Head Quaters Fastern Pivision Cherokee Agency, July 25, 1838

## Gentlemen

I have received your letter submitting certain proposals, dated the 23rd instant

On the part of the U. States, I am ready to place the whole business of completing the emigration of the Cherokee people remaining east of the Missisppi (with the exception to be mentioned) to their homes west of that river, in the hands of such functionaries of the eastern Gherokee's as may exhibit to me, from the same, due authority to undertake & to carry through emigration — on the following conditions —

1 That the said functionaries and their poeple shall continue to observe excutate in good faith, the promised given to me in writing by certain Chiefs & head men for themselves & people, present & absent, on the 19th ultimo.

  2. That the said functionaries shall send intelligent runners,
  to be furnished with written permifsion signed by the commanding General
  in search of, & cause to be brought into the emigration, all Indian families & individuals who may remain out, & who are not citizens of the KXS
  U States, or who have not received permifsion to remain in the States for
  the purpose of becoming denizens of the Same.
- 3. That with the exception of such Indmans as are in order to become citizens or denizens of the U States, or of the states; also with the exception of such Indian's families & individuals as may be permitted by the commanding General to imigrate themselves, the said Cherokee functionaries shall cause all their people remaining ease, & who may at the time be able to travel, including fugitive Creeks among them, to be put in motion; in convenient detachments, either by land or water, & transported mithout

unnecefsary delays on the routes to the Cherokee country west of the Wifsifsippi - beginnibg the movement as early as the first of September nesct
continue to send off parties at intervals, not exceeding three days, so
that all the emigrants able to travel within that time, shall be in motion
for the west by the of the ensuing month (October).

Such Indians as within that time may not be able to travel by land shall, if the rivers be not up, be permitted to remain until the nesct rise of waters, & in the meantime have, as attendants, a small number if their families or friends.

The foregoing conditions being agreed to the United Sates, thro'me are willing to Stipulate to pay over to the Cherokee functionaries, from time to time, such portions of the moneys appropriated for the emigration it as may see, reasonable to prepare for ° to carry out.
