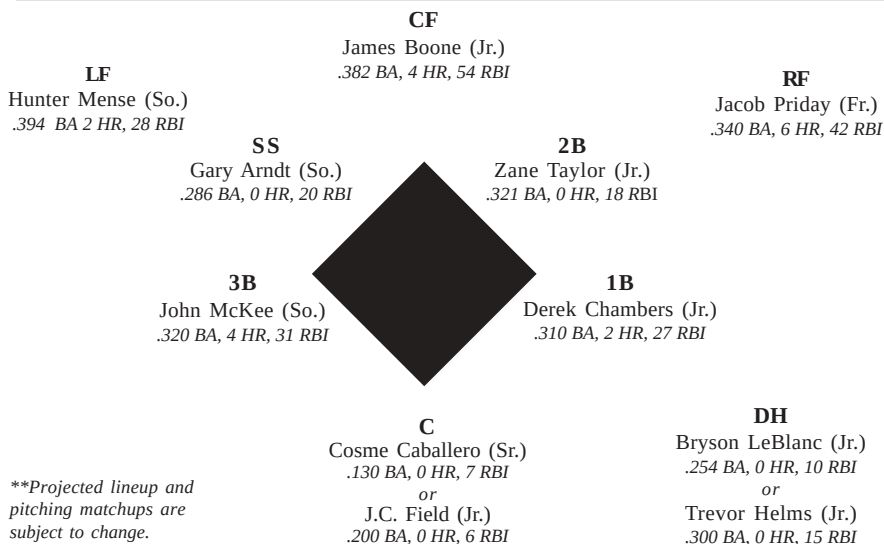

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BIG START TO THE BIG 12

Mizzou's 8-1 start to the Big 12 Conference season is its best conference start since the 1981 team opened Big Eight play 8-1.

In 1980, MU opened the Big Eight portion of the schedule with a 9-1 record. That season, the Tigers won the conference title.

MU won its first five Big 12 games this year, which is the best start to its conference season since the Big 12 was started in 1997.

AT THE POLLS

The Tigers continue to climb in the national polls, coming in as high as No. 13 this week.

Both the Baseball America poll and the Collegiate Baseball poll have Missouri ranked 13th. The National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association has MU ranked at No. 16 and the USA TODAY/ESPN Coaches' Poll ranks the Tigers No. 21.

APRIL FOOLS

Mizzou's 25-0 win over Texas Tech on April 1 may have seemed like an April Fools joke, but it was all too real for the Red Raiders.

Seventeen of the 25 runs for MU were scored in the second inning on just six hits. The Red Raiders walked eight and hit four batters, had three balks and committed an error in the inning. The first Tiger to the plate grounded out to second. Following that, the next 17 batters all reached safely and all would score in the inning. Ten straight MU batters were either walked or hit by a pitch and a total of 22 men went to the plate for Mizzou in the second inning. The four hit batters, eight walks and 17 runs scored set new Big 12 Conference records for the most in a single inning.

NO-NO

Not only did the Tigers put 25 runs on the board against Texas Tech on April 1, but sophomores Max Scherzer and Michael Cole combined to throw the first no-hitter at Mizzou since 1981.

Scherzer struck out a career-high 14 in seven innings pitched to record his sixth win in as many starts. He struck out the side in order in three of the seven innings. Cole pitched the final two innings, striking out four more Red Raiders. Of the 27 outs that the Tigers recorded, 18 were by strikeouts.

Scherzer was named the Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Week and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association National Pitcher of the Week. Collegiate Baseball Newspaper also named Scherzer and Cole among the National Players of the Week for their accomplishment.

The no-hitter was the ninth in school history and the first since Jim Maddock no-hit Nebraska in May of 1981. The last combined no-hitter at MU also came in 1981, when Dave Spreckels and Bob Baker no-hit Iowa.

STREAKING

Missouri's loss to Texas Tech on April 3 was its first defeat since Eastern Michigan knocked off the Tigers 7-6 on March 5. The 15-game winning streak from March 6-March 30 was the longest for Mizzou since it won 16 straight in 1985. The longest winning streak in school history was 18 games set by the 1964 team.

