SCOUTING THE BUFFALOES

Colorado comes into Saturday's matchup having won four straight and six of the last seven, with the only loss coming to conference leader Kansas State. The Buffaloes are 19-8 overall and 11-6 in the Big 12 Conference. Five of their six losses in the Big 12 have come against teams ranked in the Top 25, including a three-game loss to Missouri on Oct. 22 when the Tigers were ranked No. 24. Maragda Santillana leads CU with a 3.47 kills per game mark followed by Monique Gerlach who averages 3.44 kills per game and has a .326 hitting percentage. Gerlach also has a 2.26 digs per game average and is averaging 0.90 blocks per game.

THE MU-CU SERIES

Mizzou has won just six times in 34 meetings with Colorado, but has won five of the last seven. Last season, MU defeated the Buffaloes in Boulder for its first ever win on CU's home floor. The Tigers won the first meeting between the schools in 1986, then lost the next 26 matches with the Buffs.

A LOOK BACK

The Mizzou volleyball team took only an hour and nine minutes to record its 14th straight win over Iowa State with a 3-0 (30-9, 30-19, 30-16) sweep on Wednesday. The Tigers are now 18-9 on the year and 11-7 in the Big 12 Conference with two matches left in the regular season.

Lisa Boyd led the way for MU on Wednesday night. She had nine kills and a .818 hitting percentage in the opening game of the match on her way to a career-high 20 kills. Boyd hit .621 for the match and added a team-high six blocks (two solo and four assisted).

The 30-9 game one victory for Mizzou was the largest margin of victory for the Tigers in a Big 12 Conference match since the NCAA went to rally scoring in 2001. Mizzou jumped out to a quick 9-3 lead with an 8-0 that included three aces by Juliana Godoi. Godoi finished the night with career-high six aces. As a team the Tigers recorded 15 aces, just two shy of the school record for aces in a three-game match.

Mizzou continued to control the match in games two and three, picking up its first three-game sweep since defeating Colorado on Oct. 22. Shen Danru and Jessica Vander Kooi each reach double digits in digs with 16 and 11, respectively. Each also added eight kills for the Tigers.

Lindsey Hunter had 38 assists and a .714 hitting percentage on seven attacks. Following Godoi in the aces category was Nicole Wilson with four, while Hunter and Vander Kooi each had two.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SELECTION SHOW

The 64-team field for the 2003 NCAA Tournament will be announced at 7 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 30 on ESPNEWS.

Mizzou will be looking for its fourth straight selection to the postseason tournament.

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DOUBLE PLAY

Four players have recorded double-doubles for MU this season led by Shen Danru, who has 15 double-doubles on the year, second most in the Big 12 Conference. Lindsey Hunter has 10 and Jessica Vander Kooi has nine this season. All three had double-doubles against Texas on Oct. 29 led by Danru (24 kills, 16 digs). FIVE SELECTED TO ACADEMIC ALL-BIG 12 TEAM

Mizzou volleyball senior Juliana Godoi and sophomores Lisa Boyd, Lindsey Hunter, Shen Danru and Lindsey Noll have been named to the Academic All-Big 12 Team, as announced by the conference on Tuesday. Godoi, Boyd, Danru and Hunter were first team selections and Noll was named to the second team.

Godoi is a interdisciplinary studies major from Sao Paulo, Brazil. Boyd, a native of Farmington, Mo., majors in secondary education at MU. Hunter is majoring in pre-journalism from Papillion, Neb. and currently leads the Big 12 Conference with a 12.43 assists per game average. Danru is a general agricultural major from Shanghai, China and ast week was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District VII Team. Noll is an elementary education major from St. Louis, Mo.

A BIT ABOUT BOYD

Lisa Boyd leads Missouri with a .289 hitting percentage and had a career night on Wednesday against Iowa State. In that match, Boyd had a career-best 20 kills and hit .621. She added two solo blocks and four block assists against the Cyclones. She hit at least .330 in five of Missouri's first six matches this year. She had a career-high .667 mark against Toledo in the Tiger Invitational. Boyd hit .375 in the three matches at the Utah Classic and had a then-career-high 12 kills to lead the team against Utah Valley State. She had 10 kills and a .429 hitting percentage against Utah in the final match of the tournament. For the season, Boyd has a 2.54 kills per game average. Boyd had 11 kills and hit .421 against Oklahoma. She set a new career high against Texas A&M with 16 kills and followed that with a 15-kill night against Kansas.

