New Functionality in ARIN Online

Fee Harmonization

- Harmonization of fees to achieve equitable cost recovery
 - Eliminates fee differentiation between ISP & end user organizations
 - Transfer fees increased to \$500
 - Transaction fees added for OrgCreate (\$50) and OrgRecovery (\$100)
- Community consultation completed May 2021
- Necessary to continue to develop and provide the high-quality services, including routing security services (i.e., RPKI and authenticated IRR) & simplifies the process of working with ARIN via a single uniform fee schedule

Premier Support Plan

- Premier Support Plan (PSP) for largest customers (2X-Large and greater categories)
 - Introduced in May 2021
 - Includes a dedicated account analyst, priority service, direct technical services liaison, 24/7 on-call support, PSP customer focus group, and transfer fee waivers



Template IRR Decommissioning

- ARIN's previous non-authenticated, email-based IRR service will be decommissioned
- Shutdown of IRR-NONAUTH database 31 March 2022
 - Community consultation completed March 2021
 - Initial notices sent to POCs of Orgs with objects
 - Ongoing support of impacted organizations

What's new with IRR & RPKI?

- New IRR and RPKI features available
 - RESTful API Create, modify, delete IRR objects and RPKI ROAs
 - Routing Policy Specification Language (RPSL) display in the IRR graphical user interface (GUI)
- Developed and deployed new training and customer feedback channels
- Customer requested feature development customer engagement ongoing

New Functionality in ARIN Online

- Changed password practices to align with recommendations in NIST SP800-63
 - check proposed passwords against a list that contains values known to be compromised
 - enforce a password length between 12 to 64 characters
 - prevent use of a username or the word "arin" in the password.
- Changed login authentication process following the guidelines in NIST 800-63B Section 5.2.2.
 - rate-limiting mechanism that limits the number of failed authentication attempts that can be made against any single account over time
 - introduces CAPTCHA and incrementing timeout periods before allowing further attempts
