion for Tiger men's basketball games. Besides the 'Nothing-but-Noodles Kiss Cam' and the Chevy's Fresh Mex 'Tiger Trivia' promotion which are both wildly popular, there has been some thought to a promotion that the winner gets to have Tiger senior guard Jason Conley land in their lap after one of his patented leaps over Tiger Row.

Conley ended up amongst the people twice during the Oklahoma contest, running headlong over the table while attempting to create another Sooner turnover. The Tiger faithful were very appreciative of the effort put forth by Conley as he earned a standing ovation both times he sacrificed life and limb.

A Tale of Two Halves - the Bizarro Edition

Mizzou continued its up and down play from half to half against Colorado. After scoring just 18 points and shooting just 27.3 percent in the first half, Mizzou was on fire in the second half knocking down 13-of-25 (52.0 percent) including five three pointers while outscoring the Buffaloes 45-30 to win the contest 63-54.

After shooting just 41 percent in the first half against Nebraska, the Tigers trailed at halftime, 27-21. However, Mizzou was able to turn the switch on once again, shooting 54.2 percent in the second half as they outscored the Huskers 35-26 in the second stanza to grab its first road win of the season.

The Tigers reversed a trend and then reversed their fortunes against Oklahoma. After leading each of their previous three games and then dropping all three, Mizzou trailed by 11 points at half time before mounting an amazing second half comeback to take down the Sooners. After trailing by as many as 15 points, Mizzou used excellent second half defense, holding OU to just 36.8 percent shooting (7-of-19) from the floor while outrebounding Oklahoma by 13 boards. The Tiger's used staunch interior defense in the second stanza, holding OU's Taj Gray and Kevin Bookout to just eight points and three rebounds between the two of them in the second half and overtime periods.

Tigers Set School Record for Team GPA in Fall Semester

The University of Missouri men's basketball team continues to achieve both on and off the court this season. With final grades et for the 2004 fall semester at Mizzou, the reports show that the men's basketball team has established a record for its team grade point average. Bryan Maggard, MU's Associate Athletic Director for Academic Services, says that the Tiger men's team came in with a cumulative team GPA of 2.91 this past fall - which was the highest single semester mark in recorded history for an MU men's basketball squad.

According to Maggard, four Tiger cagers had GPAs of over 3.0 on the standard 4.0 scale, and two

will earn a place on the coveted Dean's List.

The achievement comes on the heels of the 2004 NCAA Graduation Report, which shows that the Missouri men's basketball team led the Big 12 Conference in graduation rates, at 67%. The next-best rate in the league belonged to Colorado (40%), followed by Texas Tech and Kansas (33%) and Nebraska (20%). The rates represent students who enrolled in 1997-98 and graduated within six years.

Shouldering the Load

Linus Kleiza has recovered fully from a shoulder separation he experienced half way through last season and he has shouldered a major part of the Tiger offense this season. The All-Big 12 Preseason Honorable Mention recipient has been amazing offensively so far this season and continues to improve on defense.

He moved into third on the Big 12 double-doubles list against Colorado when he scored 10 points and pulled down 10 rebounds against the Buffs. The native of Kaunas, Lithuania continued to have his way with Nebraska, scoring a game-high 15 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the field. Kleiza also had a huge day against No. 16 Oklahoma, tying Thomas Gardner for team-high honors with 18 points while also pulling down 13 boards in the win.

He returned to the Tiger starting lineup after a three-game hiatus against UNLV. He scored a game-high 24 points and also pulled down eight rebounds against the Rebels and knocked down 9-of-17 shots.

He registered his fifth double-double of the season against Kansas State in Columbia, scoring 11 points and pulling down 11 rebounds on the night.

Kleiza put together an amazing effort against Nebraska in Columbia, scoring a career-best 31 points on 8-of-12 shooting from the field. He also knocked down 15-of-17 free throws against the Huskers on his way to his fourth double-double of the season.

Despite four turnovers against Texas Tech, Kleiza was able to record his third double-double of the season against the Red Raiders, scoring 10 points and pulling down 12 rebounds.

