Tigers Face Red Raiders on Wednesday in Columbia

The University of Missouri men's basketball squad (9-7 overall, 1-2 in the Big 12) looks to snap a two-game losing streak on Wednesday when it welcomes Texas Tech (10-4, 2-1 Big 12) to Mizzou Arena. After winning five of six contests from Dec. 11-Jan. 8, Mizzou has dropped games at Oklahoma State and Kansas State but hopes to extend its current five game winning streak at home. Mizzou has averaged 67.2 points per game at home this season and has held opponents to just 60.8 points per contest at Mizzou Arena.

Linus Kleiza has led Mizzou in both scoring and rebounding in each of the last two games. He scored a game-high 14 points while pulling down eight boards against Kansas State. Kleiza averages 15.8 points and 7.1 boards per contest. However, he is one of only two Tigers to average double figures in scoring (the other being senior Jason Conley with 10.6 points per game) and has struggled in his last two home games averaging 8.5 points and 4.5 rebounds per game in the Tigers' tilts with Gonzaga and Iowa State.

Heading into Wednesday's game, Mizzou has 14 games remaining in the regular season including seven home games and seven road games. The contest will be broadcast on the Tiger Radio Network with Mike Kelly handling the play-by-play duties and former Tiger great Gary Link offering expert analysis. The game can also be seen around the state of Missouri on the Mizzou Sports Network with Dan McLaughlin and Tiger coaching legend Norm Stewart on the call. Mizzou is 7-3 this season in games broadcast on the Mizzou Sports Network and 2-1 when Stewart dons the headset. In a related note, Coach Stewart will turn 70 on Wednesday.

Mizzou has won five straight at home since it defeated Montana on Dec. 11 ... The Tigers check in with an RPI of 88 and their schedule was ranked as the 17th toughest slate in the country according to CollegeRPI.com on Monday night ... The Tigers are allowing their opponents to score only 64.1 points per game ... If they can maintain that average, it would be the lowest average a Tiger squad has allowed since 1998-99 (63.2 points per game) ... Junior Kevin Young is coming off a career-best 10 points while pulling down seven rebounds against Kansas State ... Mizzou is 4-2 against Texas Tech under Head Coach Quin Snyder and is 2-0 in Columbia vs. the Red Raiders ... Coach Snyder is 1-3 against Texas Tech Coach Bobby Knight ... The Tigers have won five of their last six home Big 12 contests dating back to last season ... Sophomore Linas Kleiza has connected on his last 15 free throw attempts ... Mizzou is 8-0 this season when leading at halftime this season ... The Tigers are 9-2 at Mizzou Arena this season, but are 0-5 away from home ... After playing 11 of their first 16 games at home, the Tigers will play four of their next seven games on the road ... Head coach Quin Snyder is looking for win number 110 at Mizzou ... Junior Jimmy McKinney has now started 72 straight regular season games for Mizzou, dating back to Dec. 30, 2002 against Valparaiso ... McKinney and fellow junior Kevin Young are the only Tigers to start all 16 games this season ... **After giving up eight three-point field goals per game during the first seven contests of the season, the Tigers have allowed just 33 three pointers (3.7 threes per game) over the course of the last nine games and have held those opponents to a combined 30.5 percent from three (33-of-108).**

About the Red Raiders

Winners of five of their last six, Texas Tech enters Wednesday's contest with a 10-4 overall mark and a 2-1 record in the Big 12. After dropping their Big 12 opener to defending Big 12 Champ Oklahoma State, TTU has won two straight including wins at Kansas State and at home on Saturday against Texas A&M. All five Texas Tech starters average in double figures and are led by senior Ronald Ross, who averaging 15.1 points and is shooting a team-best 55.4 percent from the field. Balance is the name of the game for TTU with five players averaging between 15.1 and 11.0 points per contest.

TTU has also been excellent defensively, allowing opponents to shoot just 35.8 percent from the field and outscoring them them by an average of 17.6 points per game. Coaching legend Bob Knight is in his fourth season at TTU and his 39th season overall. He has won 78 games at TTU and 842 games overall. He has led Texas Tech to the NCAA Tournament in two of his first three seasons at the helm.

A Look Back ... Mizzou vs. Kansas State

Sophomore Linas Kleiza led Mizzou in both scoring (14 points) and rebounding (8 boards) for the fourth time this season and for the second time in as many games. The Tigers allowed Kansas State to eclipse its scoring average (73.1) with 74 points, marking the first time in 10 games Mizzou has allowed an opponent to do so.

