GAME NOTES

MIDWEEK IN THE SUNSHINE STATE

- Mizzou softball takes on UCF in its first midweek matchup of the season, as it takes on the Knights starting at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 11 at the UCF Softball Complex in Orlando, Fla.
- The matchup will be streamed via ESPN+.

BY THE SERIES

- Mizzou is 3-2 all-time against UCF, as head coach Larissa Anderson's record against the Knights mirrors that, as the Tigers first faced the Knights back in 2015.
- MU dropped the first-ever matchup between the two teams, falling 1-0.
- The Tigers last faced the Knights in Orlando last season, losing 6-5 in eight innings. Before that, MU had a three-game winning streak.

NFCA DIVISION I LEADOFF CLASSIC

- Freshman Abby Carr was selected to the NFCA Division I Leadoff Classic All-Tournament team after recording one home run with four RBIs, as well as pitching 10.1 innings with a 1.35 era.
- Carr made her pitching debut against then-ranked Liberty and held a no-hitter heading into the sixth inning. She ended up pitching a complete game (six innings), allowing two runs and striking out five.
- Against BYU (Feb. 7), the freshman recorded her first career RBI with a double, and in the next game against South Alabama (Feb. 8), went deep for her first home run of the season. Against the Jaguars, she would show up in relief, pitching 4.1 innings and allowing zero earned runs.

HAY NOW HAY NOW

- Junior Abby Hay had the most productive outing of the weekend at the plate, as she finished the NFCA Division I Leadoff Classic with a team-leading six RBIs, two home runs, as well as finishing with a .375 batting average.
- Hay posted the first home run of the season for the Tigers against Liberty (Feb. 7), and followed that with the second against BYU (Feb. 7).
- Against South Alabama, Hay plated two RBIs in extra innings with two singles.

DIY PITCHING

- Senior RHP Courtney Donahue grew up in Wisconsin and was self-taught in the art of pitching via YouTube. Donahue earned a spot with the Des Moines Area Community College before committing to Mizzou.
- She has had three siblings join her in the collegiate ranks, with her sister also being at the Division I level at Wisconsin.

HOT START

- Freshman Sidney Forrester is having a hot start to her first season, as she is third on the team in average, .294. She is also second on the team in RBIs with four, as all four RBIs were earned during the game against Liberty (Feb. 7).

DOUBLE TIME

- Against Liberty the Tigers excelled in putting the ball into the gap as they had seven doubles as a team. This is the first time MU has posted that many in a game since records began to be tracked.

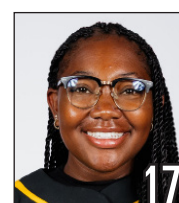

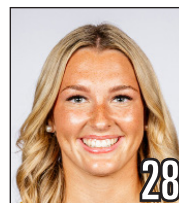

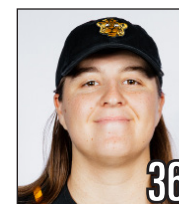

SOFTBALL AMERICA TOP 100

- Senior outfielder **Emma Jackson** earned her spot as the No. 83 player on the top 100 list and ranked as the 19th-best outfielder in the country according to the outlit.
- Jackson is a senior transfer from East Carolina, where she was named to the All-AAC second team in 2025. During her junior campaign, she broke the program's single-season record, slugging 21 home runs. Last season, she finished with a .326 batting average (.453 on-base percentage) and a .730 slugging percentage, as she collected 54 RBIs, nine doubles and 53 runs.