After struggling to just four points in the first half against Kansas State, Kleiza scored 10 of his team-high 14 points while also pulling down eight rebounds against KSU. The offensive juggernaut reached the 20-point plateau for the fourth time this season against Oklahoma State when he dumped in 24 points while going a perfect 13-of-13 from the free throw line. Kleiza scored 25 (of Mizzou's 64) points, pulled down seven rebounds and handed out three assists against Illinois.

After scoring just three points in the opening half against Indiana, Kleiza poured in 15 of his game-high 18 points in the second half including 12 free throws in the win.

He had one the best offensive game of his career against Montana, scoring a then career-best 26 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the field. He broke out of mini-scoring funk with 13 points, nine boards and nine assists against Oakland while turning the ball over just one time, something he has been focusing on improving all season. He is definitely Mizzou's most versatile player as he leads the team in scoring (15.3 ppg.), rebounds (7.3 rpg.) and is fourth on the squad in assists (45).

The Youth of the Tiger Nation

The freshmen on the Tiger roster have started to really assert themselves on the court for Mizzou. Over the course of the last 20 games, Marshall Brown, Kalen Grimes, Jason Horton and Glen Dandridge have combined to score 27.0 percent of the Tigers points (378-of-1398) and all four of them have set or equaled career highs in points during that stretch.

Horton was amazing in the second half against Colorado. He knocked down three straight three-point field goals and scored 14 points in the second half as the Tigers took the game over. Horton and Brown combined to score 12 of their 14 points against Nebraska in the second half. Horton was clutch in the Tigers' contest against Baylor as he poured in 15 points on 5-of-6 shooting while Grimes registered six points in 11 minutes in the Mizzou win. Horton had the best floor game of his career against No. 16 Oklahoma, handing out 10 assists while committing only three turnovers in 42 minutes of playing time. He was also amazing at Texas A&M, knocking down 5-of-6 three point shots on his way to 17 points against the Aggies.

Brown and Dandridge both started their second straight games at Kansas and combined to score 12 points on the night. Dandridge made his first career start in the Tigers' home contest against Kansas State. He knocked down a three and equaled a career best by playing 16 minutes in the contest.

Brown was outstanding against Colorado, knocking down 3-of-3 three point attempts and pulling down eight rebounds against the Buffs. He scored a career-best 12 points in the Tigers loss to Texas Tech. He knocked down two threes and was also 2-of-2 from the free throw line. Horton equaled a then career high with 12 points for the second straight game against Iowa State. He and Brown had great outings against American. Horton scored a career-best 12 points while Brown chipped in with nine as the Tigers took out the Eagles. The foursome was great against Gonzaga, combining for 16 points and 10 rebounds. Horton scored six points and handed out three assists and recorded no turnovers in 37 minutes while running the Tiger offense. Dandridge and Grimes also had solid nights. Dandridge scored five points on 2-of-3 shooting while also recording a steal, a block and an assist in seven minutes of playing time while Grimes set a career-best with six rebounds.

the post season in each of the last five seasons including four trips to the NCAA Tournament. Mizzou has averaged exactly 20.0 wins per contest during Snyder's five-year tenure at Mizzou. The intense competitor the Tiger players call "Coach Q" won his 100th career game last season when Mizzou defeated Texas A&M in the Big 12 Tournament. He became the fourth coach in Mizzou school history to reach the 100-win plateau and Snyder will have a great opportunity to add to that total with a contract that will keep him as a fixture on the Tiger bench through 2007-08.

In 2004-05, Mizzou returns several of its top players including senior Jason Conley, junior Jimmy McKinney and sophomores Thomas Gardner and Linas Kleiza. Snyder and his staff also gathered a sixth straight Top 25 recruiting class to augment the already talented roster. Mizzou has moved to a new state-of-the-art home this season, the Mizzou Arena, which holds around 15,000 rowdy Missouri fans and gives the Tigers an unbelievable opportunity to build on the foundation of success that has been established.