Missouri Team Notes after the Kansas State Game

- The Tigers fall to 9-7 overall and 1-2 in the Big 12. They are 9-2 at home, 0-3 in neutral court games and 0-2 in road contests so far this season.
- Missouri has now lost two straight for the first time since it dropped games on back-to-back games in the semifinal and consolation rounds of the Guardians Classic on Nov. 23-24, 2004.
- Head Coach Quin Snyder is now 109-70 overall in his six years at Mizzou. He falls to 9-2 against KSU and 32-21 against teams from the Big 12 North.
- The Tigers still lead the all-time series with the Wildcats, 112-108 and have won 12 of the last 17 meetings between the two squads.
- The Tigers wore their black uniforms in Manhattan for the first time this season. They are obviously 0-1 in those uniforms
- The Tigers and the Wildcats will face off one more time during the regular season on Jan. 29 in Columbia.
- Mizzou scored 32 points in the paint compared to KSU's 26.
- Mizzou committed a season-high 26 fouls. The Tigers last two opponents have connected on 51-of-63 from the free throw line.
- The Tigers equaled their second lowest point total of the season with the 54-point effort.
- Mizzou has officially past the halfway point of its regular season. Last year, the Tigers were 8-8 through their first 16 games.

Missouri Player Notes after the Kansas State Game

- Sophomore Linas Kleiza recorded scored a team-high 14 points in the game. He has reached double figures in scoring for the 13th times this season and has led Mizzou in scoring in nine games. Ten of Kleiza's 14 points came in the second half along five of his eight rebounds.
- Kleiza also led Mizzou in rebounding with eight boards, marking the ninth time he has accomplished that feat as well.
- Junior Kevin Young scored a career-best 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting while also pulling down seven boards on the night.
- Junior Jimmy McKinney started his 72nd straight contest.
- With his seven-rebound performance, senior Jason Conley has grabbed five or more rebounds in six of the Tiger's last seven contests.

Bench Marks

The Tigers who have come off of the bench for Mizzou have played a key role this season. When the Tigers' bench has outscored the opponent's bench, they are 7-3. Mizzou's bench has averaged 19.9 points per contest compared its opponent's mark of 15.9 points per game. Thomas Gardner has come off of the bench in 11 of the Tigers' games and leads the way averaging 9.2 points per game.

Tigers Set School Record for Team GPA in Fall Semester

The University of Missouri men's basketball team continues to achieve both on and off the court this season

With final grades now set for the 2004 fall semester at Mizzou, the reports show that the men's basketball team has established a record for its team grade point average. Bryan Maggard, MU's Associate Athletic Director for Academic Services, says that the Tiger men's team came in with a cumulative team GPA of 2.91 this past fall - which was the highest single semester mark in recorded history for an MU men's basketball squad.

According to Maggard, four Tiger cagers had GPAs of over 3.0 on the standard 4.0 scale, and two will earn a place on the coveted Dean's List.

The achievement comes on the heels of the 2004 NCAA Graduation Report, which shows that the Missouri men's basketball team led the Big 12 Conference in graduation rates, at 67%. The next-best rate in the league belonged to Colorado (40%), followed by Texas Tech and Kansas (33%) and Nebraska (20%). The rates represent students who enrolled in 1997-98 and graduated within six years.

Conley Comes Alive!

After being held to a season-low two points (on 0-of-3 shooting) against Illinois on Dec. 22, senior Jason Conley has put together some of the most impressive games of his career at Mizzou so far. **Over the course of the last five contests, Conley has averaged 11.6 points and 7.6 rebounds.** He has reached double figures in scoring in four of those five contests and has recorded double-doubles in two games.

He led Mizzou to a 62-59 win over Iowa State on Saturday with 13 points on 4-of-6 shooting including two three pointers. Conley recorded a second double-double in as many games against American, scoring 12 points and pulling down 10 rebounds while also handing out five assists on the night. Nine of those points and six of those rebounds came in the second stanza.

The native of Silver Spring, MD, played one of the most dynamic games of the year against Gonzaga, scoring 16 points (on 7-of-13 shooting) while also pulling down a career-best 13 rebounds. The double-double was the first of Conley's career and was the second double-double a Tiger guard has produced this season. The other was Thomas Gardner's 19-point, 12-rebound effort to open the season against Brown.

At the Line with Linas

At the risk of totally jinxing the progress the Tigers made from the free throw line on of late, we offer this intriguing analysis of the Tigers' free throw shooting, in particular in regard to sophomore Linas Kleiza. The Tigers knocked down a season-high 90.0 percent (18-of-20) from the free throw line against OSU after entering the contest shooting just 64.1 percent on the season.

They were spurred by Kleiza's remarkable 13-for-13 shooting from the stripe, setting a new career best for free throws made in a game. Linas has made a living at the free throw line this season, getting to the charity stripe 103 times already. Kleiza has hit 73 of those attempts, good for 70.9 percent accuracy. He has been particularly impressive the past seven games, knocking down 47-of-59 attempts (79.7 percent) and has averaged just under 10 trips to the line per game during that stretch.