FRESHMAN WATCH LISTS

- Three players made their way onto multiple freshman-to-watch lists, as **Abby Carr**, **Sidney Forrester**, and **Addy Waits** were selected to both the Softball America and D1Softball preseason lists.
- Freshman RHP, Abby Carr, was the 2025 Gatorade Missouri Softball Player of the Year after posting a 23-0 record with 304 strikeouts and a .242 ERA across 144.2 innings. She was also a two-time Pitcher of the Year and three-time all-state selection in Missouri.
- Freshman first baseman/outfielder, Sidney Forrester, was a three-time Oklahoma Class 4A-7 District Player of the Year and earned all-region, all-state accolades in high school. She dominated the level with a .545 batting average (.633 on-base percentage) with 180 hits, 159 RBIs, 46 home runs, 47 doubles, seven triples and 28 stolen bases.
- Freshman third baseman, Addy Waits, was a three-time all-conference, all-state and all-district player in her high school career. She set numerous Lee's Summit West High School career records with 180 hits, a .563 on-base percentage, 42 doubles, 70 walks, 49 stolen bases and 157 runs.

IN THE CIRCLE

- Heading into the 2026 season, the Tigers bring back 20 wins on the mound, as senior RHP **Cierra Harrison**, and junior RHP **Marissa McCann** both return for another season in the Black and Gold.
- McCann led the Tigers in strikeouts in 2025, recording 113 in 148.0 innings pitched. She finished her sophomore year with a 3.69 ERA, and limited opposing batters to a .262 batting average. She also notched six complete games in 24 starts.

- Harrison is ready for her final campaign; last season, she recorded 10 wins with a 3.94 ERA and 89 strikeouts. Harrison heads into this season with a career of success, having compiled a 2.87 ERA, an overall record of 32-13, and a no-hitter on her resume.

- The Tigers only bolster their pitching staff over the course of the offseason, adding freshman RHP **Abby Carr** and sophomore transfer RHP **Rylee Michalak**. As a freshman at Houston, Michalak appeared in 23 games and started 14 of those, and ended up leading the team in strikeouts (35) and wins (6). She was previously the No. 38 player in the class of 2024 according to the final Extra Elite 100 rankings by Extra Inning Softball.

- Other returners include senior **Courtney Donahue** and junior **Nathalie Touchet**. Donahue transferred to the Tigers ahead of the 2025 season, after being named the 2024 TUCCI/NFCA NJCAA DII Pitcher of the Year. Touchet is the top saves-getter for Mizzou with two, and posted a 2.47 ERA as a bullpen pitcher for the Tigers.

TIGERS ON TV

- Mizzou will have 10 national broadcast games, including two on the MLB Network during the opening tournament (Feb. 7, vs. Liberty at 12 p.m. CT; Feb. 8, vs. South Alabama at 12 p.m. CT).
- The Tigers will play eight conference ESPN affiliate games, with two on the ACC Network during the Shriners Children's Clearwater Invitational.
- The following eight games will be broadcast on the SEC Network, with Mizzou hosting three (Apr. 4 LSU at 2:30 p.m.).

POSITIONAL RETURNERS

- Mizzou returns five starters from the 2025 season: junior catcher/outfielder **Stefania Abruscato**, junior outfielder **Claire Cahalan**, senior utility player **Kayley Lenger**, sophomore infielder/outfielder **Madison Uptegrove** and first basemen junior **Abby Hay**.
- Abruscato started the majority of the games in 2025, playing in 56 and starting 55, primarily as an outfielder. This season, she will take on the role of catcher, as she slashed .244, with an on-base percentage of .328, and led the team in doubles with 15.
- Cahalan recorded the highest

average amongst the primary starters with a .266 batting average, and led the team in both triples (3) and stolen bases (11).

- Lenger comes into the season as one of the best defensive players on the squad, having tallied only one error last season and recorded three assists from the outfield. She recorded a .989 fielding percentage and was even featured on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays for a diving catch she posted against Texas (4/5).

- In her second season with the Tigers, Uptegrove will be a player to watch, as she started in 47 games as a freshman and recorded a .361 on-base percentage. She was dynamic from the plate, recording 12 extra-base hits, including five home runs.

- Hay will hope to rebound and repeat her first year as she heads into her third campaign. She was named to the All-SEC second team and the NFCA Southeast All-Region Team in 2024, recording a .306 batting average with 16 runs, four doubles, a triple, five home runs, and 23 RBIs. Last season, she compiled 15 runs, seven doubles, three home runs and 15 RBIs.