Given the success and excitement Snyder's squads have generated in his five years at the helm, it is not surprising that Tiger fans are looking for big things from Mizzou in 2004-05. In 2003-04, Snyder led the Tigers to wins over Top 20 teams such as Oklahoma State and Oklahoma. He also saw his second recruiting class of Arthur Johnson, Rickey Paulding, Travon Bryant and Josh Kroenke complete outstanding careers at Mizzou. Johnson and Paulding both jumped into the Top 10 on the Tiger scoring charts and Johnson finished his career as the Tigers' all-time leader in blocked shots and rebounds. That outstanding class also finished their career having played in the most NCAA Tournament contests of any class in school history with eight.

A native of the Pacific Northwest, Snyder, 37, attended Mercer Island High School in the state of Washington. A two-time state player of the year, Snyder led the team to the 1985 state championship. During this time, Mercer Island achieved a No. 1 ranking in USA Today's high school polls. Snyder was named a McDonald's All-America player, being the first ever chosen from the state of Washington.

Snyder and his wife, the former Helen Redwine, a native of Charlotte, N.C, have one son, Owen Redwine Snyder, born on December 25, 2002.

Tigers Open Season With Win Over Brown

Gardner scores 19 points pulls down 12 boards in victory

Nov. 15, 2004

Thomas Gardner had 19 points and 12 rebounds for his first career double double, helping Missouri pull away in the second half for a 68-60 victory over pesky Brown in the opening round of the Guardians Classic on Monday night.

The Tigers, who shot 35 percent in their first regular-season game in the new Paige Sports Arena, will play Houston in the second round on Tuesday night. Houston rallied from a 10-point second-half deficit to beat Sam Houston State 72-69 earlier Monday.

Linus Kleiza added 17 points and nine rebounds for Missouri, which trailed by five in the first half and struggled to adjust to Brown's 2-3 defense. The Tigers were 3-for-18 from 3-point range midway through the second half before finally starting to connect, finishing 7-for-26.

Damon Huffman had 16 points for Brown, shorthanded without Ivy League player of the year Jason Forte, a point guard, who is suspended indefinitely for conduct detrimental to the team.

Brown compensated for Forte's absence by going 11-for-21 from 3-point range. Huffman was 5-for-7 and Adolphe Coulibaly was 3-for-3 and added 11 points.

Gardner, a 6-5 guard, was 2-for-8 in the first half and missed all five of his 3-point attempts. He was 5-for-8 the rest of the way, including 3-for-5 from long range, and he also had four assists. He had five offensive rebounds.

Gardner and Jimmy McKinney hit consecutive 3-pointers to give Missouri, which led only 33-32 at halftime, a 49-40 lead with 12 minutes to go. Brown answered with a 3-pointer by Huffman with 11:15 left but never got any closer.

That was typical of Brown, which also quickly responded to Missouri's best play of the game. A steal and behind-the-back pass from Spencer Laurie to Glen Dandridge for a dunk put the Tigers ahead 33-29 with 40 seconds left in the first half, but Ruscoe, hardly rattled, hit a 3-pointer 16 seconds later.

Columbia, MO - Linas Kleiza had 19 points and 14 rebounds and Missouri outscored Houston 20-1 over a 6 minute span that began near the end of the first half of a 77-61 victory over Houston in the second round of the Guardians Classic on Tuesday night.

Missouri (2-0) endured a first-half stretch in which it made one basket in more than 11 minutes and fell behind by five points. The Tigers had little trouble scoring the rest of the game, shooting 50 percent and going 12-for-23 from 3-point range.

Missouri hit only three of its first 18 from long range in the opening round against Brown.

Thomas Gardner scored all but three of his 18 points in the second half for the Tigers, who advanced to the semifinals on Tuesday in Kansas City. Jimmy McKinney had 16 points and Jason Conley 14, and Kleiza added five assists.

Andre Owens had 16 points and Lanny Smith 14 for Houston (1-1), which last faced Missouri in 1982. Houston rallied from a 10-point second half deficit in the first round against Sam Houston State for its first season-opening victory since 1999, but never threatened a repeat comeback.

