The Mizzou soccer team (6-7-1, 2-3-1 SEC) returns to the comfy confines of Walton Stadium with a pair of home matches this weekend. Missouri hosts No. 7 South Carolina (12-1-1, 5-1 SEC) on Friday, Oct. 18 at 6:30 p.m., before a 1 p.m. contest against Auburn (4-8-2, 0-5-1) on Sunday, Oct. 20.

The first 100 fans to Friday's game against South Carolina will get free black poms to mark the Tigers' annual Black Out game. Fans who bring three cans of food will receive free admission as part of a food drive for Tiger Pantry.

Sunday is Mizzou's Social Media Day, where fans who show they follow Mizzou soccer on Twitter, Instagram or Facebook will receive free admission.

UP NEXT

The Tigers travel to Lexington, Ky., to face Kentucky on Friday, Oct. 25 at 6:30 p.m. CT. Mizzou then returns home on Sunday, Oct. 27 to host Tennessee at 1 p.m. on Senior Day.

LAST TIME OUT

The Mizzou soccer team recorded 19 shots but could not find the back of the net as Missouri dropped a 1-0 game to LSU Friday evening in Baton Rouge, La. Mizzou fell to 6-7-1 overall and 2-3-1 in Southeastern Conference action, while LSU improved to 9-3-2 and 5-0-1.

Redshirt junior goalkeeper McKenzie Sauerwein made six saves in net for Mizzou.

Missouri controlled play in the first half but could not manage to tally a goal.

LSU's offensive picked up its pressure to start the second half and peppered Sauerwein with shots. The keeper made two point-blank saves before LSU finally broke through four minutes into the second frame. Summer Clarke played the ball to the front of the box. Heather Magee ran onto the pass and rocketed a shot that beat Sauerwein and went into the left corner of the goal for a 1-0 LSU advantage.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina comes into Friday's matchup with an impressive 12-1-1 record and a 5-1 mark in SEC action. The Gamecocks are in the midst of a five-game winning streak, with wins over Auburn, Arkansas, Florida, Tennessee and Alabama. South Carolina's only loss of the year came at the hands of Georgia.

Danielle Au and Raina Johnson both lead the Gamecocks with 11 points on five goals and an assist. Chelsea Drennan has a team high seven assists on the year.

Goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo has played every minute in goal for South Carolina and boasts a 0.42 goals against average and a .857 save percentage.

SERIES WITH SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina and Mizzou have met just once on the soccer pitch. The Tigers took a 1-0 win over the Gamecocks on Sept. 23, 2012 in Columbia, S.C.

SCOUTING AUBURN

The Auburn Tigers enter this weekend with a 4-8-2 overall mark and a 0-5-1 record in SEC play. They are coming off a 0-0 2OT tie at home to Georgia on Oct. 11.

Casie Ramsier paces the Tigers with five goals and three assists for 13 points. Tori Ball has added four goals and four assists for 12 points.

Goalies Alyse Scott and Alicen Wright have split time in goal for Auburn, with Wright starting recently. Wright has a 2.07 goals against average and a .714 save percentage.

SERIES WITH AUBURN

Mizzou holds a perfect 3-0 mark against Auburn. Missouri defeated Auburn 2-0 in Auburn, Ala., in the squad's inaugural SEC match. Mizzou holds a 1-0 advantage in games played in Columbia (1-0 win on Aug. 29, 2008).

SAUERWEIN STAKES CLAIM AS ALL-TIME MU'S MOST EXPERIENCED GOALIE

In less than three full seasons as Mizzou's goalkeeper, redshirt junior McKenzie Sauerwein has already become Missouri's all-time leader in minutes in goal and games played in goal.

The North Richland Hills, Texas, native has played 5021:12 minutes in goal in her Mizzou career, which put her past former Tiger great Tasha Dittamore (4945:05) for first all-time at Mizzou. Sauerwein set the career minutes mark at LSU on Oct. 11.

Assuming Sauerwein starts in net against South Carolina on Friday, she will also break Missouri's all-time games played in goal record with 58. Sauerwein enters the game currently tied with Jackie Adamec (1997-99) and Dittamore with 57 games played in goal.

RICHARDSON AMONG ALL-TIME MIZZOU LEADERS IN GAMES STARTED

Senior Dominique Richardson enters Friday's matchup with 76 starts in all 76 career games with the Tigers. Her 76 starts ranks tied for seventh (with Erica Pusch, 2002-05, and Mo Redmond, 2005-08) at Missouri. Assuming she starts against South Carolina, Richradson will move into a tie with suzy Probst (1999-2002) and Nikki Thole (1997-2001) for fifth all-time at Mizzou. If Richardson starts both games this weekend, she will rank tied for fourth with Alysha Bonnick (2007-10).



BRYAN BLITZ

Entering his 18th season as head soccer coach at Mizzou, Bryan Blitz holds a record of 194-156-19 since 1996 when he was hired as the program's first head coach.

Under his tutelage, the Tigers have won two Big 12 Championships and earned five NCAA Tournament appearances.