DANRU NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Shen Danru has been named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District VII First Team. It marks the fourth time that a Tiger has earned Academic All-District honors. The previous three selections were earned by Lisa Morris, who was named to the team in 2000, 2001 and 2002.

Danru, an outside hitter from Shanghai, China, leads the Tigers in kills, digs and aces per game and is near the top of the Big 12 in each of those categories. Her 0.51 aces per game mark leads the conference.

GODOI MATE

To say that senior Juliana Godoi brings experience to the team would be an understatement. Godoi is 26 years old and has been an All-American and has won a National Championship for Columbia College of the NAIA before joining Missouri last season. She was a member of the 1999 NAIA National Championship Cougars and was the only player on that team to play in all 121 games. The next season, Godoi earned NAIA All-American honors and was named to the All-National Tournament Team.

Godoi joined Missouri last season and set a career-high with 22 digs against Kansas. She matched that career high this year as she recorded 22 digs in Mizzou's win over No. 8 Nebraska on Oct. 15. She recorded 20 digs on Nov. 1 against Texas A&M for the third 20-dig match of her career. Godoi also has an 0.38 aces per game mark, which is third best in the Big 12 Conference. She had a career high in aces on Wednesday with six against Iowa State.

FRESHMAN ORIENTATION

Freshmen Jessica Vander Kooi and Nicole Wilson have stepped into the lineup for the Tigers this year and made major impacts this season.

Vander Kooi has started every match for MU this year and is third on the team with nine double-doubles on the year. She is averaging 2.30 kills, 2.82 digs and 0.78 blocks per game this season. Her first double-double came against Kansas when she had 12 kills and 16 digs. She followed that with a then-career-high 21 kills with 11 digs against Kansas State on Oct. 8. Vander Kooi set a new career high with 22 kills in the second match with Kansas on Nov. 5.

Wilson averages 1.72 kills per game and leads the team with a 0.97 blocks per game average. Wilson had a career-high in solo blocks (2) and block assists (9) in the match against the Wildcats. She led Mizzou against Oklahoma with a .857 hitting percentage and has a .260 mark for the year. Wilson had two solo blocks and six block assists along with a .471 hitting percentage against Colorado. She followed that with a solo block and six block assists against Texas Tech.

THE KREK-LOW DOWN

Missouri Head Coach Susan Kreklow's winning percentage of .805 is the best among active coaches with at least five years of coaching experience. Kreklow is also second in total wins among active women's volleyball coaches with 542 in her career. When those are added in, she has a combined record of 597-145.

ACES WILD

The Tigers have set records in the service game this season and lead the Big 12 in aces per game. Missouri tied a Utah Classic tournament record on Sept. 5 by recording 12 service aces, while holding Utah Valley State to just one. Jessica Vander Kooi led Mizzou with five aces in the match. Mizzou was just two short of the school record for aces in a three-game match by recording 15 against Iowa State on Wednesday. MU leads the Big 12 Conference with an 2.13 aces per game average and are more than a full .10 point ahead of second-place Nebraska. Three Tigers hold spots near the top of the Big 12 standing for aces per game led by Shen Danru who averages 0.51 aces per game, which is second in the conference. Juliana Godoi is third (0.43) and Lindsey Hunter is seventh (0.40).

PARKS DIGS IT

Sara Parks is second on the team with a 3.27 digs per game average. Since the start of the Big 12 Conference portion of the schedule, Parks, the Tigers' libero, has averaged 3.32 digs per game which is seventh best in the conference. She had a career high with 26 digs on Nov. 1 against Texas A&M. She has had 10 or more digs in 18 matches this year and 15 or more digs nine times. Parks has reached double digits in digs in the last 11 matches and has had at least 10 digs in 14 of the last 15 of Mizzou's matches.

CONFERENCE CALL

Missouri is near the top of many of the major statistic categories in the Big 12 Conference. Mizzou leads the Big 12 in aces per game with a 2.13 aces per game average. The Tigers are third in blocks per game (2.64), digs per game (16.31) and opponent hitting percentage (.171). MU is fourth in kills per game (15.72) and fifth in assists per game (14.10) and hitting percentage (.246).

The Tigers have had even more success in Big 12 Conference matches only. Mizzou is second in aces per game (1.81) and digs per game (17.14). It is third in blocks per game (2.74), fourth in kills per game (15.65) and fifth in assists (14.22) and hitting percentage (.236).

