II... Lieut. Col. Wynn, Commanding the Regiment of North Carolina Volunteers will take post at Fort Montgomery, Cherokee Valley, and is charged with the Superintendance and general direction of the Troops at Camp Scott, on Mantakala, and Fort Lindsay, as well as the immediate command of that at Fort Montgomery.

III The Collection of the Cherokee Indians, preparatory to their Emigration, will, in pursuance of Orders No. 34, from the Major General Commanding the Army, commence in North Carolina on Monday, the 4th June. The leading men of each neighbourhood shall be the first apprehended, and through the whole operation the Commanding Officers of posts and Detachments are expected to temper their zeal with all the forbearance and humanity which is so earnestly enjoined both by the "Letter and Spirit" of the Orders, No. 25, of the Major General.