FRESHMEN

- The Class of 2025 boasts a wealth of talent, with seven players joining as freshmen. Included in that class was the trio that was selected to the National Watchlists: Forrester, Carr and Waits. Joining them is catcher **Jaley James**, infielder **Avery Porter**, infielder **Avery Adcock** and outfielder **Linny Ramsey**.

- One addition to the Class is catcher/infielder **Gracie Britton**, who reclassified from the Class of 2026 to join the Tigers early.

- This Class brings together over 17 all-state honors, eight player of the year distinctions and multiple NFCA All-Region accolades.

NOTABLES FROM 2025

- The Tigers finished the 2025 season 25-31 overall and 6-18 in the SEC.

- MU hosted one of the toughest schedules in the country, ranking **ninth** in strength of schedule, and, despite a sub-.500 record, was 42nd in the RPI rankings.

- Last season, the Tigers played 32 ranked games and recording nine wins, including two against the No. 1 team in the country at the time (Oklahoma & Texas A&M).

A new era in Mizzou Softball began in the Summer of 2018, as Larissa Anderson was named the 10th head coach to lead the tradition-rich Tiger program on Saturday, May 26, 2018.

As Anderson enters year eight in Mid-Missouri that new era has already gotten off to a successful start, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why. Anderson has led Mizzou to a 242-146 record over her seven seasons and owns a career record of 372-220-1 as a head coach.

In her time at the helm of the Tigers, Anderson has steered Missouri to five NCAA Regional appearances and a pair of Super Regionals. She has led the Tigers to 35 or more wins in five of her seven years at Mizzou.

Missouri hosted a Regional and Super Regional in 2024 after home postseason runs in 2021 (Regional and Super Regional) and 2022 (Regional).

Anderson finished her first season in the Black & Gold with a 35-25 record, the most wins for the Tigers in a single season since 2016, when they won 42 games. Anderson's squad was also stellar in her first season as part of the always elite Southeastern Conference, as the Tigers' 12 wins during SEC play, which resulted in a tie for fourth place, were the most conference victories for Mizzou since 2016. The season ended with the Tigers' 13th straight regional appearance, as Anderson's Tigers earned a spot in the Los Angeles Regional, where they went 3-2, pushing host No. 2 UCLA to a winner-take-all game seven.

Her biggest test would come during the 2020 season. With Mizzou Softball's postseason ban being upheld three months prior to the season, Anderson's steady leadership guided the Tigers through what would be a turbulent year. Despite the postseason ban, Mizzou lost zero players to transfer, and entered the season with its roster intact.

Mizzou's postseason ban would prove to be only a minor blip in a season that was ultimately canceled after 26 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Tigers made the most of those 26 games, finishing with a 19-7 record, and being one of only two teams to be undefeated in SEC play. Mizzou ended the season ranked 25th in the NFCA Coaches' Poll – its first time finishing the season ranked since 2016 – while Cayla Kessinger was named to Softball America's All-America team.

Anderson returned Mizzou Softball to the national stage in 2021. With an experienced roster but a young pitching staff, she led the Tigers to a 42-17 record and a Super Regional appearance. Mizzou hosted an NCAA Regional and Super Regional for the first time since 2013. The 2021 team finished among the program's best statistically in fielding percentage (1st), home runs (1st), RBI (2nd), doubles (T-6th), and runs scored (3rd).

In the postseason, Mizzou pitching led the nation in ERA at 1.37 over six games. Two Tiger pitchers, Jordan Weber and Laurin Krings combined to allow only two hits and no runs over three games at the Columbia Regional. Freshman shortstop Jenna Laird earned SEC

Freshman of the Year honors while senior outfielder Brooke Wilmes was recognized as an NFCA Third Team All-American. Anderson led the Tigers to a No. 13 final ranking in the NFCA Coaches' Poll and a No. 14 ranking in the USA Softball poll, the program's highest final rankings since 2015.