Mizzou has won 18 of their last 20 games heading into the matchup with SEMO, who is one of the team the Tigers have lost to during the 20-game stretch.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

Missouri has outscored its opponents 333-98 this season and has recorded double-digits in runs in 17 of its 32 games. That includes a stretch of nine straight games with at least 10 runs from March 6-March 20. The Tigers are averaging over 10 runs a game, while holding its opponents to just over three runs per outing.

Mizzou has scored 25 runs twice this season, recording a 25-2 win over Navy on Feb. 25 and a 25-0 win over Texas Tech on April 1.

Earlier this year, MU outscored North Dakota State 55-4 in a four-game series and the previous week, it swept a three-games series from Youngstown State by a combined score of 42-2.

If MU was to maintain its current scoring pace, it would finish the regular season with 582 runs. The school record for runs in a season is 573, set in 1998.

ZEROS ACROSS THE BOARD

Hidden behind the high scoring offense the Tigers have had this season, is some impressive pitching outings for Mizzou. MU has a 2.30 ERA heading into this the week, which is leads the Big 12 Conference.

All three of Mizzou's probable starters for the weekend are in the top 10 in the Big 12 Conference in ERA, led by sophomore Max Scherzer, with a Big 12 best 1.03 ERA.

Junior Doug Mathis has a 2.11 ERA, which is fourth best in the league and sophomore Nathan Culp is ninth in the Big 12 with a 2.38 ERA.

The Tigers have already recorded six shutouts this season. They had five all of last year. Among the six shutouts was the first no-hitter at MU since 1981, when Scherzer and sophomore Michael Cole combined to no-hit Texas Tech on April 1.

MU had stretch of 26 innings of shutout ball from March 14 (vs. Youngstown State) to March 19 (vs. North Dakota State). Earlier this season the Tigers put together 23-innings of not allowing a run.

STAT TRACKS

In the Big 12 Conference statistics, Mizzou ranks first in ERA, as MU pitchers have a combined 2.30 ERA.

The Tigers have the league leader in ERA (sophomore Max Scherzer with a 1.03 ERA) and two of the top four top hitters in the league (sophomore Hunter Mense with a .394 and junior James Boone with a .382 batting average).

Joining Scherzer are junior Doug Mathis, whose 2.11 ERA is fourth best, and sophomore Nathan Culp, who has a 2.38 ERA, which ranks ninth in the Big 12.

Scherzer also leads the conference in strikeouts with 77 and opponents' batting average as opponents are hitting just .132 off of him.

The Tigers lead the Big 12 with 333 runs scored on the year and have three players in the top 10 in the conference standings in runs scored led by Mense, who is second with 43. McKee is tied for fourth with junior Derek Chambers with 41 runs scored.

Boone is second in the Big 12 with 54 RBI and freshman Jacob Priday is third with 42 runs batted in.

BEHIND THE STREAK

During Mizzou's 15-game winning streak from March 6-March 30, the Tigers outscored its opponents 157-25. They had a .316 batting average, while holding their opponents to a .176 mark. MU had a slugging percentage of .442 and an on-base percentage of .481, compared to its opponents' .226 slugging percentage and .264 on-base percentage.

Missouri's ERA over the 15 games was just 1.65, while the opponents' ERA was 10.73. Opposing pitchers walked 143 batters, hit 43 and had 24 wild pitches. MU walked 42, hit 14 and had just two wild pitches during the streak.

HITS KEEP ON COMING

The longest hitting streak of the season for the Tigers was junior James Boone's 12-game streak last month. Junior Derek Chambers had a 10-game hitting streak earlier in the year.

Entering the game with SEMO, sophomore Gary Arndt has a four-game streak in tact. Five Tigers have two-game streaks on the line.

BOONE DOCKS

Junior James Boone leads the team with 54 RBI on the year and is on pace to break the Mizzou school record for RBI in a season. At his current rate, he would finish the season with 102 RBI, breaking the record set by Aaron Jaworowski in 1996 of 101.

