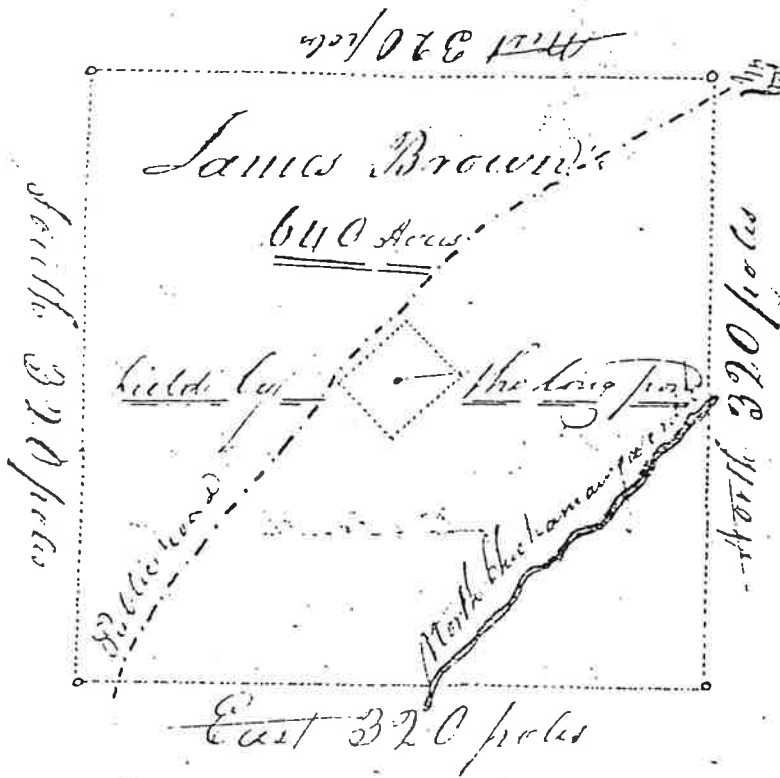

(The undersigned Commissioner and Surveyor (duly authorized) have agreeably to the terms of the late Cherokee Treaty, concluded at the city of Washington, on the twenty seventh day of February one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, surveyed and laid off to James Brown six hundred and forty acres of land, in the Tennessee valley. Beginning at a post oak sapling and pine tree, on the North side of the public road leading from Washington to John Brown's ferry on Tennessee River; thence west three hundred and twenty poles to a stake near a marked pine tree, on