Doing it with Defense

One of the main focuses of the Tigers' efforts has been and will be improving on the defensive end. Its no secret how the Tigers have won seven of their last 11 contests. **Mizzou has given up only 62.4 points per contest during that stretch.** The Tigers have held nine of their last 10 opponents below their season scoring average after allowing Kansas State to score 74 points (they had averaged 73.1 points per game coming into the contest.

Mizzou limited American to just 51 points (a season low for the Eagles) and 34.5 percent shooting from the floor.

After holding No. 1 Illinois to only 70 points (14 below their season average) before the Holidays, the Tigers stepped up their defense once again against Gonzaga. Mizzou held the high-powered Zags offense that was averaging 80 points per contest and 52 percent shooting from the field to just 61 points and 38.3 percent shooting from the floor in the upset win.

Mizzou recorded a great defensive performance against Indiana, holding the Hoosiers to just 53 points, the second lowest total the Tigers have allowed this season. Mizzou held Indiana's leading scorer Bracey Wright to just 12 points on 3-of-8 shooting and forced 15 Hoosier turnovers.

Against Montana, the Tigers held the Griz to only 38.3 percent shooting from the field while also blocking a season-high seven shots. They allowed only one Grizzly to reach double figures in scoring and nabbed nine steals in the win.

Against Arkansas, the Razorbacks were averaging nearly 78 points per contest heading into the game and were hitting their three-point attempts at a 42.4 percent clip. Even though the final outcome wasn't what the Tigers had hoped for, they did make strides on the defensive end holding Arkansas to only 62 points (16 points off of their average) and shut down U of A from three (12.5 percent - 1-of-8).

Shouldering the Load

Linas Kleiza has recovered fully from a shoulder separation he experienced half way through last season and it looks as though he will be shouldering a major part of the Tiger offense this season. The All-Big 12 Preseason Honorable Mention recipient has been amazing offensively so far this season and continues to improve on defense.

After struggling to just four points in the first half against Kansas State, Kleiza scored 10 of his team-high 14 points while also pulling down eight rebounds against KSU. The offensive juggernaut reached the 20-point plateau for the fourth time this season against Oklahoma State when he dumped in 24 points while going a perfect 13-of-13 from the free throw line. Kleiza scored 25 (of Mizzou's 64) points, pulled down seven rebounds and handed out three assists against Illinois.

After scoring just three points in the opening half against Indiana, Kleiza poured in 15 of his game-high 18 points in the second half including 12 free throws in the win.

He had the best offensive game of his career against Montana, scoring a career-best 26 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the field. Kleiza recorded the fifth double-double of his career against Arkansas with a team-high 14 points and 11 rebounds. He broke out of mini-scoring funk with 13 points, nine boards and nine assists against Oakland while turning the ball over just one time, something he has been focusing on improving all season. He is definitely Mizzou's most versatile player as he leads the team in scoring (15.8 ppg.), rebounds (7.1 rpg.) and is third on the squad in assists (35).

The Youth of the Tiger Nation

The freshmen on the Tiger roster have started to really assert themselves on the court for Mizzou. Over the course of the last ten games, Marshall Brown, Kalen Grimes, Jason Horton and Glen Dandridge have combined to score 27.8 percent of the Tigers points (194-of-699) and all four of them have set or equaled career highs in points during that stretch.

Horton equaled a career high with 12 points for the second straight game against Iowa State. He and Brown had great outings against American. Horton scored a career-best 12 points while Brown chipped in with nine as the Tigers took out the Eagles. The foursome was great against Gonzaga, combining for 16 points and 10 rebounds. Horton scored six points and handed out three assists and recorded no turnovers in 37 minutes while running the Tiger offense. Dandridge and Grimes also had solid nights. Dandridge scored five points on 2-of-3 shooting while also recording a steal, a block and an assist in seven minutes of playing time while Grimes set a career-best with six rebounds.

The new arena is an imposing place to play for opposing teams and provides unbelievable options for the Tigers when it comes to player development. In addition to more seating, with a capacity of 15,061, there are a host of other exciting additions:

- State-of-the art training room
- Expanded locker room facilities complete with film room and player lounge
- Practice gym
- Basketball office complex
- Box office and team store
- Missouri Athletics Hall of Fame

Mizzou Arena houses all the up-to-date technologies desired in a modern sports facility. Both men's and women's basketball programs have video game film viewing theaters; all coaches offices and meeting rooms have cable TV hook-ups and both private (suites, clubs) and public (concession stands, retail store) areas throughout the arena have direct-game and cable televisions in place. Adjacent to the west side truck dock are dedicated and secured television production and satellite truck parking areas with permanent patch-in panels. The audio-video room within the arena is also linked to Missouri's two major sports venues - the Harnes Center and Memorial Football Stadium. The arena contains a center-hung scoreboard-video board as well as 30" high video ribbon board located above the luxury suites where the lower and upper seating bowl transition occurs.

