

ALABAMA COUNTRIES / SETTLEMENT SITES

Cherokee County: Harry Springs Stockade / marker

The stockade is gone, owners used lumber for buildings. Easy to locate in NE corner of county near Georgia line on Mills Creek off hwy 99 at hwy 95.

Turkey Town / council site

This area was located on the west side of the Coosa River at Terrapin Creek, between present Leesburg and Centre. A marker is located in front of the middle school, near hwy 20. Chief Pathkiller's grave is said to be in the Garrett Cemetary near by.

DEKALB COUNTY

Millstown/Mission/Fort/Stockade/markers in park, not at sites.

The area of 'Millstown' probably followed Big Mill's Creek from Valley Head south to near Lebanon near Portersville.

There are no remnants of any buildings that I know of except for the chimney to the stockade. This is located in an overgrown lot between the RR trackson Godfrey and the Goodyear store on Gault behind 3rd street. A woman in Scotland owns it...no marker and hardly visible.

A marker of stone shows where the mission was. The fort was located just behind the stockade.

There is an old home at the end of Godfrey which is reported to be the birthplace of John Ross. It is now privately owned. The city of Lebanon is mentioned so often that we went through it. It is easy to find off hwy 11, there is a marker there about a court house, nothing else.

ETOWAH COUNTY

Can probably claim portions of Turkey Town

JACKSON COUNTY

Crow Town . From all the information I can gather, this town was on the west side of the Tennessee River, on the south side of Crow Creek above Mud Creek. (North of present Hollywood and south of present Stevenson) Not an easy area to get to, but hwy 72 goes across these creeks and hwy 116 goes back by the Tennessee River to launching areas.

MARSHALL COUNTY

Creek path Settlement: This would include Brown's village, Gunter's village, Cornsilk and Massa village as well.

Can be found near hwy 431 and 79 at Gunter'sville Lake.

"1 mile west of the community of Crossroads, 1/4 mile east of Brown's creek, 2 miles east of Warrenton, 4 miles from Tennessee river, 4 miles se of Gunter'sville."

Nothing remains. There is a marker on hwy 79 south of 431 telling of the mission, which area is now an island in the river. It was on Jackson's Trail or the old GEorgia State road of 1816, crossing through Sand Mountain by way of Albertville, Collinsville and Centre. (Could this be present hwy 68?)

Gunter'slanding is said to be underwater at the present time