The Cougars led 29-24 with 3:47 left in the first half before the roof caved in. Jason Conley had a 3-pointer at the end of the half and another at the start of the second half of the run that gave Missouri a comfortable 44-30 lead with 15:30 to play. The lead grew to as many as 21 points later in the half, a 62-41 bulge with 7:36 left.

Missouri totaled four points during its first-half dry spell, a basket by Kevin Young and two free throws, before heating up. The Tigers have had double double outings in each of the first two games. Gardner had the first of his career on Monday with 19 points and 12 rebounds and has come off the bench both games.

Kleiza had three double doubles as a freshman last season and missed one in the opener by only one rebound.

Columbia, MO - Jimmy McKinney scored 12 points and Jason Conley added 11, leading Missouri to a 59-55 victory over Murray State on Sunday.

Thomas Gardner had 10 points for the Tigers (3-3), whose win in the newly-renamed Mizzou Arena broke a three-game losing streak.

After a 12-2 run gave Murray State (2-1) a 46-39 lead with 7:55 left, Missouri responded with an 16-4 rally for a 55-50 lead.

Conley scored the Tigers' first eight points in the run, and McKinney hit a 3-pointer with 4:55 left to put the Tigers up 50-48.

But after Linas Kleiza's 3-pointer with 10:47 left in the half gave the Tigers a 20-5 lead, Missouri went scoreless until Kevin Young's layup with 3:02 to go.

The Blue Racers went on a 13-0 run during the Tigers' slump and trailed by a point, 27-26, at the half.

Pearson led Murray State with 16 points and Issian Redding added 15.

Kleiza goes for 25 in loss

St. Louis, MO - Top-ranked Illinois faced adversity for the first time this season. Luther Head scored 20 points and Deron Williams scored nine of his 19 points over the final 3:19 to help the Illini overcome foul problems, poor shooting and a second-half surge by the Tigers.

Roger Powell Jr. had 14 points and Williams added five assists in a balanced attack for Illinois (11-0), which matched its season worst for shooting at 42.3 percent but won its fifth game since moving to No. 1. The Fighting Illini have won five straight in the annual neutral-site game.

This was their closest call of the season by far after they entered the game with an average margin of victory of 22 points.

Before Wednesday, the closest any opponent had come to beating Illinois was Arkansas which lost by 12 points. Illinois had been shooting 53 percent, the best in the nation.

Linus Kleiza had 25 points, one off his career best, for Missouri. He was in double figures at the free throw line for the second straight game, going 11-for-13, and added seven rebounds and three assists.

He also helped put the Illinois frontline in foul trouble by bullying inside for shots.

Missouri (6-5) trailed by 15 points at halftime for the second straight game. On Sunday, the Tigers were able to rally for a three-point victory over Indiana and this time they put a scare into Illinois, shaving the deficit to five points with just under 8 minutes left and then to four on Jason Horton's 3-pointer with 14 seconds to go.

Mizzou Upsets No. 12/21 Gonzaga in Columbia

Conley records first career double-double

Columbia, MO - Jason Conley had 16 points and 13 rebounds, and Missouri survived a lengthy cold stretch at the finish to hang on and beat No. 12 Gonzaga 63-61 on Thursday night.

Linus Kleiza added 11 points despite foul trouble for Missouri (7-5), which scored just two points in the final 8 minutes.

Missouri, in its first action since losing by six to top-ranked Illinois on Dec. 22, improved to 16-38 against teams in the Top 25 in six seasons under Quin Snyder. It was also the Tigers' first victory over a ranked opponent since they beat Oklahoma State in double-overtime last Feb. 24 at home.

Ronny Turiaf, who averages a team-leading 19 points for Gonzaga, missed two free throws with a chance to tie it with 8.4 seconds left. Turiaf, battling two ankle injuries, had six points on 2-for-15 shooting along with nine rebounds.

