Leat Mi. Taylor:

Thank you for your injuly in behalf of Mrs. John H. Bayless, who is interested in the reconstruction of Fort Butler in Cherokee County, North Carolina.

Members of the staff of the Division of History have, as you requested, reviewed the report of the archaeological examinations that were made at the site of Fort Butler by Mr. George G. Denny, Archaeologist, with the North Carolina Department of Archives and History. Mr. Denny has made a very thorough review of the entire background of Fort Butler, documentary, as well as archaeological.

When the staff reviewed the history of Fort Butler in 1905, its recommendation was that the fort did not merit recognition as a nationally significant site on the basis of information then known. The historical resume provided by Mr. Denny does not add material which would lead us to change this evaluation. Mr. Denny's research does strengthen the belief that it would be extremely difficult to locate documents that would support a reconstruction of Fort Butler. He concludes that no accurate rescriptions of the fort proper have been found in the research conducted to 'ate.

The archaeological explorations that Mr. Denny conducted provide aluable new factor for our consideration. The results of these was also discouraging. Mr. Denny concludes that "if the divelopment of the site of Fort Butler includes the erection of representative structures, it will be based on the scarcest of evidence."