New Editions

No, I am not going to break into a rendition of "Cool it Now" or "Candy Girl" (as much as you all would enjoy that) but Mizzou has two members of its staff that are beginning new editions of their careers. Coach Quin Snyder

6th Year at MU
109-70

In his sixth year at the helm of the Mizzou basketball program is **Quin Snyder**. Missouri's 15th head coach, Snyder has built a program that has joined the upper echelon of college basketball. With a focus on developing players academically, physically, skillfully and socially, Snyder's squads have enjoyed trips to the post season in each of the last five seasons including four trips to the NCAA Tournament. Mizzou has averaged exactly 20.0 wins per contest during Snyder's five-year tenure at Mizzou. The intense competitor the Tiger players call "Coach Q" won his 100th career game last season when Mizzou defeated Texas A&M in the Big 12 Tournament. He became the fourth coach in Mizzou school history to reach the 100-win plateau and Snyder will have a great opportunity to add to that total with a contract that will keep him as a fixture on the Tiger bench through 2007-08.

In 2004-05, Mizzou returns several of its top players including senior Jason Conley, junior Jimmy McKinney and sophomores Thomas Gardner and Linas Kleiza. Snyder and his

staff also gathered a sixth straight Top 25 recruiting class to augment the already talented roster. Mizzou has moved to a new state-of-the-art home this season, the Mizzou Arena, which holds around 15,000 rowdy Missouri fans and gives the Tigers an unbelievable opportunity to build on the foundation of success that has been established.

Given the success and excitement Snyder's squads have generated in his five years at the helm, it is not surprising that Tiger fans are looking for big things from Mizzou in 2004-05. In 2003-04, Snyder led the Tigers to wins over Top 20 teams such as Oklahoma State and Oklahoma. He also saw his second recruiting class of Arthur Johnson, Rickey Paulding, Travon Bryant and Josh Kroenke complete outstanding careers at Mizzou. Johnson and Paulding both jumped into the Top 10 on the Tiger scoring charts and Johnson finished his career as the Tigers' all-time leader in blocked shots and rebounds. That outstanding class also finished their career having played in the most NCAA Tournament contests of any class in school history with eight.

A native of the Pacific Northwest, Snyder, 37, attended Mercer Island High School in the state of Washington. A two-time state player of the year, Snyder led the team to the 1985 state championship. During this time, Mercer Island achieved a No. 1 ranking in USA Today's high school polls. Snyder was named a McDonald's All-America player, being the first ever chosen from the state of Washington.

Snyder and his wife, the former Helen Redwine, a native of Charlotte, N.C, have one son, Owen Redwine Snyder, born on December 25, 2002.

Tigers Open Season With Win Over Brown

Gardner scores 19 points pulls down 12 boards in victory

Nov. 15, 2004

Thomas Gardner had 19 points and 12 rebounds for his first career double double, helping Missouri pull away in the second half for a 68-60 victory over pesky Brown in the opening round of the Guardians Classic on Monday night.

The Tigers, who shot 35 percent in their first regular-season game in the new Paige Sports Arena, will play Houston in the second round on Tuesday night. Houston rallied from a 10-point second-half deficit to beat Sam Houston State 72-69 earlier Monday.

Linus Kleiza added 17 points and nine rebounds for Missouri, which trailed by five in the first half and struggled to adjust to Brown's 2-3 defense. The Tigers were 3-for-18 from 3-point range midway through the second half before finally starting to connect, finishing 7-for-26.

Damon Huffman had 16 points for Brown, shorthanded without Ivy League player of the year Jason Forte, a point guard, who is suspended indefinitely for conduct detrimental to the team.

Brown compensated for Forte's absence by going 11-for-21 from 3-point range. Huffman was 5-for-7 and Adolphe Coulibaly was 3-for-3 and added 11 points.

Gardner, a 6-5 guard, was 2-for-8 in the first half and missed all five of his 3-point attempts. He was 5-for-8 the rest of the way, including 3-for-5 from long range, and he also had four assists. He had five offensive rebounds.

Gardner and Jimmy McKinney hit consecutive 3-pointers to give Missouri, which led only 33-32 at halftime, a 49-40 lead with 12 minutes to go. Brown answered with a 3-pointer by Huffman with 11:15 left but never got any closer.

That was typical of Brown, which also quickly responded to Missouri's best play of the game. A steal and behind-the-back pass from Spencer Laurie to Glen Dandridge for a dunk put the Tigers ahead 33-29 with 40 seconds left in the first half, but Ruscoe, hardly rattled, hit a 3-pointer 16 seconds later.

Mizzou Hits 12 Threes in Win Over Houston

Jimmy McKinney scores 16 in Tiger win.

Nov. 16

Columbia, MO - Linus Kleiza had 19 points and 14 rebounds and Missouri outscored Houston 20-1 over a 6 minute span that began near the end of the first half of a 77-61 victory over Houston in the second round of the Guardians Classic on Tuesday night.