Mizzou's memorable 2022 season saw them host an NCAA Regional for the second-consecutive year and made the Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship game for the second time in program history. The Tigers notched a 38-22 mark and went 12-11 during SEC play. Mizzou's pitching staff posted a 2.81 ERA including a 1.00 ERA in the postseason.

In the inaugural year of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, presented by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, Jenna Laird and Casidy Chaumont earned the award at shortstop and left field, respectively.

Laird, a 2022 Softball All-SEC Second Team player, finished the year with a .975 fielding percentage, while turning 10 double plays and did not make an error during SEC play.

Chaumont, an All-SEC Defensive Team Selection, has appeared on SportsCenter's Top Ten Plays four times over her career at Mizzou. After beginning her career as an infielder at Louisiana, she converted to the outfield at the start of the 2021 season and finished with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Chaumont has thrown out five runners on the basepaths from left field over her two seasons in the Black and Gold.

Kimberly Wert and Brooke Wilmes were each named First Team All-SEC performers in 2022. Jordan Weber, Jenna Laird, Wert and Wilmes were each tabbed to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Southeast All-Region team. Weber led the Tigers to the SEC Tournament final with a pair of shutouts against No. 17/20 Auburn and No. 13/10 Tennessee. She became the first Mizzou pitcher to record three wins in a single SEC series when she earned the victory in all three games against Kentucky.

Mizzou is coming off a 2023 season that saw the Tigers reach a 16th straight NCAA Regional, finishing the season with a 35-26 record and going 7-17 against SEC foes. The pitching staff proved efficient yet again, registering a cumulative ERA of 3.33, including a strikeout/walk ratio of 2.66.

Alex Honnold became the 26th All-American in program history (31 total All-American honors) after earning Second-Team honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

A Top 25 Finalist for 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, Honnold led Mizzou and ranked top six in the SEC for on-base percentage (.539), slugging percentage (.779), runs (52), batting average (.396), and triples (three). Her slugging percentage in 2023 ranked fourth all-time in program history. Honnold also earned NFCA Southeast All-Region honors and was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

Jenna Laird joined Honnold in representing the Tigers on the All-SEC Team, her sixth postseason honor at Mizzou and third-straight appearance on the All-SEC Team. The leadoff hitter paced the Tigers in SEC play with a .291 batting average to go with 14 runs, three doubles, five RBI, .371 on-base percentage, and a .329 slugging percentage.

In 2024, Anderson led the Tigers to a top-10 finish, an NCAA Super Regional appearance and the team's second Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship appearance in three seasons. The Tigers totaled 48 wins, their highest total in the program's SEC era and fourth-most in program history.

A trio of Tigers earned National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Region while 13 student-athletes secured Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete



honors for earning a 3.5 GPA and above.

Freshman Abby Hay was listed on the NFCA Southeast Second Team All-Region, while seniors Laurin Krings and Alex Honnold were tabbed to the Southeast Third Team All-Region.

Jenna Laird, Honnold and Hay were also named to the All-SEC Second Team while Krings (pitcher) and right fielder Kayley Lenger nabbed spots on the SEC All-Defensive Team.

In 2025, Anderson coached the 27th All-American in program history (32 total All-American honors) as Julia Crenshaw was named to the NFCA All-American Third Team. Crenshaw also earned NFCA First Team All-Region honors and was a part of the All-SEC First Team.

On the academic side, 17 Tigers were awarded Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete honors. For the second straight season, five players made it on the CSC Academic All-District Team.

Anderson joined Mizzou after a 17-year run at Hofstra, the final four as the head coach.

In four seasons at Hofstra, Anderson fashioned a 130-73-1 (.640) record with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, two Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles and four winning seasons. She picked up her 100th career win with the Pride's 7-2 win over Boston University, March 17, 2018, and posted seven career wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including three in 2018—a 1-0 victory over then-No. 13 Florida State on March 2 and a pair at No. 22 James Madison to claim the CAA Tournament crown.