In the program's first season in the South-eastern Conference, Blitz led the Tigers to a 14-7-1 season and their fifth NCAA Tournament berth. The squad's 14 wins tie for the second-most in a single-season. Mizzou also recorded an 8-5 SEC mark and advanced to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach, Ala.

In 2009, his Mizzou squad earned its first ever Big 12 regular season title as the Tigers clinched the title with a 5-0 shutout over Nebraska on Oct. 25. With his players excelling on the field it seemed only natural that Blitz was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the second time in three seasons.

In 2008 the Tigers had one of their most successful seasons in program history. Blitz directed his team to a 16-5-2 mark, the Big 12 Conference Tournament Championship and into the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season. Over the course of the year, Mizzou set school records with wins (16), fewest losses (five), shutouts (12), fewest goals allowed (19) and goals against average (0.80), among others.

TIGERS RECORD PROGRAM'S THIRD-BEST CROWD AGAINST TEXAS A&M

Mizzou's fans showed up in droves for the Tigers' matchup with Texas A&M on Sunday, Oct. 6. The attendance of 1,734 ranked as Missouri's third-best crowd ever and biggest attendance number since 2005.

MIZZOU DEFENSE HOLDING STRONG

In 14 games this season, the Tiger defense has allowed just 16 goals for an average of 1.11 per game. McKenzie Sauerwein's GAA stands at 1.13 in 2013, just over her stellar mark of 1.07 in 2012.

If the Tiger defense continues at this pace for the rest of the year, the team's 1.11 GAA will rank third all-time at Mizzou. Only the 2008 (0.8) and 2012 (1.07) teams have posted better goals against averages in the other 16 years in program history.

CLARK GETS AGGRESSIVE

One of Mizzou's most skilled players, junior Kaysie Clark spent the majority of her first two years with the program as the offense's point guard. The Liberty, Mo., native often would pass up open shots to dish off to her teammates.

In her junior campaign, Clark is finally taking those shots when they arise. She currently leads the team with 14 points and six goals, to go along with two assists. Most recently, she scored in the third minute against Vanderbilt.

Her six goals so far this season are already a career best for her, bettering the four tallies she set last season as a sophomore in 19 games.

SAUERWEIN CREEPING UP THE CHARTS

In less than three seasons, redshirt junior goalkeeper McKenzie Sauerwein already has her name scattered throughout the Mizzou record book.

The North Richland Hills, Texas, native holds Mizzou records for minutes played in goal (5021:12) and is tied for first in games played in goal (57). She also ranks second in shutouts (15), tied for second in wins (32), third in saves (273), goals against average (1.17) and games started in goal (51).

NOTTINGHAM BACK TO HER OLD SELF

After missing seven matches due to injury, senior forward Danielle Nottingham has returned to the lineup and picked right up where she left off. She played Mizzou's first two games in 2013 and notched a goal and three assists against Pacific and Memphis. She injured her knee in the second half against Memphis on Aug. 25 and missed Missouri's next seven games.

Since her return, Nottingham has posted assists on goals against Florida and Vanderbilt to up her total to a team-leading five in just six games this year. Her assists per game mark of 0.71 is tied for first among all SEC players.

TIGERS UPSET NO. 7 FLORIDA

Mizzou's 1-0 win over No. 7 Florida marked the Tigers' first win over a ranked opponent in 2013, and the first victory over a top-10 foe since 2011.

The last time Missouri defeated a top-10 team was a 1-0 win over No. 7 Ohio State on Aug. 26, 2011, in Columbia. Current senior Dominique Richardson tallied the game-winner in that contest.

The win over Florida also marked the first ever victory for the Tigers over the Gators. Florida entered the game with a 4-0-1 record against Missouri. Two of those Gator wins came in 2012, when Florida posted a 2-1 home win over the Tigers on Oct. 12 and a 3-0 win in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach, Ala.

DONALDSON STRIKES EARLY

Freshman Melanie Donaldson has notched three goals during her inaugural campaign with the Tigers, which is tied for second on the team. However, all three of Donaldson's tallies share a theme: all were scored in the second minute of play.

Donaldson posted her first collegiate goal against UMKC, when the midfielder headed in a

corner just 1:39 into the match. On Sept. 13, she put Missouri up 1-0 1:49 into the game against Eastern Illinois after she collected a rebound in the box. At Portland on Sept. 15, she struck just 1:13 into the match on a similar play to the Eastern Illinois goal.

MIZZOU IN CONFERENCE OPENERS

With Mizzou's 3-1 win over Mississippi State on Sept. 20, the Tigers now own a 12-6 all-time mark in conference openers. The victory also improved the team's mark to 6-1 since the 2007 season.

Missouri is now 2-0 all-time in SEC openers, thanks to a 2-0 win over Auburn last season. The Tigers were 10-6 in conference openers while a member of the Big 12 Conference.

GRANT PICKING UP THE OFFENSE

Junior Taylor Grant entered her junior season with 10 career points, eight as a freshman in 2011 and two last year as a sophomore. She hit a bit of a sophomore slump in 2012, as she could not manage to find the back of the net after a four-goal freshman campaign.