Missouri (2-0) endured a first-half stretch in which it made one basket in more than 11 minutes and fell behind by five points. The Tigers had little trouble scoring the rest of the game, shooting 50 percent and going 12-for-23 from 3-point range.

Missouri hit only three of its first 18 from long range in the opening round against Brown.

Thomas Gardner scored all but three of his 18 points in the second half for the Tigers, who advanced to the semifinals on Tuesday in Kansas City. Jimmy McKinney had 16 points and Jason Conley 14, and Kleiza added five assists.

Andre Owens had 16 points and Lanny Smith 14 for Houston (1-1), which last faced Missouri in 1982. Houston rallied from a 10-point second half deficit in the first round against Sam Houston State for its first season-opening victory since 1999, but never threatened a repeat comeback.

The Cougars led 29-24 with 3:47 left in the first half before the roof caved in. Jason Conley had a 3-pointer at the end of the half and another at the start of the second half of the run that gave Missouri a comfortable 44-30 lead with 15:30 to play. The lead grew to as many as 21 points later in the half, a 62-41 bulge with 7:36 left.

Missouri totaled four points during its first-half dry spell, a basket by Kevin Young and two free throws, before heating up. The Tigers have had double double outings in each of the first two games. Gardner had the first of his career on Monday with 19 points and 12 rebounds and has come off the bench both games.

Kleiza had three double doubles as a freshman last season and missed one in the opener by only one rebound.

Mizzou Falls to Davidson

Kleiza scores a career-best 25 points in loss

Nov. 19, 2004

Columbia, MO - Matt McKillop scored a career high 28 points and Davidson got away with squandering all but one point of a 19-point lead on the road in a 84-81 victory over Missouri on Friday night.

Davidson (1-0) was 10-for-18 from 3-point range to win its season opener for the first time since 1996-97. It was the first meeting between the two teams. In the process, the Wildcats handed Missouri (2-1) its first loss in the new Paige Sports Arena.

Linus Kleiza had a career-best 25 points and six rebounds for Missouri, which won its first two home games over Brown and Houston in the Guardians Classic by a combined 24 points. Besides erasing 18 points of the 19-point deficit, the Tigers whittled a late 13-point Davidson lead to two before faltering at the end.

Brendan Winters scored 10 of his 19 points in just under three minutes, and his 3-pointer with 12:50 left put Davidson ahead 58-39 - a 19-point lead that matched the Wildcats' largest of the game.

Grant added a free throw with 19 seconds left and Missouri missed three shots at the end, a 3-pointer by Gardner, a follow shot by Conley and another 3-pointer by Conley that fell short. Conley added 18 points, Gardner had 14 and Jimmy McKinney 12 for Missouri.

Mizzou will face Houston in consolation game

Kansas City, MO - Nate Funk scored 21 points and Johnny Mathies came off the bench to score 18 points as Creighton defeated Missouri 78-54 on Tuesday night in the Guardians Classic semifinals.

Creighton (4-0) will meet Ohio State (4-0), which defeated Houston 78-61 in the other semifinal game Tuesday, in the tournament championship game Wednesday night.

Funk, who led the Bluejays in scoring last season as a sophomore, made 8-of-11 field goals, including 3-of-6 3-pointers. He also scored 21 points on Feb. 1 at Evansville. Mathies scored all of his points in the second half.

Linus Kleiza was the only Tiger in double figures with 12 points. Missouri starting guard Jimmy McKinney was held scoreless for the first time in his career.

Creighton hit 8-of-15 3-pointers in the first half, while Missouri made just 1-of-9. The Bluejays' swarming defense forced the Tigers into nine first-half turnovers, which Creighton converted into 11 points.

The Tigers opened the second half by not scoring in the first 5:16, missing their first seven field goal attempts. Jason Conley ended the scoring drought with two free throws with 14:04 left.

The Bluejays also had difficulties scoring at the beginning of the second half. Funk made Creighton's only field goal in eight attempts in the first five minutes.

Missouri will face Houston (2-2) in the consolation game Wednesday. Missouri defeated Houston 77-61 last week.

Kansas City, MO - Andre Owens scored a game-high 24 points, including a free throw with 9.7 seconds left, as Houston beat Missouri 57-55 for third place on Wednesday night in the Guardians Classic.

Conley and Gardner Score 18 a piece in win

Columbia, MO - Jason Conley scored 18 points in 19 minutes to lead Missouri to a 70-61 win against Oakland University on Saturday.

After the teams traded the lead in the opening minutes of the second half, the Tigers' second 12-0 run of the game gave them an advantage that put them up for good. Thomas Gardner scored the first six points of the run, followed by two 3-pointers from Conley. The rally gave the Tigers (4-3) a 50-38 lead with 13 minutes remaining.