Turiaf also missed badly on another chance to tie, a driving layup with about 3 seconds left that banged high off the side of the backboard. Gonzaga (10-2) had been given another shot when Missouri's Kalen Grimes missed two free throws with 7.6 seconds left.

Reserve J.P. Batista had 17 points and 10 rebounds for Gonzaga, which was unable to follow up on a 3-point upset at No. 3 Oklahoma State on Tuesday.

Missouri held Gonzaga, which had been shooting 52 percent, to 38 percent accuracy. That defense helped make a 61-51 lead with 8:27 left stand up.

Kevin Young's layup had capped a 10-2 run by Missouri that seemingly put them in control. The Tigers' only points the rest of the way came on one free throw apiece by Marshall Brown and Young.

In the last 2:12, Young missed three of four.

Gonzaga beat Missouri in overtime last December in Seattle.

Improve to 8-2 at Mizzou Arena in 2004-05

Columbia, MO - Jason Conley had 12 points and 10 rebounds for his second straight double-double, and the second of his career, helping Missouri beat American 64-51 on Tuesday night.

Thomas Gardner added 14 points and Jason Horton scored all but two of his career-best 12 points in the first half to get the Tigers (8-5) off to a good start in their final game before beginning Big 12 play. Missouri opens at home on Saturday against Iowa State.

The Tigers won despite a sub-par outing from leading scorer Linas Kleiza, who missed all six of his shots from the field and was held to five free throws. Kleiza had averaged 20 points over the previous four games.

Conley's follow-up to a 16-point, 13-rebound effort against Gonzaga, plus a defense that held American to 35 percent shooting, helped compensate. Missouri, which was 10-of-22 (46 percent) from 3-point range and 18-for-53 (34 percent) otherwise, has won four in a row at the new Mizzou Arena.

Missouri led by as many as 16 points in the second half, although American twice shaved the deficit to six. The Tigers went more than five minutes between baskets to allow the Eagles back into the game.

Missouri shot only 37 percent in the first half but was 7-for-11 from 3-point range to take a 33-21 lead at halftime. Four of the 3-pointers came in the final 2:44 on a half-ending 16-2 run that erased American's 19-17 lead.

The Tigers were only 3-for-16 inside the 3-point line in the first half.

Two players, Ingram with 13 points and Thomas with six, scored all but two of American's first-half points.

Mizzou Opens Big 12 Play with Win Over Iowa State

Four Tigers reach double figures

Jan. 8, 2004

Columbia, MO - Jimmy McKinney scored four points in the final 27 seconds, helping Missouri overcome a 12-minute span without a basket in a wild 62-59 victory over Iowa State in a Big 12 opener on Saturday.

Jason Conley had 13 points, Linas Kleiza had 12 points and nine rebounds and Jason Horton had 12 points for Missouri (9-5, 1-0 Big 12). The Tigers endured a 28-4 Iowa State run that transformed a 12-point lead into a 12-point deficit with 4:34 to go, then ended the game on a 17-2 run.

McKinney, who had 10 points, scored on a spinning shot in the lane with 27 seconds left to put Missouri ahead for good at 60-59 although he missed a chance at a three-point play. He added two free throws with 13 seconds left.

Iowa State (8-4, 0-1) had two chances in the final seconds. Curtis Stinson turned it over near the Cyclones' bench with 16.8 seconds to go and reserve John Neal missed a 3-pointer with one second left.

Stinson had 22 points for Iowa State, which has lost 26 straight Big 12 road games dating to February 2001. Will Blalock added 12 points, five assists and four steals.

Iowa State is 0-4 on the road this season.

Missouri won its eighth straight conference home opener and its fifth in six games overall despite committing 20 turnovers, one off their season worst, against Iowa State's sticky zone defense. At times during the drought, the Tigers struggled just to get a shot off.

Missouri led by as many as 13 points early in the second half before going cold. The Tigers led 41-29 after Horton hit in the lane with 16:36 to go, and he made the next one a 3-pointer with 4:04 left that started Missouri's final run.

