

## Language Barriers

- Provide interpretation services or language support at healthcare facilities.
- Develop multilingual informational materials and educational campaigns.
- Train healthcare providers on cultural sensitivity and effective communication strategies, or have MHWs/MHVs in hospitals




### Lack of Awareness

- Conduct targeted awareness campaigns to educate migrant workers about HIV and testing by MHVs
- Collaborate with community-based organizations and migrant networks for information dissemination.
- Utilize culturally appropriate and easily understandable educational materials.



# Stigma and Discrimination

- Implement training programs to address and reduce stigma among healthcare providers.
- Promote inclusive healthcare environments with confidentiality and non-judgmental attitudes.
- Engage in community outreach programs to challenge negative perceptions.



### Financial Constraints

- Establish subsidized or free HIV testing programs specifically for migrant workers.
- Advocate for healthcare policies that ensure affordable access to testing services.
- Collaborate with employers and NGOs to provide financial support or health insurance coverage.





# Legal and Administrative Barriers

#### **Suggested solutions**

Advocate for policies that protect the rights and healthcare access of all migrant workers.

Establish mobile clinics or outreach programs to reach remote migrant communities

Provide legal support to address immigration and documentation challenges

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# Limited Access to Healthcare Facilities

- Improve the availability of healthcare facilities in areas with high migrant worker populations
- Establish partnerships between healthcare providers and migrant organizations
- Support the establishment of migrant health clinics or dedicated units