Oakland (0-5) could not cut the deficit to fewer than four points the rest of the way.

Conley, who fought foul trouble throughout the game, scored five points in seven minutes in the first half before his production increased in the second. He finished 6-for-9 from the field, including 4-for-6 from 3. Gardner also had 18 points, all but three of which came in the second half.

Both teams struggled early, combining to shoot 7-for-28 from the field, including 1-for-9 from 3, in the first 8:25. The Tigers then surged, making five straight shots during a 12-0 run that pushed their lead to 23-10. Jason Horton, shooting just 20 percent from the outside entering the game, hit two 3-pointers in the rally.

Missouri scored just one basket in the final six minutes of the first half, allowing Oakland to score 16 of the half's final 21 points. Oakland took a brief 29-27 lead before a three-point play from Gardner in the final minute gave the Tigers a 30-29 halftime edge.

Linus Kleiza added 13 points for the Tigers while Cortney Scott scored 15 to lead the Grizzlies. Rawle Marshall, who entered the game leading the Mid-Continent Conference in scoring with a 21-point average, had just five in the first half. He finished with 14. Kris Krzyminski added 14 for the Grizzlies.

Arkansas tops Tigers in Columbia

Kleiza scores 14 points and pulls down 11 rebounds

Dec. 7, 2004

Columbia, MO - Ronnie Brewer had 20 points and five assists and Arkansas held Missouri to 30 percent shooting in a 62-52 victory on Tuesday night.

Olu Famutimi added eight points and eight rebounds to help Arkansas (6-1) bounce back from its lone loss of the season to then-No. 3 Illinois three days earlier. The Razorbacks won despite being held to a season low point total after entering the game with a 77-point average.

Linus Kleiza had 14 points and 11 rebounds for Missouri (4-4), but was only 6-for-16 from the field. The Tigers missed their first 10 shots, then began the second half 0-for-7 en route to their worst shooting of the season, including going only 3-for-19 from 3-point range.

Reserve Marshall Brown added 10 points for Missouri, which also lost for the second time in only six games at the new Mizzou Arena. Thomas Gardner was 2-for-10, Jimmy McKinney 1-for-8, Jason Horton 0-for-7 and Jason Conley 2-for-6.

Arkansas shot 48 percent overall to beat Missouri for the seventh straight time, although this was the first meeting between the bordering states since 1997.

Arkansas also struggled early, missing eight straight shots after starting the game 3-for-4. The Razorbacks got away with 38 percent shooting in the first half, leading 27-25, and never trailed in the second half.

The key point in the second half came when Gardner got a steal but then lost control of the ball and missed a layup that could have cut the gap to one with just under four minutes to go. Arkansas responded with a 3-pointer by Eric Ferguson for a six-point lead.

Mizzou Dominates Montana

Kleiza goes for 26 in win

Columbia, MO - Linas Kleiza dominated the final eight minutes of the first half and finished with a career-high 26 points to lead Missouri to an 87-62 win over Montana on Saturday.

Jimmy McKinney added 11 for the Tigers (5-4), while Kalen Grimes had a career-high 12 points and four blocks in 14 minutes. Kamarr Davis had 12 points and eight rebounds to lead Montana (3-4).

With Missouri ahead 14-10, Kleiza took over to rally the Tigers to a 16-point halftime lead. After missing his first four shots, Kleiza scored 16 points in the last eight minutes of the half. Missouri scored the final 10 points of the half and took a 37-21 lead into break.

In the second half, Kleiza picked up where he left off, opening the Tigers' scoring with a 3-pointer. Missouri extended its lead to as many as 20 points before the Grizzlies cut into the deficit with an 11-1 run that made it 50-40.

An alley-oop dunk by Jason Conley and a 3-pointer from Kleiza a minute later returned the Tigers' lead to 17 points. Missouri extended its advantage to as many as 27 points and Montana did not challenge the rest of the way.

Mimicking Missouri's early shooting struggles, Montana went 2-for-13 in the first nine minutes, allowing the Tigers to jump out to an early 12-5 lead. Glen Dandridge, who had played a total of two minutes in the Tigers' past four games, scored five of Missouri's first 14 points and finished with seven.

After shooting 30 percent in a loss to Arkansas on Tuesday, Missouri was significantly more effective against the Grizzlies, finishing 48 percent from the field. Missouri's 87 points was a season high.

The Missouri defense limited Montana to 32 percent shooting in the first half, well below the Grizzlies' average of 44 percent entering the game. Montana finished at 38 percent for the game.

Missouri held Davis, Montana's leading scorer, to two points in the first half.

Tigers Complete Comeback, Defeat Indiana 56-53

Tigers improve to 6-4

Dec. 19, 2004

Columbia, MO - Linas Kleiza scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half and made four free throws in the final 55 seconds, helping Missouri overcome a 17-point deficit in a 56-53 victory over Indiana on Sunday.