Boone had six RBI in Mizzou's win over Texas Tech last Friday and has twice had five RBI in a game this year.

He was named the Big 12 Conference Player of the Week on March 15 after hitting an astonishing .786 (11-for-14) in Mizzou's four games the previous week.

It was the second Big 12 Player of the Week honor for Boone in his career, as he earned the award almost a year ago to the day, March 16, 2004.

Included in his 11 hits during that week were a home run, a triple and a double. He drove in 13 runs in the four games.

JAMIESON JOINS MU COACHING LEGENDS

Tim Jamieson is in his 11th season as the head coach of the Tigers, having compiled a record of 350-245-2 while at MU.

Last season he became just the third coach in Mizzou history to reach 300 wins, joining John "Hi" Simmons and Gene McArtor, who both have their numbers retired and are members of the MU Athletics Hall of Fame.

Jamieson has the third longest tenure of any coach currently at Missouri. Track and field coach Rick McGuire is in his 22nd year at MU and swimming and diving coach Brian Hoffer has been at Mizzou for 13 seasons.

FOR OPENERS

With its 7-1 win over Eastern Michigan on March 4, Mizzou improved to 8-3 under Head Coach Tim Jamieson in home openers. Last season, MU fell to Youngstown State, 3-2 in the first home game of the season. Prior to that, it had won three straight home openers.

The 8-3 win over Portland on Feb. 10, extended MU's winning streak in season openers to three. MU Head Coach Tim Jamieson is 6-3-1 at Missouri in season openers.

RECORD SETTING DAY AGAINST NAVY

The Tigers opened up the Service Academy Classic with a blowout victory over Navy, 25-2. The 25 runs were the most scored by Missouri since a 30-0 win against Truman State in 2003.

MU also set a new record in the 17 years of the Service Academy Spring Classic with its run total, easily passing the old record of 15 set by Ole' Miss in 1998.

Mizzou set a new school record with 26 hits vs. Navy. Eleven Tigers had a hit in the game and nine had at least two hits.

Freshman Jacob Priday became the first MU player since 2002 to have five hits in the game, going 5-for-6 with a home run, four RBI and four runs scored. The hits were the first of Priday's career, as he entered the game 0-for-5 on the season.

MILLINGTON: MU'S TITLETOWN

For the second time in two seasons, the Mizzou baseball team traveled to Millington, Tenn. and took home a tournament title.

Mizzou was 2-1 at the Service Academy Spring Classic at USA Stadium in Millington last month and claimed championship honors.

After defeating Navy 25-2 and Indiana State 10-1, MU fell to Memphis by a score of 7-6. Despite the loss to Memphis, Missouri held the tiebreakers and was named the champion.

Last season, the Tigers were 4-0 and took home the championship of the Easton USA Challenge, also held at USA Stadium.

The Tigers had wins over Wake Forest, Indiana State, Tennessee-Martin and Memphis to claim the 2004 Easton USA Challenge title.

THE VALLEY OF THE SUN...YEAH RIGHT!

For the second time in three seasons, Mizzou had weather issues cause havoc with its season-opening tournament in Phoenix, Ariz.

The Tigers were only able to get in one of their scheduled four games of last week's tournament due to persistent rain showers in the Phoenix area.

MU defeated Portland 8-3 on Thursday in the season opener. Senior Erik Dessau pitched six shutout innings, allowing just three hits and striking out four to get the victory.

Missouri's games on Friday, Saturday and Sunday were all cancelled due to rain showers.

In 2003, MU was only able to play two games in Phoenix instead of the scheduled four games of the tournament.

TIGERS PICKED 8TH IN BIG 12 PRESEASON POLL

Missouri was picked to finish eighth in the Big 12 Conference in the preseason coaches' poll. After being picked to finished ninth last season, the Tigers were seventh after the regular season, then advanced to the championship game of the Big 12 Conference Tournament.

In 2003, MU was again picked to finish ninth in the preseason poll, but placed fourth in the Big 12.

Texas was picked to win the Big 12 Conference this season, with Texas A&M picked second followed by Oklahoma State third.