The 2018 campaign was a historic one for Hofstra Softball, as Anderson led the 24th-ranked Pride to a 41-14 record, the CAA Tournament title and the NCAA Columbia Regional. Hofstra earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by defeating CAA regular-season champion and 22nd-ranked James Madison, 7-4, to claim its 12th CAA title in the sport since joining the league in 2002 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015.

Anderson's 2018 squad reached the 40-win mark for the 11th time in program history (and first since a school-record 46 wins in 2013), while setting school records for runs scored (334), home runs (70) and RBI (315). Hofstra owned an RPI of 19 against the nation's 29th-toughest schedule in 2018. Hofstra also garnered a league-high eight CAA postseason honors headlined by Sarah Cornell's selection as the CAA Pitcher of the Year—the Pride's 10th such honor all-time and first since 2013, all of which were tutored by Anderson.

In 2017, Hofstra returned to the CAA championship game, as the program registered its 28th-straight winning season (27-23) and earned the No. 2 seed in the CAA Tournament. Anderson picked up her first win over a Top 10 opponent as head coach with a 5-2 victory over No. 10 James Madison. Under Anderson's direction, Cornell was named first-team NFCA All-Northeast Region as a rookie, while also earning a spot on the All-CAA second team and All-Rookie team.

The Pride posted another winning record in her second season (24-22) and had six student-athletes earn CAA postseason honors and two garner NFCA All-Northeast Region recognition.

In her first season as the storied program's head coach in 2015, Anderson led Hofstra to the CAA championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, guiding Hofstra to a 38-14-1 record and a spot in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Anderson and her assistants were named the

NFCA Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year after Hofstra posted a collective 2.05 ERA, smashed 56 home runs and out-scored opponents, 277-129.

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head coach. In 17 seasons at Hofstra, she helped the Pride to a 610-267-2 (.695) record). Before taking over as head coach from Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, Anderson spent 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach, helping the program to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 CAA titles. As associate head coach, she helped Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Under Anderson's guidance, Hofstra hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09. Galati was twice named an All-America by the NFCA and was the program's first-ever first-team pick in 2012 after leading Division I with a 0.95 ERA and a 34-7 record. Anderson helped guide Galati to a NCAA-best 40 wins and 22 shutouts in 2013.

A hallmark of the Hofstra Softball program during Anderson's tenure was the Pride's stellar defense. From 2008-13, Hofstra consistently ranked among the nation's elite in fielding percentage as the Pride was among the Top 20 nationally in five of those seasons. Hofstra ranked first in Division I in fielding percentage during the 2011 season and was fourth in 2008 and 2010, and 16th in 2012 and 2013. Her 2018 team currently ranks sixth nationally with an .979 mark.

An active NFCA member, she chaired its Ethics Committee from 2009-13, and previously served as the fourth Vice President on the NFCA executive board and as a member of the NFCA Recruiting Committee and the NFCA Hall of Fame Committee. Anderson is currently the Vice President of the Awards Committee. She was elected NFCA President on Oct. 25, 2022, and was one of eight members who were voted to the NFCA's Board of Directors for 2023. Anderson officially began her three-year term on January 1, 2023.

Prior to joining the Hofstra staff, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school-record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and was in charge of coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th-best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a C.W. Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson spent one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

She is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages the St. Louis Cardinals' Class AA affiliate in Springfield, Missouri. Prior to his elevation in 2025, Patrick Anderson spent three seasons as the head coach in Peoria, Illinois, with the Cardinals' Class A affiliate.

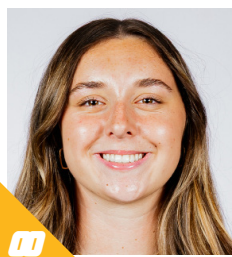

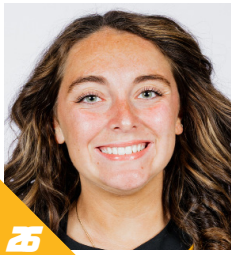