Marshall Brown added 11 points off the bench, including a spinning dunk off a turnover with 1 second left, as Missouri beat Indiana with a big comeback for the second straight season. Last season, the Tigers (6-4) finished with a 21-2 run and won by five on the road.

Bracey Wright had 12 points and three assists for Indiana despite breaking his nose in two places late in the first half on an intentional offensive foul by Spencer Laurie. Wearing a bandage over his nose, Wright hit two free throws with 1:12 to go for a 51-50 lead, but he lost control of the ball driving in the lane on Indiana's final possession with about four seconds left.

D.J. White had 13 points for Indiana (2-5), which has lost five in a row. Missouri shot only 23 percent in the first half, but was 10-for-12 in the second half. The Tigers also made a concentrated effort to get to the line, Kleiza in particular, going 18-for-26 overall after attempting just three in the first half.

Both teams endured cold spells, Missouri going more than 11 minutes between baskets in a drought spanning both halves and Indiana going 7:38 between points in the second half.

Indiana finished the first half on a 14-1 run, getting five points from Ratliff capped by a baseline shot at the buzzer for a 31-16 lead. Missouri shot 23 percent while scoring a season-low for points in the half, and didn't score a basket in the final 5:50 of the half after Glen Dandridge's 3-pointer.

After the Hoosiers extended it to 16-1 early in the second half, Missouri answered with a 16-2 run that cut the deficit to three at 35-32 with 10:44 left. Indiana held off Missouri until Brown's 3-pointer tied it at 49 with 1:56 left, and there were five lead changes the rest of the way.

On Sunday, the Tigers were able to rally for a three-point victory over Indiana and this time they put a scare into Illinois, shaving the deficit to five points with just under 8 minutes left and then to four on Jason Horton's 3-pointer with 14 seconds to go.

Columbia, MO - Jason Conley had 16 points and 13 rebounds, and Missouri survived a lengthy cold stretch at the finish to hang on and beat No. 12 Gonzaga 63-61 on Thursday night.

Linus Kleiza added 11 points despite foul trouble for Missouri (7-5), which scored just two points in the final 8 minutes.

Missouri, in its first action since losing by six to top-ranked Illinois on Dec. 22, improved to 16-38 against teams in the Top 25 in six seasons under Quin Snyder. It was also the Tigers' first victory over a ranked opponent since they beat Oklahoma State in double-overtime last Feb. 24 at home.

Kevin Young's layup had capped a 10-2 run by Missouri that seemingly put them in control. The Tigers' only points the rest of the way came on one free throw apiece by Marshall Brown and Young.

Improve to 8-2 at Mizzou Arena in 2004-05

Jan. 4, 2004

Columbia, MO - Jason Conley had 12 points and 10 rebounds for his second straight double-double, and the second of his career, helping Missouri beat American 64-51 on Tuesday night.

Thomas Gardner added 14 points and Jason Horton scored all but two of his career-best 12 points in the first half to get the Tigers (8-5) off to a good start in their final game before beginning Big 12 play. Missouri opens at home on Saturday against Iowa State.

The Tigers won despite a sub-par outing from leading scorer Linas Kleiza, who missed all six of his shots from the field and was held to five free throws. Kleiza had averaged 20 points over the previous four games.

Conley's follow-up to a 16-point, 13-rebound effort against Gonzaga, plus a defense that held American to 35 percent shooting, helped compensate. Missouri, which was 10-of-22 (46 percent) from 3-point range and 18-for-53 (34 percent) otherwise, has won four in a row at the new Mizzou Arena.

Andre Ingram had 19 points for American (6-5), which has lost three of four and opens Patriot League play on Saturday at home against Lehigh. Jason Thomas added 12 points and Linas Lekavicius had 11.

Missouri led by as many as 16 points in the second half, although American twice shaved the deficit to six. The Tigers went more than five minutes between baskets to allow the Eagles back into the game.

Missouri shot only 37 percent in the first half but was 7-for-11 from 3-point range to take a 33-21 lead at halftime. Four of the 3-pointers came in the final 2:44 on a half-ending 16-2 run that erased American's 19-17 lead.

The Tigers were only 3-for-16 inside the 3-point line in the first half.

Two players, Ingram with 13 points and Thomas with six, scored all but two of American's first-half points.

Mizzou Opens Big 12 Play with Win Over Iowa State

Four Tigers reach double figures

Jan. 8, 2004

Columbia, MO - Jimmy McKinney scored four points in the final 27 seconds, helping Missouri overcome a 12-minute span without a basket in a wild 62-59 victory over Iowa State in a Big 12 opener on Saturday.

Jason Conley had 13 points, Linas Kleiza had 12 points and nine rebounds and Jason Horton had 12 points for Missouri (9-5, 1-0 Big 12). The Tigers endured a 28-4 Iowa State run that transformed a 12-point lead into a 12-point deficit with 4:34 to go, then ended the game on a 17-2 run.