Missouri shot 54 percent in the first half and took advantage of an Iowa State drought to take a 33-24 lead. Iowa State scored only six points in the final nine minutes before the break and Kleiza scored six himself in that span for Missouri.

Stillwater, OK - Joey Graham scored a season-high 27 points, John Lucas added 18 and Eddie Sutton tied his mentor Henry Iba for seventh place on the career victories list as No. 6 Oklahoma State beat Missouri 78-68 on Tuesday night.

The Cowboys (12-1, 2-0 Big 12) took the lead for good with two free throws from Stephen Graham midway through the second half and held off the Tigers (9-6, 1-1), who moved within a point on three occasions.

Terrence Crawford drained two free throws to start a 6-0 run that gave Oklahoma State its largest lead of the second half, 69-61 with just under 4 minutes to play.

Crawford added a runout, two-handed jam and Stephen Graham finished the surge with a reverse layup and the orange-clad crowd could taste Sutton's landmark win.

Linas Kleiza scored 24 points to lead Missouri. He fought off endless boos following an early technical foul and his tough inside play helped cause two Oklahoma State defenders to foul out.

Stephen Graham finished with 13 points for Oklahoma State, which had lost to the Tigers each of the previous two seasons, including a 93-92 loss in double overtime last season in Missouri.

The teams traded leads five times within a frenetic, 2-minute span midway through the second half after Jason Conley's steal and fastbreak layup tied it at 43.

After Joey Graham hit two free throws to put Oklahoma State ahead, Jason Horton hit a 3-pointer from the right wing to give the Tigers a 46-45 lead with 13 minutes to play.

Lucas scored on three straight possessions for Oklahoma State as the Cowboys went up 51-48, but Missouri got inside baskets from Marshall Brown and Kleiza to pull back ahead 52-51.

It was the last time the Tigers would lead.

Tigers Lost Third Straight to Texas Tech

Kleiza records his third double-double of the season

Columbia, MO - Ronald Ross led a balanced attack with 22 points and Texas Tech held Missouri without a basket for more than 12 minutes in the second half of a 78-62 victory on Wednesday night.

Devonne Giles added 17 points and eight rebounds for Texas Tech (11-4, 3-1 Big 12), which shot 52 percent and has won six of seven. Jarrius Jackson had all but two of his 17 points in the first half and Martin Zeno had 16 points, six assists and five rebounds.

Texas Tech coach Bobby Knight is 4-1 against Missouri's Quin Snyder and broke the Tigers' modest five-game winning streak at the new Mizzou Arena, where they're 9-3 overall, having also lost to Arkansas and Davidson.

Missouri (9-8, 1-3) was 1-for-10 with eight turnovers in the first 13 minutes and 45 seconds of the second half, finally ending its frustration with a layup by Marshall Brown with 6:15 to go to cut the deficit to 63-49.

At the start of Missouri's cold stretch, Zeno and Ross had five points apiece in a 16-3 run that put Texas Tech ahead 57-42 with 10:13 to go. Texas Tech led by as many as 20 points in the waning minutes.

Linas Kleiza had 10 points and 12 rebounds for Missouri, which has lost three in a row and fell by 20 at Kansas State in its last game on Saturday. Reserve Marshall Brown had 12 points and Thomas Gardner added 11.

Missouri was 4-for-20 from 3-point range, and over the last two games the Tigers are 9-for-46 (19 percent).

Texas Tech made the most of Missouri's 19 turnovers, scoring 25 points off those miscues.

The Red Raiders shot 50 percent in the first half and got 15 points from Jackson for a 40-34 lead. The Red Raiders led by as many as 10 points.

St. Louis Cardinals star Albert Pujols attended the game, accompanied by trainers for the city's three professional teams, the Cardinals, Rams and Blues. Former Missouri coach Norm Stewart, now a TV commentator, was recognized a day early for his 70th birthday.