Individually, Lindsey Hunter leads the Big 12 in assists (12.44). Shen Danru is second in aces (0.51), fourth in digs (3.56) and sixth in kills (3.96). Two others join Danru in the aces category as Juliana Godoi is third with a 0.43 aces per game average and Hunter is seventh averaging 0.40 aces per game.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

The Tigers have stepped it up on defense this season and are currently third in the Big 12 in digs per game with a 16.31 average. They have continued to improve as the season has progresses as they are second in the conference in Big 12 matches only with a 17.14 digs per game average. Shen Danru leads Mizzou with a 3.55 digs per game mark, which is seventh best in the conference. She is followed by Sara Parks who has a 3.27 digs per game average. Since the start of Big 12 play, Parks has averaged 3.32 digs per game which ranks seventh in the conference. She had a career-high 26 digs against Texas A&M on Nov. 1.

RECORD SETTER

Lindsey Hunter has recorded 1,256 assists this season, giving her 2,946 for her career. That places her third on the career assists charts at Missouri in only her sophomore season. Hunter leads the Big 12 Conference with a 12.44 assists per game average. She is also seventh in the Big 12 with a 0.40 aces per game mark. Hunter has 10 double-doubles on the year including seven straight matches at one point this season. She has had at least 60 assists three times this year including 69 against Texas A&M on Nov. 1 to tie her career high.

Hunter was named to the All-Tournament team in the first two of MU's tournaments this season. In the season opening Quality Inn Tiger Invitational, she was named the tournament MVP after averaging 13.00 assists per game. She then averaged 11.56 assists per game at the Utah Classic to earn an All-Tournament spot. In 2002, Hunter set a school record with 1,690 assists. She led the Big 12 and was second in the nation with a 14.08 assists per game average.

SHEN-ANIGANS

Shen Danru tied her career-high with 24 kills and added 23 digs against Oklahoma last Saturday for her 15th double-doubles on the year, which leads the team is second most in the Big 12 Conference. She leads the Tigers in kills per game (3.96), digs per game (3.55) and aces per game (0.51). Her 0.51 aces per game is second best in the Big 12 Conference. Danru was named to the All-Tournament team in all three of Missouri's fall tournaments to open the year. She was named the Big 12 Conference Player of the Week on Sept. 29 after averaging 5.14 kills and 4.14 digs per game in the Tigers' two matches the previous week. Danru had back-to-back 20-kill matches against Texas (24) and Texas A&M (22) and added 20 digs against the Aggies.

TATUM AILES SIGNS WITH MIZZOU

Nebraska high school standout Tatum Ailes has signed an agreement to join the Mizzou volleyball team next fall. Ailes, a 5-6 setter for Bellevue West High School in Nebraska, will join the Tigers as a defensive specialist.

Ailes led her team in assists and was among the leaders in kills, aces and blocks as Bellevue West claimed the Nebraska Class A State Title last weekend by defeating Papillion-LaVista in the championship. Ailes had 26 assists as the Thunderbirds took the two-game sweep to finish the season 46-2.

THE STREAK IS OVER

Missouri picked up its biggest win in recent memory and one of the biggest in the program's history by defeating Nebraska on Oct. 15. After trailing 0-2 at the intermission, Mizzou rallied to win the next three games and defeat the No. 8 Huskers in Lincoln. The win was the first for the Tigers over Nebraska since 1982, snapping a string of 44 consecutive losses. It was the first Missouri win in Lincoln since 1977 and only the third ever win for MU over the Cornhuskers. For Nebraska, it was only its second loss in the Big 12 Conference since 2000.

THAT'S A LOT OF 'POINT MIZZOU'

Missouri's win over Texas on Oct. 11 was not like a normal three-game sweep. In game three the Hearn Center crowd heard Public Address Announcer Mark Edwards shout "Point Mizzou" a few extra times. Mizzou won the game by a score of 42-40, in what was the longest game in Missouri volleyball history. MU's three-game point total of 102 is also the second highest point total ever scored in a three-game match in NCAA history. The record is 105 scored by Arizona State over Arizona in 2002. Twice before, the Tigers have been involved in games that have reached 40 points, both coming in the NCAA Tournament. In 2001, Mizzou lost game two of their NCAA Tournament match against Illinois 38-40. Then last year in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, MU defeated Northwestern by a 40-38 score in game four to win the match.