In her junior season, however, Grant has been one of Mizzou's most consistent offensive weapon. She already has a new career high in points and has tied her single-season best in goal. She currently is tied for the team lead in points (10) and goals (four). She also has two assists.

RUSSELL FINDS THE BACK OF THE NET

Sophomore Reagan Russell was a big reason the Tigers posted a 5-1 win over Pacific on Aug. 23 - the Sugar Land, Texas, native tallied two goals in the game. Most importantly for Mizzou, Russell notched two goals in one game after going scoreless all of last season.

She added another goal in Mizzou's loss to San Diego on Sept. 8 to give her three on the season.

THE FRESHMAN JOIN THE PARTY

Three freshman notched their first collegiate points in Mizzou's games against SEMO and UMKC.

Midfielder Lauren Selaiden got things started with a pair of goals in Missouri's 4-0 win over SEMO on Aug. 30. The freshman tallied the team's second and fourth goals of the match.

Defender Erin Webb assisted on Missouri's third goal of the match for her first career point. She also notched a goal on Missouri's third and final goal against UMKC on Sept. 1.

Midfielder Melanie Donaldson notched Missouri's game-winning goal over UMKC in the second minute for her first career goal. She added the first assist of her career on Mizzou's final goal of the match.

HIGNETT BRINGS INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE TO TIGERS

The Mizzou soccer team gains international experience to its roster with the addition of freshman Rachel Hignett, a midfielder from Wales.

Hignett arrived in Columbia on Aug. 26, as she was representing Wales in the UEFA U-19 Championship. She started all three of Wales' games in the midfield.

The newcomer is also a member of the Welsh Senior National Team after making her debut in January of 2013 against Greece.

NOTTINGHAM FINDS HER OFFENSE

Senior Danielle Nottingham is back in her comfort zone as the Frisco, Texas, native returns to her natural forward position in 2013. She played forward her first two years at Mizzou, scoring eight goals and seven assists over the two years. Last season she moved to left back to help the Tigers in a position of need. She accumulated seven points on one goal and five assists in 2012.

Nottingham's 36 career points rank third among current players, just behind Alyssa Diggs (41) and Dominique Richardson (37).

DIGGS NAMED A CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Senior forward Alyssa Diggs was selected as a candidate for the 2013 Senior CLASS Award for women's soccer, announced on Wednesday, Aug. 21. The award, which honors both on and off field excellence, is eligible to senior Division I student-athletes who have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. Diggs is one of 30 women's soccer candidates and the only female student-athlete from the Southeastern Confer-

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2013 NCAA Women's College Cup® championship in December.

MISSOURI PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH IN THE SEC EASTERN DIVISION

The Tigers were selected to finish fourth in the Eastern Division in the SEC Preseason Coaches' Poll, announced on July 23.

Florida was selected tops in the Eastern Division by garnering 89 total points (11 first-place votes). Kentucky and Tennessee (three first place votes) tied for second in the East with 71 points each. Following Mizzou were South Carolina (42 points), Georgia (30) and Vanderbilt (26).

Texas A&M was picked first in the Western Division with 91 total points (13 first-place votes), ahead of LSU's 67 points (one first-place vote). Auburn placed third with 62 points, followed by Alabama (59), Ole Miss (52), Arkansas (33) and Mississippi State (21).

DIGGS, RICHARDSON NAMED AMONG TOPDRAWERSOCCER.COM'S TOP 100 UPPERCLASSMEN

Mizzou soccer seniors Alyssa Diggs and Dominique Richardson were both named among Top Drawer Soccer's Women's National Top 100 Upperclassmen recently. Diggs clocked in at No. 62 and Richardson was No. 82.

Diggs and Richardson enter their senior seasons on the heels of All-Southeastern Conference first team honors in 2012. Additionally, Richardson earned a spot on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-South Region second team, while Diggs was named to the third team.

As a junior in 2012, Coppell, Texas, native Diggs paced the Tigers with 17 points on eight goals and an assist despite missing five games due to injury. She earned weekly honors from the SEC, CollegeSoccer360 and College Sports Madness during the year and was named to the Capital One Academic All-District 6 first team following the season. Also an All-Big 12 Conference first team selection in 2011, Diggs stands as only the third Tiger to earn two all-conference honors in her career. She enters her senior season with 36 points on 14 goals and eight assists.

Richardson, who hails from Fullerton, Calif., notched four goals and an assist in 2012 as a junior. Three of her four goals were game-winners, including tallies in the final minutes against South Carolina and Alabama. Richardson was an All-Big 12 second team selection in 2011 and a member of the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team in 2010. Over her career, Richardson has started all of Mizzou's 62 games and has 30 points on 13 goals and four assists.

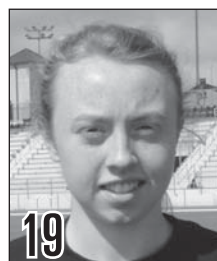