Mizzou Topples Nebraska, 80-70

Kleiza scores career-best 31 points and pulls down 10 boards in win

Jan. 22, 2004

Columbia, MO - Linas Kleiza had a career-high 31 points and 10 rebounds and Missouri held Nebraska to five points in an eight-minute span of the second half of an 80-70 victory on Saturday.

Thomas Gardner added 17 points and Jimmy McKinney had 13 for Missouri (10-8, 2-3 Big 12), which ended a three-game losing streak - the last two by a combined 36 points. Missouri has beaten Nebraska 10 straight times at home and coach Quin Snyder is 10-2 against the Cornhuskers.

Missouri, which shot 54 percent and had a decided edge at the free throw line, hasn't had a four-game losing streak since the 1997-98 season. The Tigers were 26-for-31 at the line, while Nebraska was 8-for-10.

Joe McCray had 16 points and reserve Aleks Maric had 14 for Nebraska (8-7, 2-3), which failed to capitalize on a two-point loss at No. 2 Kansas on Wednesday.

McCray and Missouri point guard Jason Horton clashed briefly at the end of the game before being restrained by coaches. Missouri had been running out the clock when McCray tried for a steal.

Kleiza had seven points in an 18-5 run that started with Missouri leading by a point with 12:28 to play. Kleiza and Gardner had three-point plays and Horton hit a 3-pointer to help the Tigers take a 70-56 lead with 4:24 left.

It was the second straight double double and fourth of the season for Kleiza, who was 8-for-12 from the field and 15-for-17 from the line. The previous career best for the sophomore forward was 26 points Dec. 11 against Montana.

McCray, who entered the game tied for the Big 12 3-point lead, was 3-for-10 from long range to set a school freshman record with 47, breaking the mark of 44 by Eric Piatkowski in 1990-91.

Gardner had 12 points in a seesaw first half and his 3-pointer at the buzzer gave Missouri a 38-37 lead.

McKinney scores 14 in loss

Columbia, MO - Jeremiah Massey scored 17 points and Kansas State overcame a 19-0 Missouri run Saturday to beat the Tigers 64-53.

Fred Peete added 16 points and Lance Harris 14 for the Wildcats (13-4, 3-3 Big 12). Jimmy McKinney had 14 points for Missouri (10-10, 2-5), which lost for the fifth time in six games. The win was the first for Kansas State in Columbia since 1985.

Just as in a 74-54 loss at Kansas State on Jan. 15, Missouri was eager to shoot the 3, no matter how unsuccessful. The Tigers were 5-for-26 from 3-point range two weeks ago and 5-for-29 Saturday.

McKinney scored the game's first seven points and Missouri went ahead 14-2. But after cutting the margin to 16-8, the Wildcats switched from a man-to-man defense to a 2-3 zone that gave Missouri fits.

Kansas State went on a 20-5 run to take a 28-21 lead with 4:21 to go in the first half on Lance Harris' 3-pointer. Those were the last points for the Wildcats for nearly nine minutes.

Missouri got to within 28-26 at halftime and tied the game on Thomas Gardner's 10-footer 19 seconds into the second half. The Tigers scored the next 12 points as well, extending the run to 19-0, culminating on Jason Conley's free throws with 15:59 to play.

Then it was Missouri's turn to go cold as the Tigers endured their own 5:22 scoreless stretch while Kansas State scored 12 unanswered points to tie it 40-40 with 10:57 to play.

Kansas State went ahead for good on Massey's put-back tip-in with 7:15 to play. The 6-foot-7 senior scored eight of the Wildcats' final 17 points.

Missouri coach Quin Snyder shook up the lineup, perhaps sending a message after mostly lackluster play during a 1-4 stretch entering the game. Leading scorer and rebounder Linas Kleiza was replaced by Marshall Brown and didn't appear until nearly six minutes into the game. Guard Jason Horton was replaced by freshman Glen Dandridge.

Missou Topples No. 16 Oklahoma in Overtime

Gardner hits two threes in overtime to seal the deal
Feb. 12, 2005

Columbia, MO - No second-half swoon for Missouri this time.