McKinney, who had 10 points, scored on a spinning shot in the lane with 27 seconds left to put Missouri ahead for good at 60-59 although he missed a chance at a three-point play. He added two free throws with 13 seconds left. Iowa State (8-4, 0-1) had two chances in the final seconds. Curtis Stinson turned it over near the Cyclones' bench with 16.8 seconds to go and reserve John Neal missed a 3-pointer with one second left.

Stinson had 22 points for Iowa State, which has lost 26 straight Big 12 road games dating to February 2001. Will Blalock added 12 points, five assists and four steals.

Iowa State is 0-4 on the road this season.

Missouri won its eighth straight conference home opener and its fifth in six games overall despite committing 20 turnovers, one off their season worst, against Iowa State's sticky zone defense. At times during the drought, the Tigers struggled just to get a shot off.

Missouri led by as many as 13 points early in the second half before going cold. The Tigers led 41-29 after Horton hit in the lane with 16:36 to go, and he made the next one a 3-pointer with 4:04 left that started Missouri's final run.

Missouri shot 54 percent in the first half and took advantage of an Iowa State drought to take a 33-24 lead. Iowa State scored only six points in the final nine minutes before the break and Kleiza scored six himself in that span for Missouri.

Mizzou Drops Tough One at No. 6 Oklahoma State

Kleiza pours in 24

Jan. 11, 2004

Stillwater, OK - Joey Graham scored a season-high 27 points, John Lucas added 18 and Eddie Sutton tied his mentor Henry Iba for seventh place on the career victories list as No. 6 Oklahoma State beat Missouri 78-68 on Tuesday night.

The Cowboys (12-1, 2-0 Big 12) took the lead for good with two free throws from Stephen Graham midway through the second half and held off the Tigers (9-6, 1-1), who moved within a point on three occasions.

Terrence Crawford drained two free throws to start a 6-0 run that gave Oklahoma State its largest lead of the second half, 69-61 with just under 4 minutes to play.

Crawford added a runout, two-handed jam and Stephen Graham finished the surge with a reverse layup and the orange-clad crowd could taste Sutton's landmark win.

Linus Kleiza scored 24 points to lead Missouri. He fought off endless boos following an early technical foul and his tough inside play helped cause two Oklahoma State defenders to foul out.

Stephen Graham finished with 13 points for Oklahoma State, which had lost to the Tigers each of the previous two seasons, including a 93-92 loss in double overtime last season in Missouri.

The teams traded leads five times within a frenetic, 2-minute span midway through the second half after Jason Conley's steal and fastbreak layup tied it at 43.

After Joey Graham hit two free throws to put Oklahoma State ahead, Jason Horton hit a 3-pointer from the right wing to give the Tigers a 46-45 lead with 13 minutes to play.

Lucas scored on three straight possessions for Oklahoma State as the Cowboys went up 51-48, but Missouri got inside baskets from Marshall Brown and Kleiza to pull back ahead 52-51.

It was the last time the Tigers would lead.

Tigers Fall at Kansas State

Young scores 10 and pulls down seven boards in loss

Jan. 15, 2004

Manhattan, KS -Cartier Martin had 18 points and 10 rebounds, his first double-double of the season, to lead Kansas State to a 74-54 victory over Missouri on Saturday night.

Jeremiah Massey added 17 points and Fred Peete had 14 for the Wildcats.

Kansas State (11-3, 1-2 Big 12) broke a seven-game losing streak against the Tigers, who had taken nine of the previous 10 meetings and were 7-1 against Wildcats coach Jim Wooldridge.

Missouri (9-7, 1-2) dropped to 0-5 on the road this season. This time, everything that could go wrong - foul problems, turnovers, horrible shooting - did. The Tigers trailed 33-22 at the break and never got closer than nine points after that.

The problems started early. Missouri was hit with two charging calls in the first three minutes, was outrebounded 10-5 in the first 10 minutes and committed 10 first-half turnovers.

The Tigers' 26 team fouls - including four charges - gave Kansas State a huge free-throw advantage. The Wildcats shot 25-for-34 from the line to Missouri's 7-for-15.

Missouri tried to go outside to make up the early deficit but shot just 1-for-13 from 3-point range in the first half and 5-for-26 for the game.

Two 3-pointers from Linus Kleiza, who led Missouri with 14 points before fouling out, kept the Tigers close late in the game. But after his second 3-pointer cut Kansas State's lead to 61-52 with 3:55 left, Missouri didn't score again until Jimmy McKinney hit a layup with just under a minute to go.

By then, the Wildcats had put together a 13-0 run - nine of those from the line - for a 74-52 lead.

Jason Conley and Kevin Young had 10 points each for Missouri.