Thomas Gardner scored 11 of his 18 points in the final 2 minutes of regulation and the overtime, helping Missouri end a five-game losing streak with a 68-65 victory over No. 16 Oklahoma on Saturday.

Kevin Young's layup with 1:17 left was the go-ahead basket for the Tigers (11-13, 3-7 Big 12), who twice rallied from double-digit deficits in the second half. Missouri trailed by as many as 14 points before storming back and won despite hitting only one of six free throws in overtime, the one by Linus Kleiza for a three-point lead with 16 seconds to go.

But Gardner hit four of his last five shots, three from 3-point range, down the stretch. And Missouri had perhaps its best defensive effort, swarming shooters in the second half, and outrebounding Oklahoma 35-30 after the Sooners had a nine-rebound advantage in the first half.

Kleiza had 18 points and 13 rebounds for Missouri, which won for only the second time in 10 games overall. Snyder raised his record against the Sooners to 3-8.

Jason Conley added 10 points, eight rebounds and seven assists for the Tigers, and Jason Horton had 10 assists.

Taj Gray had 19 points, nine rebounds and four blocks for Oklahoma, which has lost four of five. Terrell Everett added 11 points.

Missouri outscored Oklahoma 14-4 over the final 5:39 of regulation. Gardner got the last two baskets, a fastbreak layup with 1:47 left and 3-pointer for the tie with 55 seconds left.

The Tigers missed three shots on the final possession of regulation, a runner by Conley, a tip by Kleiza and an off-balance shot by Kleiza with about a second left.

Missouri erased an 11-point halftime deficit that grew to 14 points in the first 1:15 of the second half with a 12-0 spurt that produced a 45-44 lead with 9:06 to go. It was spurred by scrappy defense and a public address announcer that excitedly counted down the Oklahoma lead with each basket.

Oklahoma scored the next 11 points for a 10-point lead with 5:39 to go, holding Missouri to 0-for-4 shooting with two turnovers. But the Sooners were hanging on at the end of regulation.

Tigers Win Fourth Straight against CU

Four Tigers score in double figures in win

Feb. 22, 2005

Columbia, MO - Jason Horton made three straight 3-pointers midway through the second half, helping Missouri blow open a close game and beat Colorado 63-54 on Tuesday night.

Horton scored 14 points - all in the second half. Jason Conley had 13 for the Tigers, while Linas Kleiza added 10 points and 10 rebounds, his seventh double-double of the season.

Jayson Obazuaye had 16 points and Glean Eddy added 13 points and 10 rebounds for Colorado. Richard Roby, Colorado's leading scorer with a 16-point average, scored nine points. He fouled out with 4:12 to play.

Missouri (14-13, 6-7 Big 12) has followed a five-game losing streak with a four-game winning streak. If the Tigers can win their final three regular-season games - at Texas on Saturday, at Iowa State on March 2 and against No. 8 Kansas on March 6 - they could be back in contention for an NCAA bid.

The Buffaloes (13-12, 4-9) beat Missouri 64-62 on Jan. 26, but came into this game short-handed. Coach Ricardo Patton announced Monday that four players - Julius Ashby, Marcus Hall, Chris Copeland and Martane Freeman - were suspended for the Missouri game for violating team rules. Patton did not specify the violation.

Copeland is second on the team in scoring at 12.6 points per game, Hall leads the Buffaloes in assists at 4.4 per game, and Ashby is the leading rebounder at 6.1 per game.

The short bench appeared to catch up with Colorado in the second half.

The Buffaloes built a 24-18 lead during a sloppy first half, when Missouri committed 10 turnovers and shot 27 percent (6-of-22). The Tigers were 3-for-14 from 3-point range in the first half against Colorado's matchup zone.

Missouri tied it 26-26 4 minutes into the second half on Horton's short jumper. The Tigers went ahead for good at 33-31 with 12:25 to play on Marshall Brown's jumper. Brown's putback 30 seconds later gave Missouri a four-point lead, then Horton scored the Tigers' next nine points during a 15-3 run that made it 46-34 with 7:57 to play.
